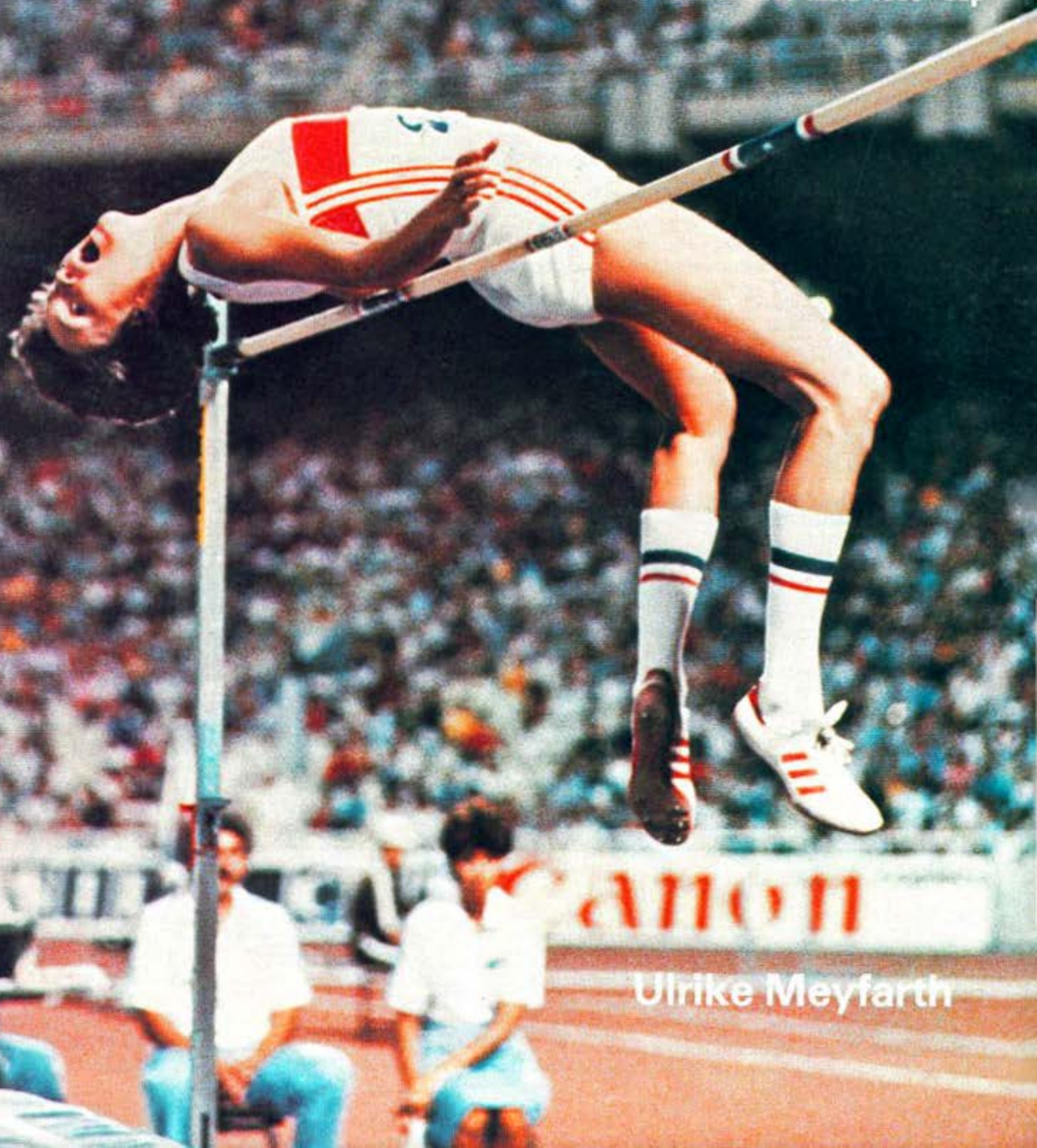

forming part of an indoor match (problem for the statisticians: should Martin Girvan and Chris Black be credited with an outdoor international appearance despite receiving indoor international vests for the occasion?). Girvan was in superb form, his first throw of 73.34m — just 84cm away from his personal best — falling a mere 40cm short of the distance achieved by Igor Nikulin (2nd on the world all-time list with his 83.54 of last year) and Olympic champion Yuriy Sedykh. That's a performance that must augur well for Girvan's prospects this summer although he would be as astonished as anyone if he can stay that close to the great Soviet pair later in the year. 1, I. Women's Match

60: Joan Baptiste, drafted in at short notice to contest her first 60's of the season, was a revelation. Showing excellent finishing powers she drew clear of Raisa Makhova for a 7.42 victory in the first race, and was even more impressive in the second race in which she was

200: In between her two 60's Joan Baptiste scored a magnificent win at her favourite distance. Makhova, who won the Soviet indoor title in 23.70, was leading until an inspired burst over the last ten metres took Joan, a Senior Aircraftswoman conveniently stationed at RAF Cosford, past her rival. The time of 23.80 tied her personal best indoors and suggests she could be under 23 sec and vying for No. 2 spot behind Kathy Cook this summer. 1, BAPTISTE 23.80; 2, Makhova 23.88; 3, CARMEN SMART 24.24; 4, Y. 400: The Soviet girls were utterly dominant, which isn't surprising considering Yelena Korban ran 50.78 and Larisa Krylova 50.60 last season. 1, Y. Korban 52.63; 2, L. Krylova 53.61; 3, JANINE MacGREGOR 55.03; 4, KAREN BAKER 56.41.

800: Lyubov Gurina was mightily impressive, as befits a 1:58.09 performer. Content to bide her time until the bell (Carol Lightfoot leading in 1:36.55), she sprinted that final 200 in 27.20! Making her first indoor appearance for two years, Lorraine Baker (whose sister Karen ran in the 400) ran well to take second ahead of Olga Monakhova, who has a time of 1:58.22 to her credit. 1, L. 1500: Chris McMeekin made a brave attempt to mix it with two opponents far superior to her on paper and led at the bell in 3:43.0. However, whereas Chris needed 33.3 for the final 200 (clocking an indoor pb of 4:16.33) the Soviet sub-4 pair of Yelena Sipatova and Nadyezhda Ralldugina were nearly 3 sec quicker. 1, Y. Sipatova 4:13.48; 2, N. Ralldugina 4:13.61; 3, CHRIS McMEEKIN 4:16.33; 4, KATIE FAIRBRASS 4:27.90.

3000: Julie Asgill was another to try and stay with the opposition and though she started dropping back with 800 to go her reward was an absolute pb of 9:14.0. As in the 1500, the visitors gave it everything on the last lap and on this occasion a 30.6 final 200 gave Zamira Zaitseva (the European 1500 silver medallist) victory over Svyetlana Guskova, who is the third fastest of all-time at this distance with 8:29.36. 1, Z. High Jump: Tamara Bykova might just be the next world record holder. The Athens silver medallist, who has jumped 1.98m this winter, looked marvellous as she cleared new all-comers bests of 1.93 and 1.96, and she had a good crack at the world indoor record height of 2.01. Larisa Kositsyna equalled Ann-Marie Cording's previous Cosford best of 1.91, while Barbara Simmonds raised her indoor pb to 1.85. 1, T. Bykova 1.96 (UK a-c best); 2, L. Kositsyna 1.91; 3, BARBARA SIMMONDS 1.85; 4, JUDY LIVERMORE 1.79.

Long Jump: Svyetlana Sorina (née Vanyushina), the former world indoor record holder with 6.83m, won easily enough but was reduced to a very moderate 6.31. The Soviet second string Yelena Popkova is primarily a high jumper — a 1.97 performer! 1, S. Sorina 6.31; 2, CAROL EARLINGTON 6.15; 3, Y. Popkova 5.96; 4, KIM HAGGER 5.85.

Shot: Hopes that Venissa Head might be pulled closer to 19m by the USSR's top two shot putters were not realised. Venissa was unable to better her opening 17.40 and was no match for the extremely tall and promising Natalya Lisovskaya, aged 20, who set a lifetime best of 20.70, or Nunu Abashidze. TYNESIDE SET FOR INVASION

The 11th IAAF World Cross Country Championships, to be held in Gateshead on March 20th, will see an influx of at least 12,000 people coming to Tyneside. Apart from the teams of athletes from the 39 countries who have entered there are foreign delegations and spectators, the world's press and media and spectators from all over the country. Twelve hotels are already fully committed, for the event, which is sponsored by IVECO, Europe's bus and truck giant. The English Cross Country Union is responsible for staging the event but all local management is being carried out by Gateshead MBC's Department of Sports and Recreation.

The superbly designed, custom built course at Gateshead is creating considerable interest amongst the greatest collection of middle and long distance runners ever brought to Britain as most World Championships are held on flat race courses and the Gateshead Riverside Bowl has numerous inclines and hills. Spectators can see nearly all of the course from most of the many vantage points but any blind spots will be covered by a huge Diamond Vision TV screen which will show all races as they are in progress.

Holtom In Hunt For Gold

BRITAIN'S best hope for a gold medal in this weekend's European Indoor Championships in Budapest is probably Mark Holtom. His sparkling performances against the West Germans (when he set a UK best of 7.69 for 60m hurdles) and the USSR (decisively beating co-world record holder Andre Prokofiev) indicate he is superbly prepared for the test — but so too is that finest of competitors, Olympic champion Thomas Munkelt, who leads the rankings with a 7.63.

Two other British athletes currently rank in the top three in their specialities and thus must be considered medal prospects: Selwyn Clarke in the 60m and Peter Elliott in the 800. Hopefully, the occasion will also lift Ainsley Bennett (400), Colin Reitz (3000), Bev Kinch (60), Joan Baptiste (200) and Jane Finch (800) to performances which could be close to medal calibre, while Earl Tulloch (200), Lorna Boothe (60H) and Venissa Head (SP) are all capable of further improvement on their recent UK indoor bests. The British team is completed by Teena Colebrook, who could be pulled through to a pb in the 800, Nigel Walker (60H) who will gain valuable experience, and Steve Barry — who could spring a surprise in the 5000 walk after the boost of his great UK 20km walk record of 1:22:51 on the Isle of Man last Saturday.

After the next complete circuit, with the girls reaching 'the bell', Mrs. Benning made her move and the important gaps instantly appeared. Jane Furniss reacted best, but that initial five metre advantage proved very important. The leaders were now engaged in a zig-zag battle through tail-enders, and as every one of them offered a target for Mrs. Benning, so she eased away. Jane, in turn, pulled clear of Debbie Peel and Chris Boxer, and Paula Fudge, too, now started to drift backwards — towards Glynis Penny, who was firmly established in sixth. When the tape intervened, Chris had her title and Jane proved a worthy second, improving on her fourth in 1981 and third last year. It was her first race since the 'Northern' a month before. 'I'm very pleased and glad that I've justified selection for the 'A' team'.

Chris Boxer got the better of Debbie for third in the closing stages, Paula and Glynis followed comfortably, well clear of Kath Carter, who established herself as a solid seventh on the last lap — to improve enormously on her best previous position, 25th last year — and Julie Asgill finished fast to overhaul Kath Binns on the run-in, with Teresa Purton tenth.

Even without Hilary Hollick and Sue Lonsdale, Sale held on to their team trophy — seems they're fast becoming the female Tipton, and they had the Intermediate winner — although Jane Furniss, Jenny Pearson and Jill Clarke can consider themselves unlucky, all finishing within the first 20.

After the race, Chris Benning went on to say "I want to do well at Gateshead. It's the first time I've concentrated at cross-country, but I felt I needed to after a couple of bad years on the track. This summer I'll be concentrating on the 3000m, and I'll aim for Helsinki if all goes well". For this likeable example of what's good in British women's athletics, it's about time it did.

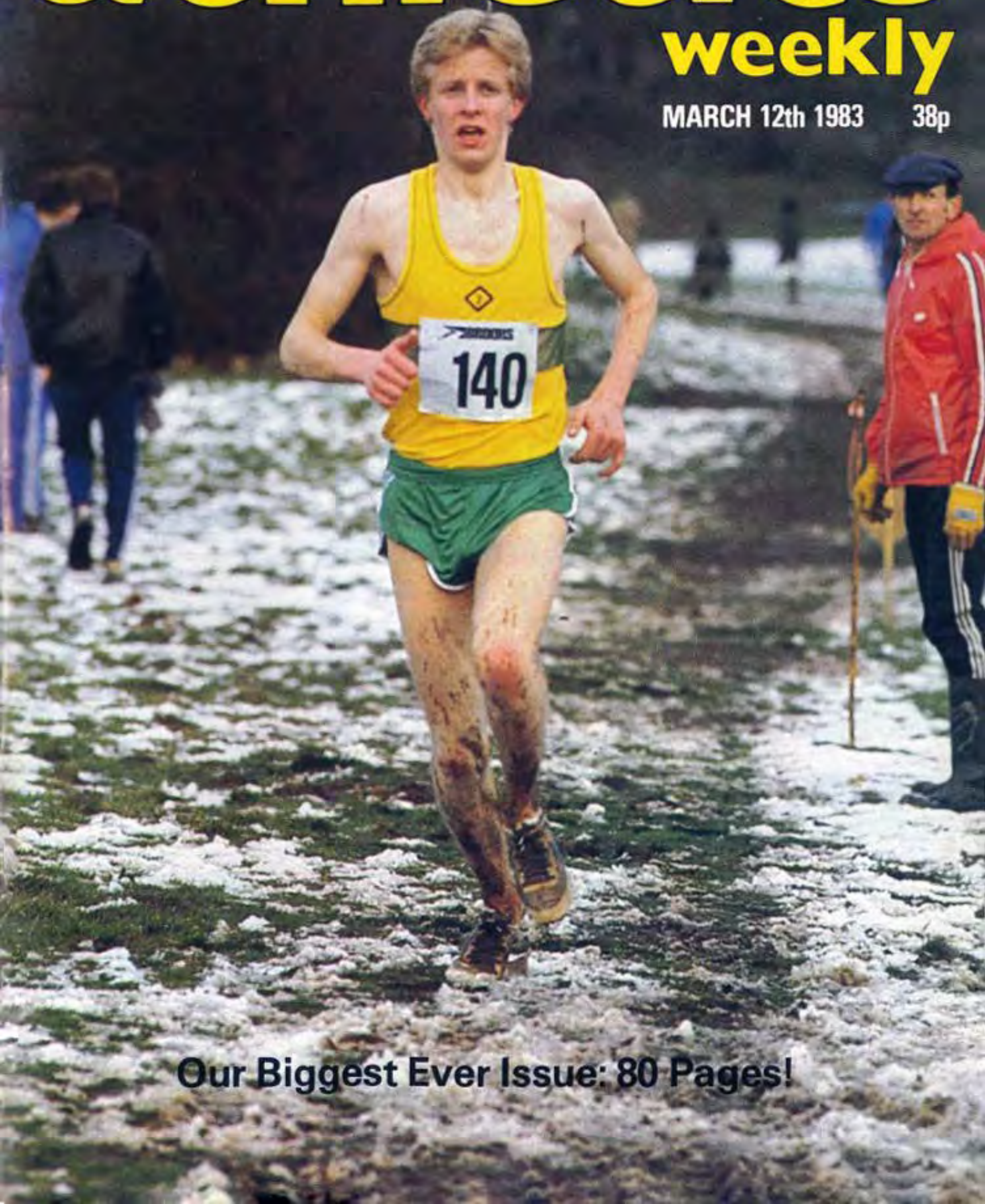

MENNEA'S 'RECORD' WON'T COUNT

IT LOOKS as though the true holder of the world indoor 200m 'record' is West Germany's 17-year-old Ralf Lubke at 20.77. The 20.74 credited to Pietro Mennea in Genoa on February 13th should be discounted as a video recording of the race shows the Olympic champion ran less than the correct distance by cutting into the lane inside. Two other brilliant marks cannot be considered as indoor world bests: a 13:13.3 5000 by Hansjorg Kunze in the GDR Championships and Jarmila Kratochvilova's 1:58.33 800 (57.6 at 400). Both were set on oversized tracks; i.e. a circuit of more than 200m.

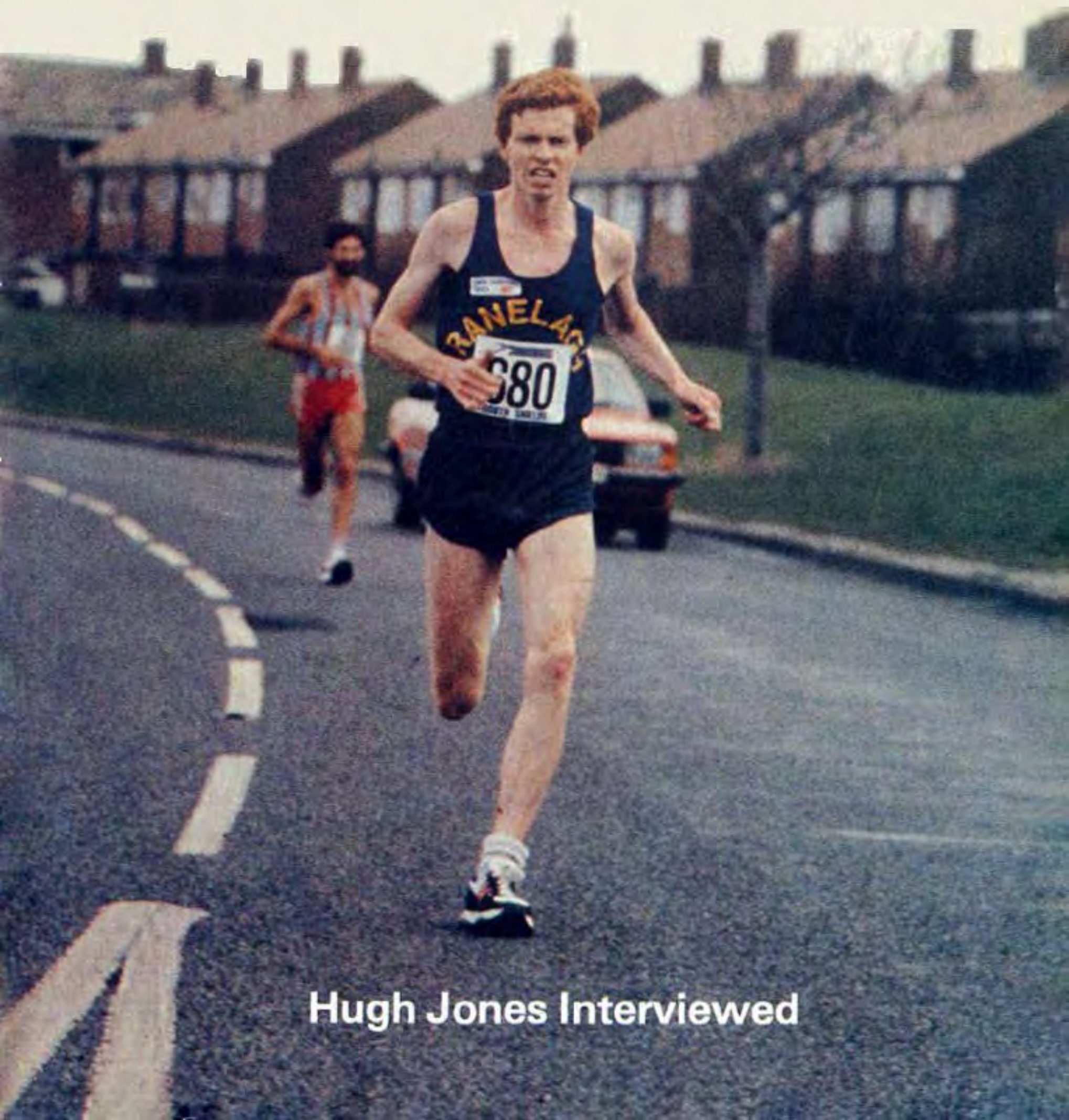

Los Angeles walk courses. Both the 20km and 50km will be held on the same 2½km out-and-back course, with the start and finish taking place in the stadium. Ideal, no doubt, from a judges, road control, feeding and spectator point of view, but soul destroying for the competitors. Excepting Athens last year, which was a 'real'

course, everything now appears sacrificed for totally flat, fast courses.

Judges to warn directly under IAAF rules. This Italian proposal was passed at the latest IAAF Council Meeting, in Rome during April. It will be used in both Helsinki and Bergen, and future internationals.

FABULOUS SPRINTING BY EAST GERMANS

Marlies Gohr sets world record of 10.81 . . . Marita Koch runs 10.83/21.82

EAST BERLIN on June 8th was the scene of the greatest sprint duel in women's athletics history. In perfect weather (26-28°C, following wind of 1.7m/sec) and with the excited 19,000 crowd enriching the atmosphere, Marlies Gohr held Marita Koch at bay — just — as both smashed Marlies' world 100m record of 10.88 with times of 10.81 and 10.83 respectively. At the same meeting super consistent Detlef Michel equalled Ferenc Paragi's European (and, until recently, world) javelin record of 96.72m. His series: 94.42, 92.54, 90.30, 92.58, 96.72, —. A week later, in cold and wet conditions at the GDR Championships in Karl-Marx-Stadt, Gohr enjoyed a bigger margin of victory over Koch in the 100, 10.90 to 10.99, while Koch later came up with her — and the world's — third fastest ever 200 time of 21.82, leaving Olympic and European champion Barbel Wöckel six metres behind. Thomas Schonlebe, winner of the 400 title in 45.50, is only 17! He ran 46.71 last year.

USSR: Great marks in Spartakiad

The Spartakiad staged in Moscow between June 18th and 22nd threw up one stunning performance after another, topped by world records from Sergey Litvinov (84.14m hammer) and East Germany's Ramona Neubert (6836 heptathlon), and Soviet records by Valeriy Sereda (2.35m high jump) and Vasily Grishchenkov (17.55m triple jump) — the latter just 1cm short of the best ever at sea level (17.56 by Willie Banks). The Soviet depth in some events was remarkable: five vaulters cleared 5.60m with another two at 5.55 . . . nine triple jumpers reached 16.90m or better . . . five hammer throwers over 78m . . . six decathletes over 8200 . . . eight 400m runners inside 46 sec . . . five women long jumpers beyond 6.70m.

Therefore my suggestion is that the hammer, shot and discus be competed for under similar conditions to the weightlifting fraternity. This system would operate for senior men and senior women in County and National championships. I feel the benefits to the sport would far outweigh the administrative arguments.

If (yes, the proverbial 'if') these changes could be integrated, it would allow and encourage more athletes to stay in the sport. I also feel that more emphasis would be put on good technique and therefore coaching would be forced to improve. Hopefully one of the biggest spin-offs would be more good coaches coming from the ranks of the athletes. Comments please.

The suggestion of splitting the heavy throws into weight categories is one that has been advocated on and off for many years, and certainly merits serious consideration. Weightlifting is divided into the following limits: 52kg, 56kg, 60kg, 67.5kg, 75kg, 82.5kg, 90kg, 100kg, 110kg and 110kg-plus.
