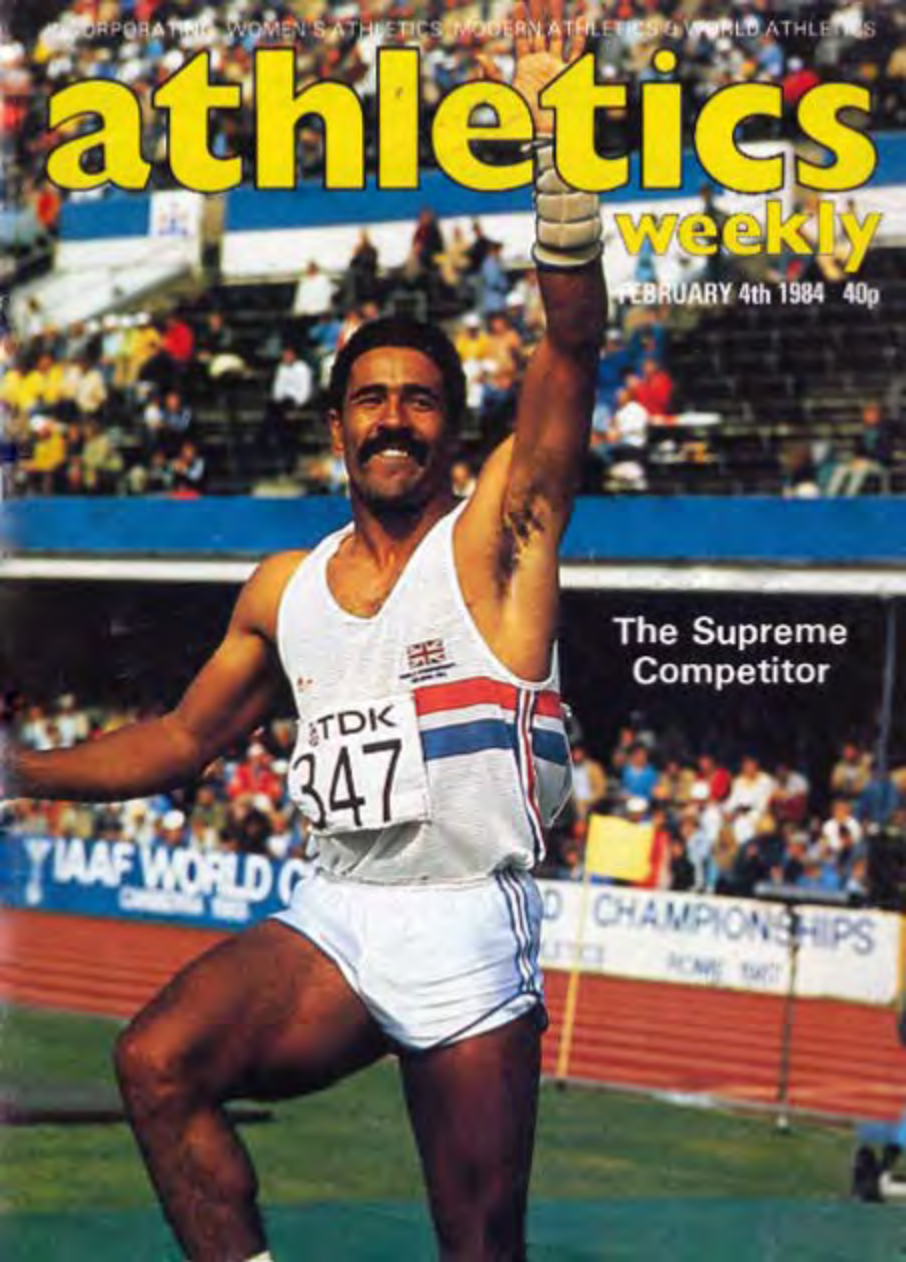

What Price A World Title?

WHEN IS a world champion not regarded as the best in the world the year he or she won the title? In six cases, according to the *Track & Field News* World Rankings for 1983. Despite their triumphs in Helsinki, Eamonn Coghlan, Alberto Cova, Ernesto Canto and Yekaterina Fesenko are rated second best . . . with Willi Wulbeck relegated to fourth and Gennadiy Avdeyenko to fifth!

The TFN World Rankings, now in their 37th year, are justifiably treated with respect for the meticulous work that goes into their compilation but, in my opinion, the guidelines do not take into account fully the importance of the World Championships (or Olympics). "Under our system", explain the compilers, "athletes are judged on three criteria. In order of importance: 1. Honours won; 2. Win-loss record; 3. Marks. Winning big meets against top competition, regardless of time or distance, is of prime import.

It must be noted, however, that no one meet — not even the World Championships — is a be-all, end-all".

I beg to disagree. For every aspiring contender last year, Helsinki was the event which really mattered. Winning other competitions or setting records, before or after, was no substitute for success on the one day everyone had peaked for. Take Willi Wulbeck: he lost a number of races

prior and subsequent to the World Championships but, when it counted most, he was a decisive winner. How he could be ranked below the men who finished second (Rob Druppers) and third (Joaquim Cruz) behind him, not to mention David Mack — who didn't even reach the final — is beyond my comprehension. Only one man in the world (Steve Cram) ran faster all year than Wulbeck's 1:43.65 in Helsinki, and Willi went on the following week to win in the European Cup Final. It's all very puzzling.

Britain's two world champions, Cram and Daley Thompson, could hardly have been ranked other than first in their specialities, and other Britons to make the top three were Steve Ovett and Fatima Whitbread. The rankings, in brief:—

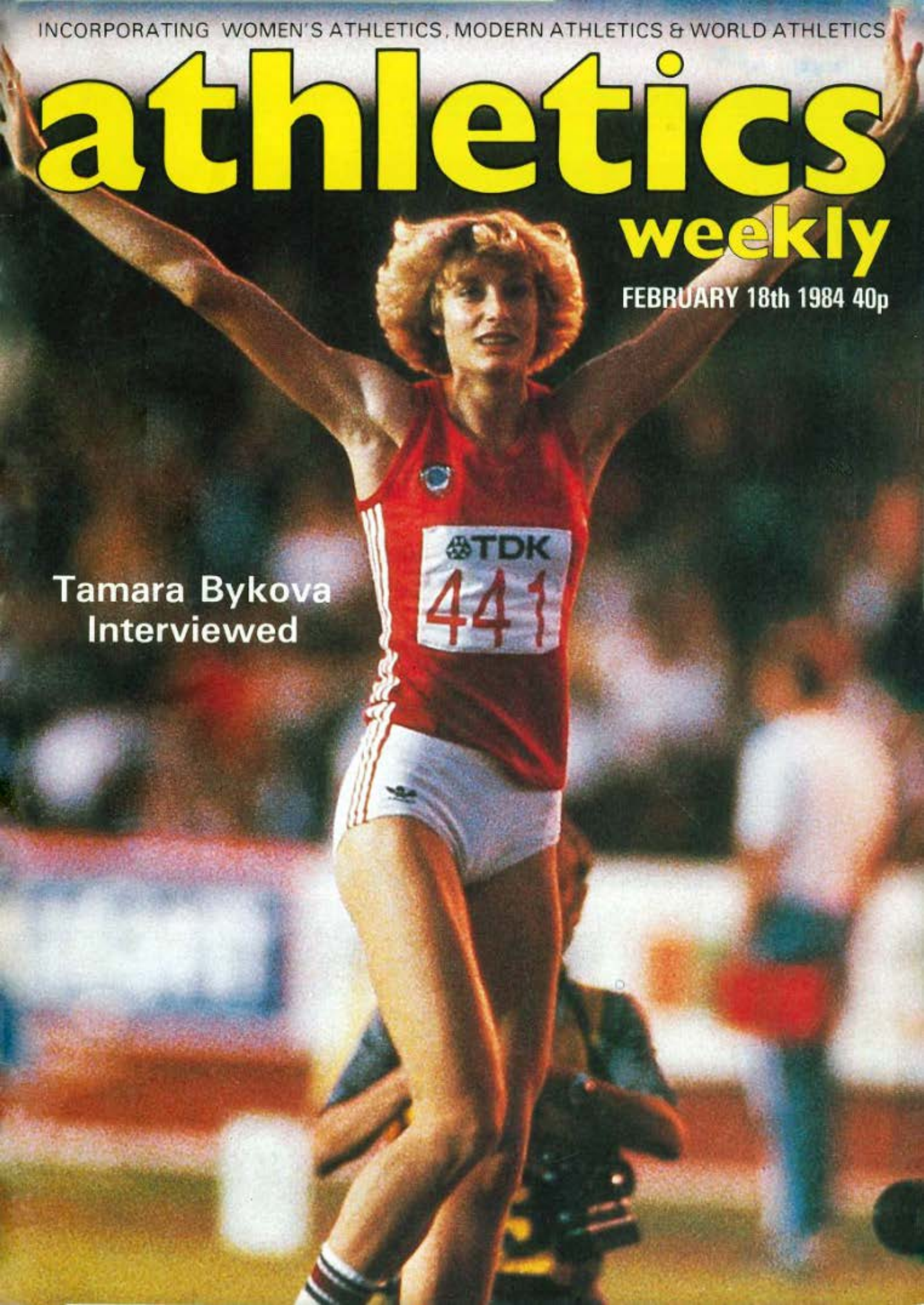

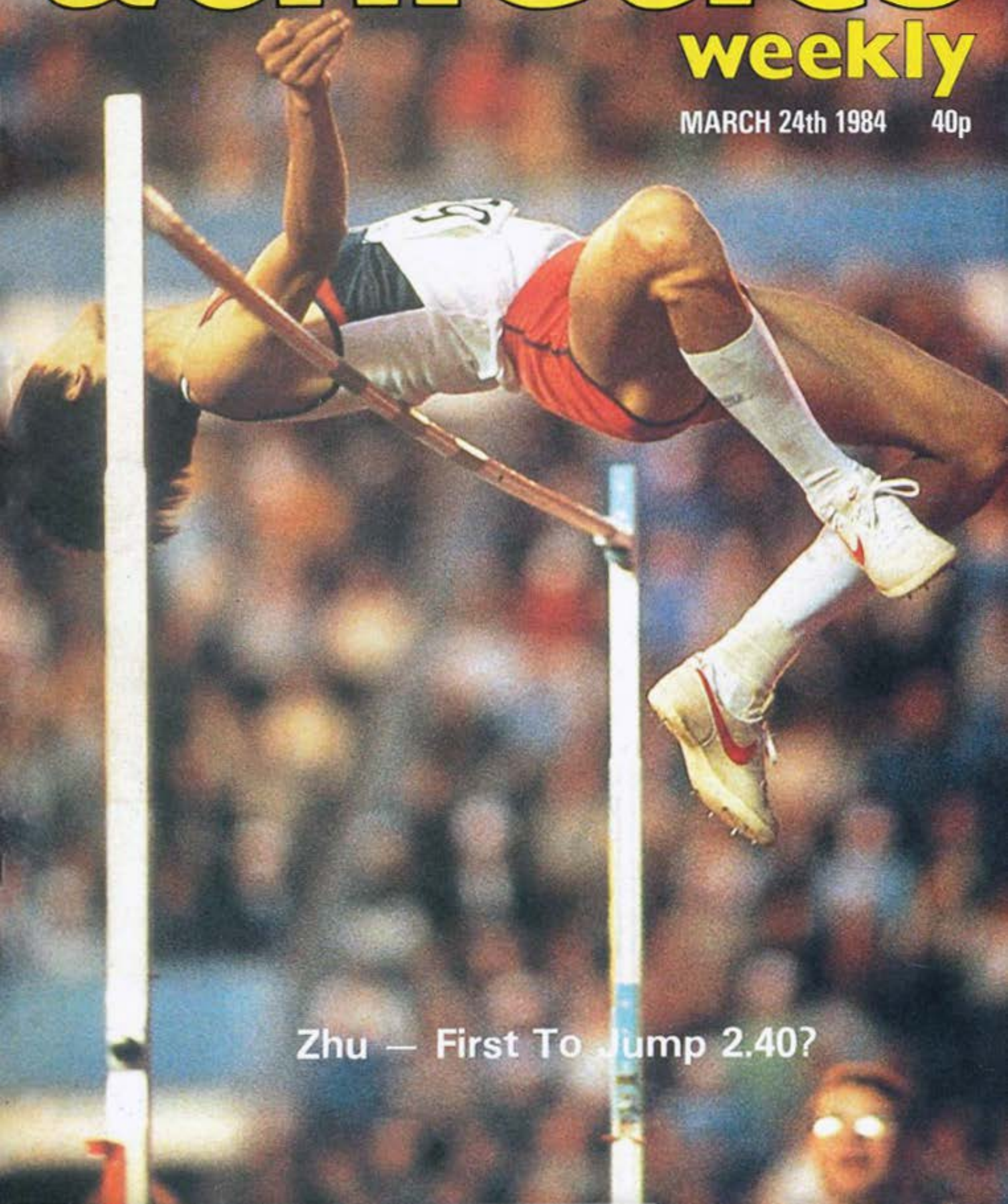

Coaching Congress Awarded To Birmingham

THE XIII Congress of the European Athletics Coaches Association will be staged in Birmingham from January 23rd-27th, 1985. The granting of the Congress to the UK marks another important stage in the development of the sport in

the country and this European Coaches Congress will be the first to be staged in England.

The themes of the XIII Congress will embrace all the jumping disciplines, pole vault and the jumps in combined events. The Congress will not only examine current trends in the theory and practice of these disciplines, but will also focus on lessons learned at the Los Angeles Olympics.

THREE AMERICAN RECORDS BROKEN

With the Final Olympic Trials just one week ahead, this year's TAC National Championships was a strange meet. Many top athletes such as Carl Lewis and Steve Scott did not compete at all. Others such as Evelyn Ashford, Edwin Moses and Andre Phillips competed only in the preliminaries with no intention of running the finals. Calvin Smith and Chandra Cheeseborough felt slight muscle twinges in their preliminary races and decided not to run the finals.

Still, there were some very outstanding performances including three American records, one World Junior record and some exceptional discus throwing. Earl Bell set a new American pole vault record of 5.80m, and took three tries at 5.89, though none was particularly close. Valerie Brisco-Hooks surprised everyone when she became the first American to run under 50 seconds for 400m, her time being 49.83. In the 400m hurdles, Judi Brown set an American record of 54.99, but perhaps even more notable was the time of 55.20 behind her set by Leslie Maxie, establishing a new World Junior record. John Powell had a lifetime best in defeating his long time rival Mac Wilkins in the discus, 71.26m to 70.44.

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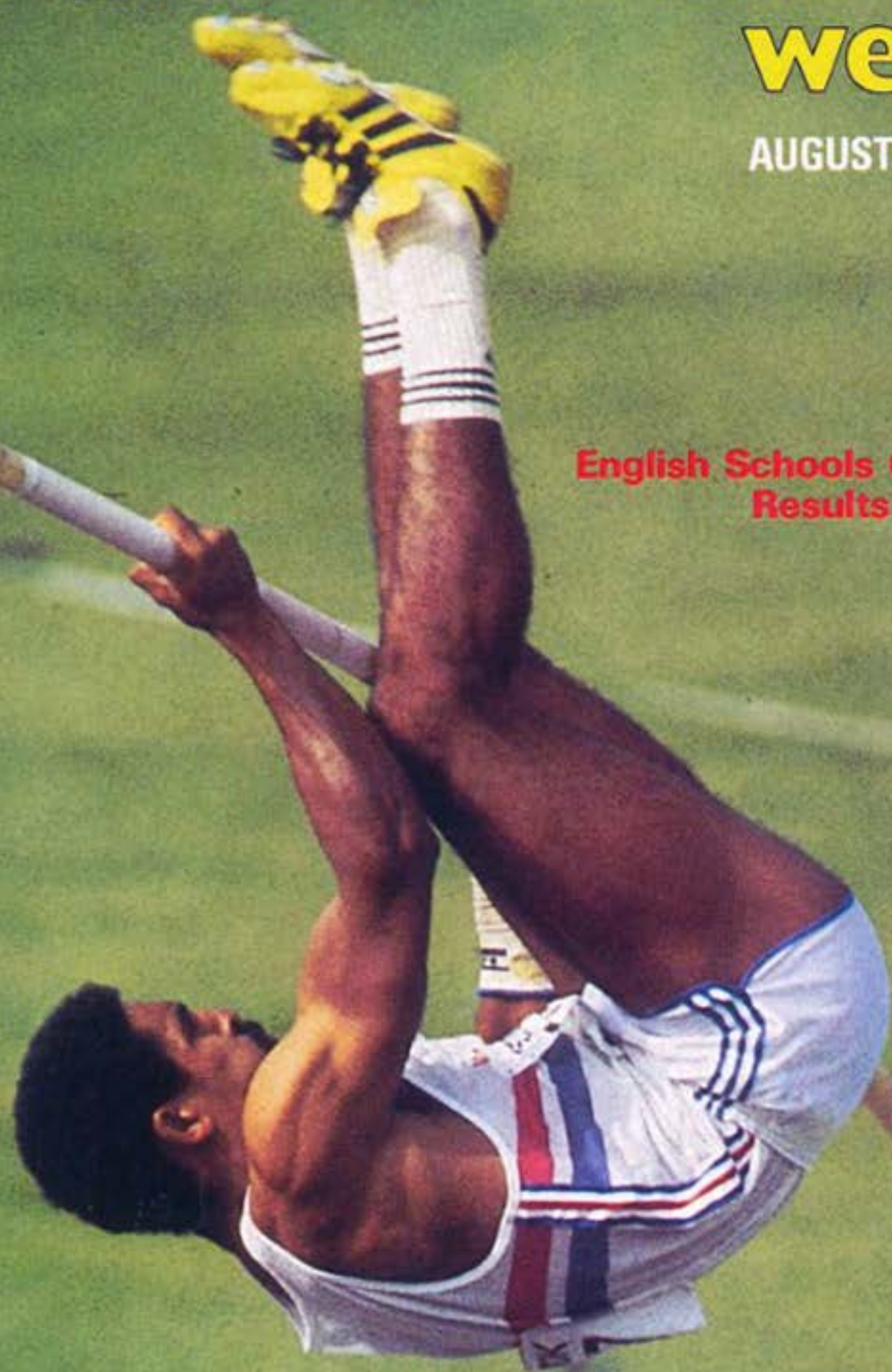

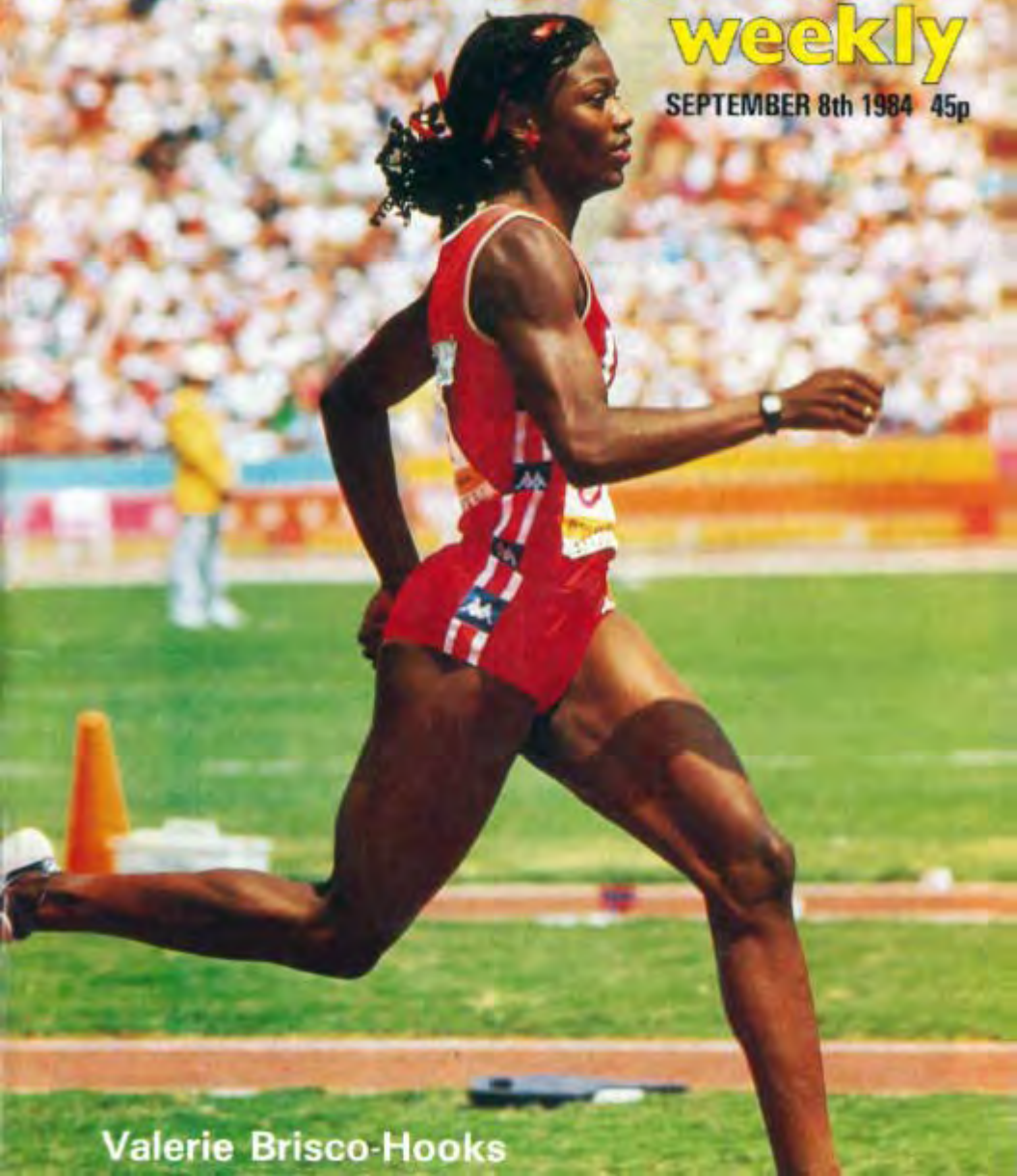

Post-Olympic activity in Europe

The action has been fast and furious throughout Europe as Olympic stars and the top talent from the Eastern bloc have gone about their business, keeping to themselves at some meetings and clashing at others. Despite repeated attempts in the middle distance department, no men's world records have been broken, but new women's records have been set for the 100, mile and discus.

Italians first off the mark

August 15th, Viareggio

Two newly crowned Olympic champions, Italy's Alessandro Andrei and Morocco's Italian-based Said Aouita, appeared at the first post-Olympic meeting, a small-scale affair at Viareggio just three days after the close of the Games.

World record by Meszynski

August 16th-18th, Prague

Proof, as though any was needed, that the women's events in Los Angeles were severely affected by the absence of the Russians, East Germans, etc. was provided in abundance during what was probably the classiest all-women's meeting ever staged. Although it is simplistic just to compare winning performances without regard to all the factors involved, it is not without significance that the winning marks in Prague were superior to those in LA in 12 of the 17 events. Only Valerie Brisco-Hooks (200), Joan Benoit (Mar), Ulrike Meyfarth (HJ) and the USA relay teams emerged from the Olympics with better performances, although it should be noted that Evelyn Ashford's 10.97 100 into a 1.2m/s wind in LA is probably intrinsically faster than Marlies Gohr's 10.95 into an 0.18m wind in Prague.

Two Olympic medallists plunged into the deep end: Alice Brown (2nd to Ashford in the Olympics) placed 6th in the 100 and gold medallist Claudia Losch was 7th in the shot over two metres behind world record holder Natalya Lisovskaya. In the 100 hurdles, won by Yordanka Donkova,

the first five finishers bettered Benita Fitzgerald-Brown's Olympic winning time.

Individual highlight of the meeting was the world discus record of 73.36m by Irina Meszynski (GDR) on August 17th. Her series: 70.46, 68.14, 73.36, 71.10, 66.02, 71.34. Her defeated rivals included the last two world record holders in Galina Savinkova and Maria Petkova... and the woman who, just a few days later, would take the record from her — Zdenka Silhava. Other great performances included a 48.16 400 victory by Marita Koch, equalling her East German record and constituting the second fastest time ever behind Jarmila Kratochvilova's 47.99. On this occasion Kratochvilova, who has been struggling to find her best form this season, finished only 5th in 49.94. It was her Czech colleague, Tatjana Kocembova, who provided the closest opposition to Koch (who flashed through 300 in 34.01!), clocking 48.73. Another world record under threat was Margarita Ponomaryova's 400 hurdles time of 53.58, as Marina Stepanova registered 53.67. World bests for the year were set by Nadezhda Ralldugina (3:56.63 1500) and Tatyana Kazankina (8:33.01 3000).

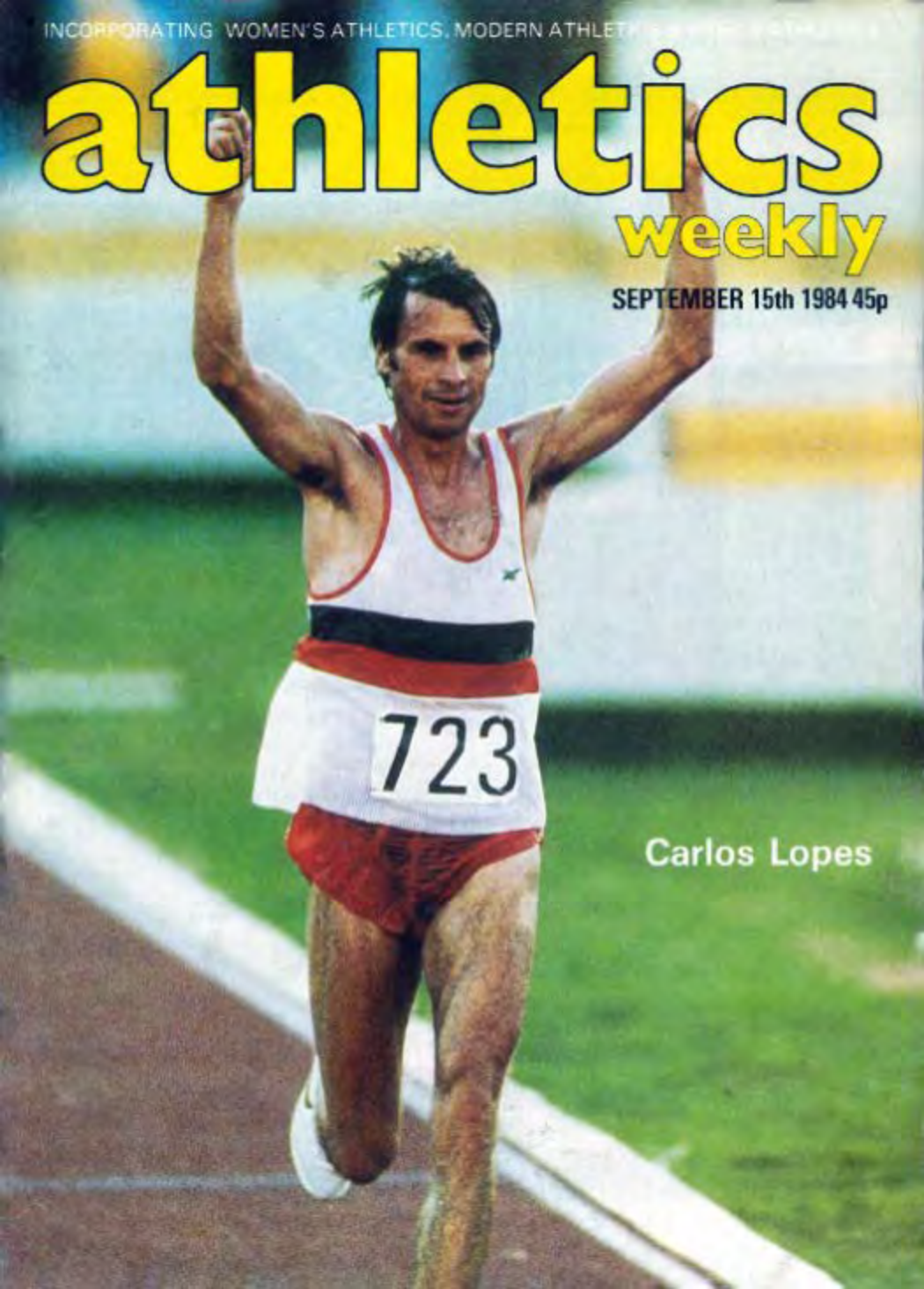

World Discus Record

In Prague, the expectations for world records were higher, and a whole spate of events could have produced them, theoretically, on the basis of the current form guide. But the weather — cold with occasional rain — put paid to much of that, as the competition between 19 countries' athletes got under way.

All six finals of the first day had the potential of producing a world record — on paper. But none did, and the resultant disappointment for the Czechoslovak hosts, whose women did so fantastically well in 1983, was laced with a little bitterness, since Helsinki world champions Jarmila Kratochvilova and Helena Fibingerova both got beaten.

Marita Koch (48.16) won the 400m in front of the hosts' number two, Tatiana Kocembova (48.73), with the great Kratochvilova (49.94) — apparently injured — tying up in the home stretch

to place fifth. Fibingerova (21.33) came second in the shot to new world record holder Natalya Lisovskaya (21.96), while in the javelin only the GDR's Petra Felke (73.30) made friends with the slippery run-up, and Cuba's 1980 Olympic champion, Maria Colon (64.34), was also eclipsed by the Bulgarian Todorova (65.40).

Marlies Gohr (10.95) won the 100m, with her 1980 Olympic victor, Ludmila Kondratyeva (11.02) runner-up, and in the 100m hurdles Yordanka Donkova (12.55) got the gold and Sabine Paetz (12.60) — who had opted out of the heptathlon, in which she holds the world record — the silver. The strength of the hurdles final was considerable, as evidenced by the fact that even the seventh-placed athlete ran within the 13 seconds mark.

On the second day, Barbel Wöckel (22.15), Heike Daute-Drechsler (7.15) and newly-crowned world record holder, Ludmila Andonova (1.96), won the 200m, long jump and high jump as expected.

But the form book got thrown away in the 400m hurdles, where both Marina Stepanova (53.67) and Yekaterina Grun-Fessenko (54.42) beat the world record holder, Margarita Ponomaryova (54.65), who had led until the eighth hurdle.

The discus brought a red-hot competition at world-class level, and the sole world record of the Friendship Games track and field events, with the third round throw of 73.36 of the GDR's Irina Meszynski. Galina Murashova (72.14) and Zdenka Silhava (70.14) pushed the former world record holder, Galina Savinkova (68.90), out of the medal picture.

The two relays, the 1500m and the marathon were on the programme of the third day, and all but the 4 × 100m — which the Bulgarians (42.61)

CARL LEWIS CONQUERS BUDAPEST

OVER 50,000 spectators filed into Budapest's Népstadion on August 20th, Hungary's Constitution Day — the biggest crowd ever to assemble for a track and field meet in Hungary. The occasion was the 7th Grand Prix of Budapest competition, which had a special kick to it this year. With the Olympics in LA and the boycott countries' alternative Friendship Games in Moscow and Prague over, this was the first occasion to match the stars from both sides. There were 12 Olympic champions of LA, Moscow and Montreal, 12 Helsinki world champions and seven world record holders among the 300 competitors from 30 countries.

But the real attraction that mobilised the Hungarians was Carl Lewis. The desire to see the fastest man on earth, perhaps the greatest athlete the world has known, was overwhelming. Not since Nurmi visited Budapest in the 1920s, or opera singers Gigli and Calli Curci, has the personal cult taken root so feverishly.

When Lewis lined up in lane 4 for the 100m, with the Cuban Osvaldo Lara, winner of the Friendship dash in Moscow, on his right and LA bronze-winner Ben Johnson on his left, the stadium went bananas. Everybody expected a world record. But Lewis had a bad start, caught up with the rest at 50m, walked away from them and won 'only' in 10.05, with Hungary's Friendship runner-up, Attila Kovacs, second again. So Kovacs (10.27) avenged the Moscow defeat by Lara, who came third in 10.28, followed by the Canadian Johnson (10.33).

The women's 100m, including the GDR's Ingrid Auerswald, was awaiting starter's orders when the announcement came that Lewis was

giving autographs behind the tower building. All interest in the track proceedings waned instantly, mighty crowds took off to see Lewis and the organisers had to step in and start filtering the frenzied fans to avoid a commotion.

Lewis's participation, and his pledge to return to next year's Grand Prix, were the personal triumphs of Miklos Nemeth, full-time organiser of the event and the 1976 Olympic champion in the javelin, who used the occasion to announce his retirement from active competition. "I was 15 when I first took part in a javelin competition, and my active career lasted for 22 years", said Nemeth, who still holds the Olympic record of 94.58m and is sixth on the world all-time list.

Carl's sister, Helsinki bronze medallist long jumper Carol Lewis, was also immensely popular, though she came second with 6.78 to Poland's Anna Wlodarczyk, whose 6.81 was another of the day's 14 stadium records. And the adulation — sometimes perhaps a bit hysterical — also extended to the Lewis parents. When Papa Lewis jumped up from his seat after Carl crossed the line in the 100m, every Hungarian paper had to have a picture of him and Budapest's own brand of *paparazzi* surrounded and watched him non-stop from then on.

Immensely uplifting for the spectators was Steve Cram's solo world record attempt in the 1500m and brave front-running, the like of which is as rare in the East as a white crow, and has certainly not been seen in Budapest since Steve Ovett's visit three years ago. Cram's pace dipped in the end, but the 3:33.13 he ran was better than his LA silver-winning time of 3:33.40 and his tempo drew Istvan Knipl, who finished third, to a new Hungarian record of 3:36.74.

The British duo of Colin Reitz (8:29.68) and Roger Hackney (8:30.07) dominated the 3000m steeplechase, and there was a mighty battle in the long jump, from which Australia's Gary Honey emerged victorious with a final leap of 8.27 a new Commonwealth record, overtaking Laszlo Szalma's fourth round 8.23.

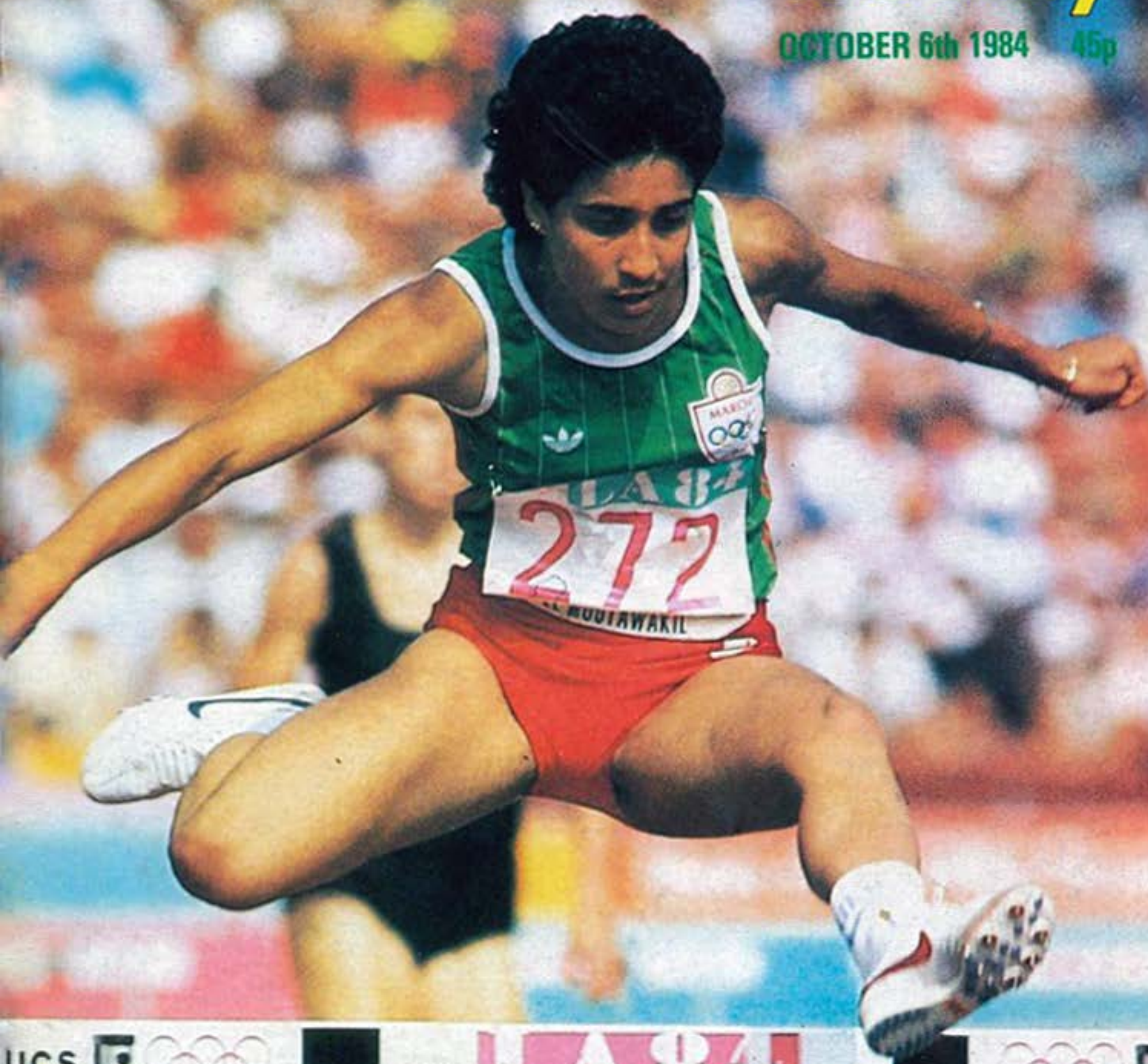

Overseas News And Results

World Junior records set in Soviet Championships

THE USSR Championships, held in the Ukrainian city of Donetsk from September 7th to 9th, were conceived as a review of reserves, said Ignor Ter-Ovanesyan, chief coach of the USSR team, commenting on the results of the competitions, *reports Tass*. Many of the top Soviet competitors did not compete, but among the stars who were present particularly notable were world record holder Sergey Bubka, who won his first USSR title with a vault of 5.80m (unsuccessfully attempting a world mark of 5.95), and former world record holder, Galina Savinkova, who threw the discus 73.28m for a national record.

Two world Junior records were established. Rodion Gataulin (19) placed second to Bubka with a vault of 5.65m, while Olga Turchak (17) became the youngest ever USSR Senior champion when she high jumped 1.96m (Tamara Bykova was absent). Olga equalled the best ever Junior mark, by South African Charmaine Gale in 1981. Olga is 1.88/6'2" tall and weighs 65kg/143lb. Another outstanding youngster, European Junior record holder, Vladimir Budko (19), won the 400 hurdles in 49.74.
