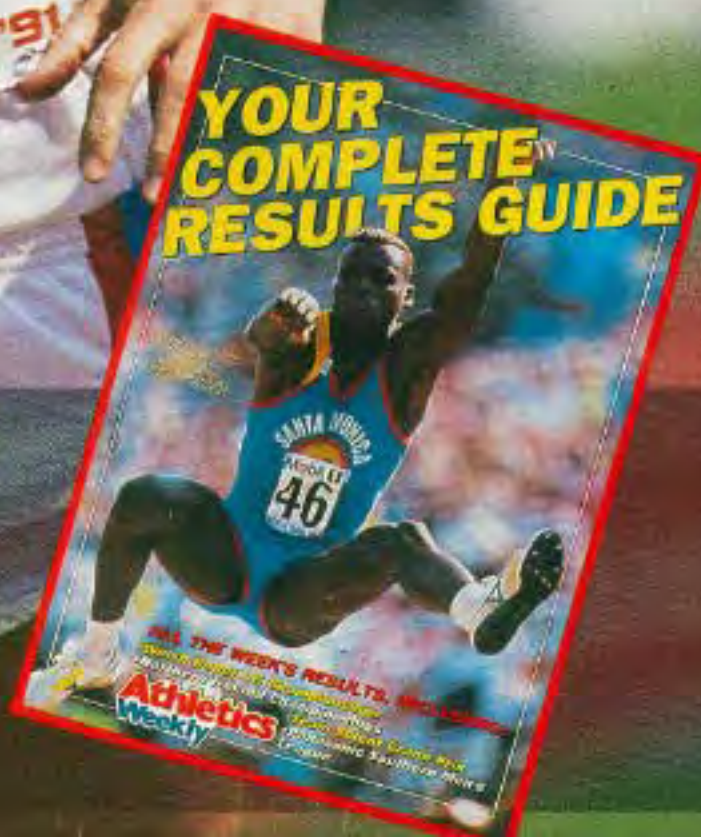

Salvatore Antibo has maintained a low profile so far this summer, the buzz being that he is after the 10,000m world record in Oslo.

Last year's double European champion is in tremendous form and he tested the opposition with an opening lap of 62.94sec and another of 61.16sec.

Only Gary Staines survived the onslaught as both of them were timed at 2:35.14 for the first kilometre.

By 2km (5:14.75), the champion and Staines were 50m clear.

Staines had a couple of laps at the front, going through 3km in 7:59.69, until Antibo went off on his own, inserting a 61sec lap with just over five laps remaining.

Whittle, the man who carried the baton to victory at the 1989 competition, rode off the challenges of the Soviet Union and the Germans, passing to Roger Black for the final leg.

The Team Solent man had no problems and the team came home more than two seconds ahead of the Soviet Union.

Margarita Ponomaryova, who set a world record of 53.58sec in 1984, made a rare track appearance, although she has run 54.68sec this year.

Sally Gunnell has been in sound form of late and was neck and neck until the Soviet got away at the seventh hurdle, opening a decisive gap.

Gunnell hadn't settled for second best and when Ponomaryova lost her 15-stride pattern at the ninth hurdle, the British team captain vigorously tried to close. That she failed was no disgrace, her time of 54.61sec, only 0.19sec behind the winner, was her fastest for three

The Germans put their faith in world record-holder Petra Meier-Felke although compatriot Karen Forkel has been more consistent this year. For Britain, former Olympic champion Tessa Sanderson was making her sixth European Cup appearance, having finished second in 1977 and 1981.

The wind played havoc with the new javelin and the first 60-metre-plus throw came in the second round by Irina Kostyuchenkova. Sanderson had a no-throw after a 54.86m opener.

In the third round, Sanderson threw 65.18, the best throw of the implement by a British girl. It also gave her the lead, although Meier-Felke reached out to 63.18.

Not many German spectators turned up for the meeting, but those that did were confident that Katrin Krabbe would successfully defend her title.

Times of late haven't been good for the double European champion and her run continued when she was decisively beaten into second place by Irina Sergeyeva.

The Soviet, only sixth in Split, has improved considerably this year and beat Merlene Ottey over 60 metres at the World Indoor Championships.

Her performance in Frankfurt must rank as her best to date. She

displayed a classic start, superb pick-up which took her well clear of Krabbe and her time of 11.29sec into a 2.75m/s wind was truly world-class. Stephanie Douglas almost gained third place in a tight finish.

This year's second fastest woman, Ella Kovacs, was spared facing Olympic, world and European champion Sigrun Grau, the host nation selecting Christine Wachtel.

Ann Williams had an early bumping session with Kovacs, who went to the front, tracked by Wachtel and Svetlana Masterkova.

The bell was passed in 60.87sec as the leading three watched one another, although Williams was also well placed.

The real break for home came just before the last furlong. Kovacs took off and we had the satisfying

sight of watching Williams latch onto the slipstream of Wachtel and join the battle for medals.

The Sale Harrier might have a Commonwealth silver medal, but her performance here was the best of her career.

The first four all dipped under two minutes, Kovacs edging ahead of Wachtel, while Masterkova just held off Williams, whose time of 1:59.88 makes her the sixth on the UK all-time list.

Marie-Jose Perec is best remembered for her disqualification for running out of her lane at the last World Cup. Third in Split, she has been in outstanding form over 100 to 400 metres this year, and reigning champion Grit Breuer knew she would have a fight on her hands.

The contrast of styles behind the grace of Perec, who strolled along the back straight, and Breuer, whose attribute is her strength, resulted in an exciting race.

The Frenchwomen led by less than a metre coming into the final 100m and Breuer deployed all of her power to get back on level terms.

The pair were giving everything they had as they almost staggered to the finishing line, Perec getting their first with a French record - the fastest time in the world this year.

Linda Keough, runner-up to Breuer two years ago, ran her fastest of the season.

As expected, this pair dominated the competition, the Soviet quickly regaining the lead from the German, due to a 1991 world best mark of 21.12m in round two.

Judy Oakes, like Tessa Sanderson, was making her sixth appearance in the competition. An 18.74 in round one placed her third and to the delight of the team she retained this position.

IF THE British had a certain winner, it had to be Yvonne Murray, now a truly world-class performer. Having beaten her main opponents, Margareta Keszeg and Lyubov Kremlyova, convincingly in Split, everyone sat back to watch an action replay.

After jogging the first 100m, Murray shot to the front and covered the first lap in 63.39sec. The Scot gradually built up a lead of almost 10sec at 1km, which increased to a maximum 11sec at 1,600m.

But then she began to pay for her foolhardiness. Uta Pippig led the charge to get back on terms and by the bell the time margin had been reduced to three seconds.

Keszeg bided her time before jumping Pippig, who held off Kremlyova, and, to add to Murray's nightmare, Annette Sergent came sweeping by.

The Scot finished the race at walking pace, covering the last 400m in almost 78sec. One hopes she has learnt her lesson.

LONG JUMP

Heike Drechsler may not hold the world record but in anyone's book she is undisputedly the finest long jumper of all-time.

Larisa Berezhnaya, whom the German has beaten five times this year, matched her for the first two rounds. Drechsler's third leap, with the wind just over the limit, was the winner, seeing her clear 7.20m. In all, she had five jumps over 7.00m.

Once again, Fiona May gave her best when it mattered, recording a season's best of 6.77m to repeat her third position of Gateshead.

Ilke Wyludda, who appears unbeatable by anyone for the next few years, dominated the event, all of her throws except for a foul in the fifth round, being over the 65m line.

Her main opposition came from Larisa Mikhalchenko, who was European junior champion 10 years ago. The Soviet has been in good form so far this year, having the worlds best throw of 69.20.

Jill Hunter and Kathrin Ullrich - chasing a third consecutive title - were quickly clear after only three laps.

Although Hunter did try to break last year's European silver medalist, Ullrich was quite happy to sit behind as the pair lapped all but two of the field.

One of Hunter's few weaknesses is her lack of finishing speed and when the German made her effort for home 180m from the line, she was unable to respond. Ullrich's reward was a national record and championship best performance of 31:03.62.

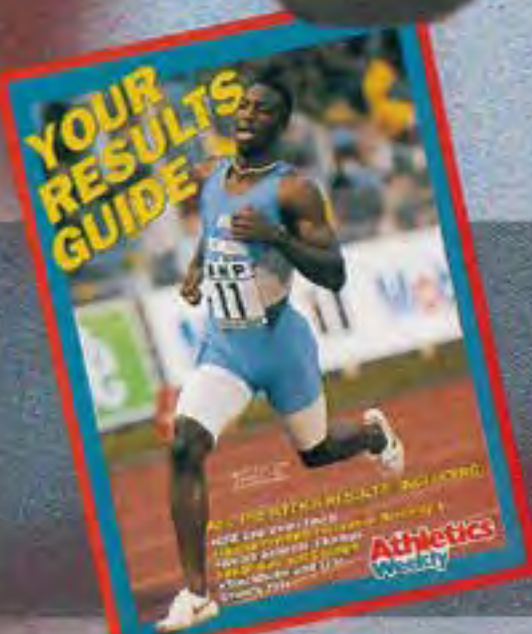

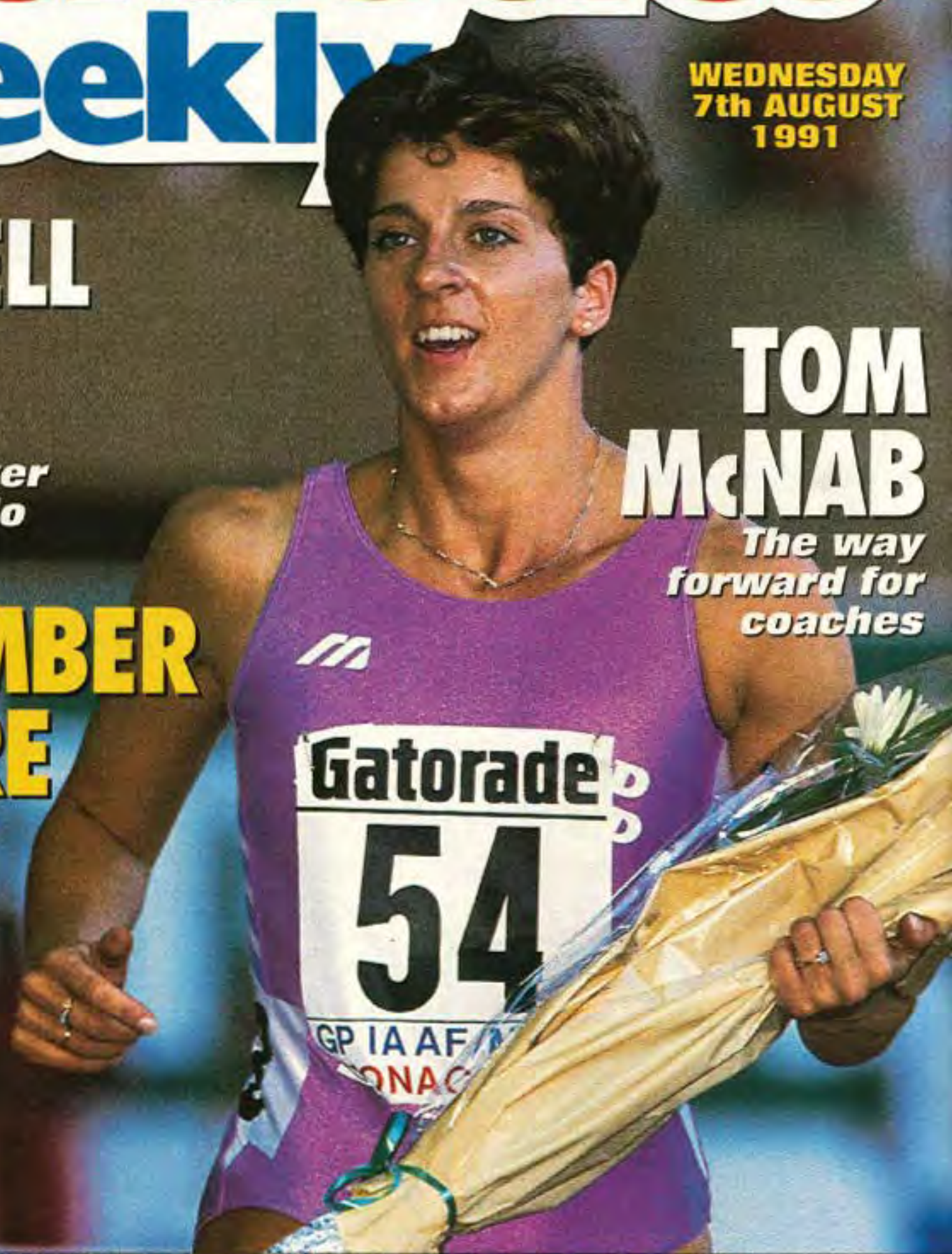

Johnson or second man Frankie Fredericks but had every right to be pleased with his run.

The 400 metres saw Black given a poor lane draw outside Danny Everett and he lost the race on the last bend as the Olympic bronze medallist glided by with American team mate Andrew Valmon. Significantly, Black was again below 45sec.

Akabusi couldn't have faced a stiffer test, against Commonwealth record-holder Samuel Matete and Danny Harris. The Zambian repeated last year's Grand Prix victory over Harris, leading almost all of the way to win in 47.87 - only 0.07sec slower than his altitude mark in Sestriere three days earlier.

Akabusi probably went off too quickly, but still equalled his best of the season.

Natalya Artyomova dominated another massive 1,500 metres field, Chris Cahill winding up eighth, with European champion Snezana Pajkic 17th.

The women's high jump saw Heike Henkel move to joint third on the world all-time list. Her winning leap of 2.04 metres erased the name of Germany's Ulrike Meyfarth, twice Olympic high jump champion, from the record book.

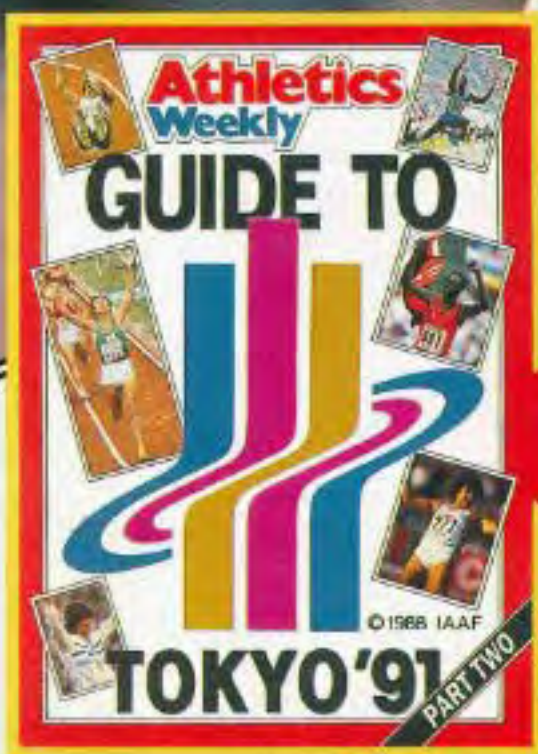

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DAY ONE

Men 20km walk

THE opening event of the championships was marred by the disorganised finish, the two leaders, Maurizio Damilano and Mikhail Shchennikov, tripping over the sprinters preparing for heat 10 of the 100 metres, as they entered the stadium.

Damilano, defending his title, was always among the leading group, following the early pace-makers, Pavol Blazek, holder of the world best for 20km on the road, and Roman Mrzsek.

At 12km, Shchennikov showed at the front for the first time. The Soviet's injection of pace quickly reduced the contenders to six, the three Italians, Damilano, Walter Arena and Giovanni De Benedictis, being accompanied by last year's European silver medallist Daniel Plaza and Misyula.

Three kilometres further along the course, Shchennikov, Damilano and Plaza had opened up a six-second gap on Benedictis, who led Arena and Misyula by 50 metres.

Shchennikov, still only 23, has already enjoyed a brilliant career, and looked the freshest of the trio as Plaza fell off the pace just before the 16km mark.

Damilano, 10 years senior to his opponent, was stretching the pace, but it seemed to be hurting him. The pain seemed worth it as he got away just after the watering point at 17km.

But within 400 metres, the Soviet was back on his shoulder, the race looking over as he opened a sizeable gap. But the title-holder called upon his experience and with a kilometre remaining he again got ahead.

Approaching the stadium, neither was aware of the chaos that awaited them. With the 100 metres heats in full swing, officials had clearly forgotten about the walkers and Damilano had to jump over starting blocks and athletes as he entered the arena with an eight-metre lead.

Having been caught unawares, more drama unfolded. No one had bothered to place the route bollards in lane four to ensure the competitors completed a full 20km course. Instead of walking the last 500 metres in lane five, the leader, through no fault of his own, headed for the inside lane.

A massive final effort saw Shchennikov accelerate past the Italian and, passing the finishing line, he threw up his hands in victory. There was no doubt he thought he had finished, only realising his error, when Damilano carried on around the track.

Shchennikov's effort may have cost him victory, as a 20-metre gap opened ahead of him. Damilano, coming home waving to the crowd in a championship record time of 1:19:37, albeit having walked a little shorter than he should have.

Women 10km walk

THE reigning gold and silver medallists, Irina Strakhova and Kerry Saxby, were forecast to repeat their Rome duel. However, it was the 4ft 11in of Italian Anna Rita Sidoti who led the 42-strong field out of the stadium.

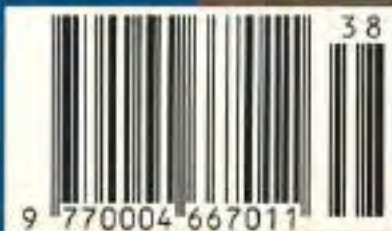

given both 400 metres hurdlers 59 overall points each. The \$10,000 prize money would then have gone to whoever had ran fastest in this year's series.

Gunnell's best of 53.61 was when beating her British record for the second time in five days in Zurich, while the American ran 53.54 in Nice.

As it was, Gunnell, surprisingly given lane six, gave it all she had but finished a weary fourth behind three Americans, Farmer-Patrick's tutu skirt showing well clear of everyone around the one-lap circuit.

Gunnell, who once again will restrict her indoors season to concentrate on the Olympic Games, won the \$8,000 second-placed overall prize.

She said: "It's been a good year for me. Hard training, mastering a new technique and being at the right age have all played their part. I'll follow a similar schedule this winter as I did last year."

Lorraine Baker was given the task of towing Natalya Artyomova, who might have won the Tokyo 1,500 metres but was not selected after missing the Soviet trials, to a mile world record.

The first lap of 61.87sec spread-eagled the field except for Mary Slaney, but by the half-way mark (2:07.74) she was also out of contention.

Artyomova was off on her own with a lap-and-a-half to go. At the bell (3:14.25), she needed a last lap of 60.35 to beat Paula Ivan's two-year old record. The 28-year-old gave everything she had to regain the title - she held it for five years up to July 1989 with 4:15.8 - but could not summon the last kick needed and finished nearly a second-and-a-half short of the record.

In the men's 1,500 metres, world champion Noureddine Morceli was his dominant self, winning from world record-holder Said Aouita, with European champion Jens-Peter Herold third.

Steve Cram ran 53.5sec for the last 400 but even that wasn't good enough to oust Matthew Yates from fourth. The Commonwealth 800 metres bronze medallist ran a spirited last 300, closing on the first two.

Judy Oakes, sixth on the night and overall, won herself \$3,000, the shot winner Zhihong Huang becoming the first Asian to win a Grand Prix event.

David Nelson finished fifth in the high hurdles, while Tom Hanlon, after a sound start, drifted to 10th in the steeplechase. World champion Moses Kiptanui was surprisingly beaten by Morocco's Abdelaziz Sahere, only sixth in Tokyo.

Sergey Bubka was a clear overall winner of the Grand Prix series, six points ahead of javelin winner Jan Zelezny, Michael Johnson and Noureddine Morceli.

The Soviet nearly got it wrong, however. Clearing first time at 5.70 metres, he passed until 5.85, only clearing with his last attempt.

The women's standings were much closer, high-jumper Heike Henkel, 100 metres victor Merlene Ottey, Artyomova and Farmer-Patrick all having 63 points.

Henkel, in her 35th competition

of the year, leapt 2.02 metres, sealing the \$25,000 winner's crown. Ottey who had to run 10.86sec to beat her, missed out by the narrowest of margins, while Artyomova was only 0.90sec away from the top prize.
