

ANOTHER HONOUR FOR SEBASTIAN COE

SEB COE'S momentous 1981 season may have passed into history but the honours continue to roll in. Our American colleagues, *Track & Field News*, have voted him world athlete of the year, singled out his 1:41.73 800m as performance of the year and ranked him first in both that event and the 1500m/mile. Steve Ovett is ranked second in the latter, and the compilers note: "Coe was nonpareil in quality: his two mile efforts each produced world records, while his lone 1500 effort was very close to the global best. Ovett was superlative in both quality and quantity, yet 'lost' the Battle of the Mile to his arch rival, who had the last word (for 1981 at least) with his 3:47.33. Moreover, Ovett was beaten on two occasions. All this suffices to tip the scales in Coe's favour — even if just barely".

Although he won more 'big' 100m races than 200's, Allan Wells is rated first in the 200m. "A tight four-way battle for the top spot was waged among Wells, Lattany, Sanford and Evans", reads the commentary. "Lattany was the best on the watch, Sanford had the best win-loss record and Evans led in honours-won. Wells, however, was second-best in all three categories and that, in the final analysis, was enough to rank him first. He lost four times but was never worse than 2nd and scored two big wins (ISTAF and Van Damme) over strong American-dominated fields". Despite his European and World Cup successes, Wells is placed third in the 100 rankings behind Carl Lewis and Mel Lattany. "More exposure to the Americans would have given him a chance for a higher spot". Geoff Smith is rated second to Werner Schildhauer in the 10,000 on the basis of being the only man to beat the East German in 1981 and as runner-up (by 1/100th of a second) in the IAAF Golden 10,000... although the winner of that race, Mike McLeod, is not included in the top ten.

Other British athletes ranked are Dave Moorcroft (5th 5000), Garry Cook (6th 800), Roy Mitchell (6th LJ), Keith Connor (7th TJ), Steve Cram (9th 1500), Barry Smith (9th 5000) and Julian Goater (10th 5000).

Ben Plucknett is awarded top place in the discus. TFN explains: "Why is a 'convicted doper' sitting atop our rankings? Simple. Our compilers, *knowing* (in some cases on a first-hand basis) that at least some previous winners were taking steroids, would be hypocritical if they denied such a position to Plucknett, who simply had the finest set of marks the event has ever seen". Others might beg to differ!

More bizarre still is the omission from the women's marathon rankings of Joyce Smith, whose one run at the distance in 1981 — the

London — produced a victory and UK record of 2:29:57 (ranking her 4th on time in the world). I cannot see how she can be considered any lower than fourth — behind Allison Roe, Lorraine Moller and Patti Catalano — and can only assume, being charitable, that Joyce's absence from the list was a simple error.

Hugh Jones in great form

ANYONE hoping to beat Hugh Jones in the London Marathon will need wings, predict athletic experts in Hungary who have watched his recent successes.

The first came in The Hague on March 27th, six days after he had come 11th in the World Cross-Country Championships, when it appeared that his winning time in the City-Pier-City half marathon of 61.06 would be a new world best for the distance. But it was later discovered that the course was 400-500m short (though the same as that run in 1980 when the previous course record of 63:46 was set by Oyvind Dahl of Norway).

The route was flat, with a lot of bends and obstacles (mostly human, also dogs and bikes), and the weather was warm. Jones had flown from Budapest to meet the rest of the four-man British team, but Nick Brawn was still affected by the flu that had knocked him out of the Golden Marathon, and Dave Cannon was not up to it after his 30km run in Japan three weeks earlier. John Graham (after seven cokes the previous evening!) stuck with Jones for 2km until both had to take evasive action from a large dog. A little later Cor Vriend was dropped and Jones was on his own... but, "I was leading", recalls Hugh, "but suddenly the Dutchman who I'd got away from cut the corner and I found him on my shoulder again. I wasted a lot of energy shouting during the race at short-circuiting runners, old women with dogs, and obstructing pressmen".

Passing through 5km in a time given as 14:25, Jones raced further and further away despite feeling stiff from quite early on. After heading out to Scheveningen Pier he turned along the promenade (10km came up in 29:20) and said he was not particularly tired at the finish. "The main difficulty came the following day when I went down with a heavy cold".

His training was reduced to a mixture of coughs, splutters and bed, and the whole of the week following the Dutch race he was mainly on a diet of lemon and honey. However, on the Friday (April 2nd) he travelled to the Hungarian-Czechoslovak border intending to watch the 9.4km race from Komárom, across the Danube to Komárno in Czechoslovakia for the unique liberation race celebrating the freedom of the two countries from the Nazis by the Russians in 1945.

He had run 38km in the previous 24 hours, including 13km that morning, so a race was hardly planned... but he ran, and won, with an incredible sprint over the final 600m, thus becoming the first Briton to win the race.

"I didn't know I was going to run until three hours before the race, and I hadn't even come with the right visa, but that was arranged at the last minute. It was hard all the way and I was always expecting to be overtaken".

Hugh Jones is now training hard under the guidance of Hungarian marathon coach József Babinyecz, and his ambitions are to win the London Marathon and then the European title.

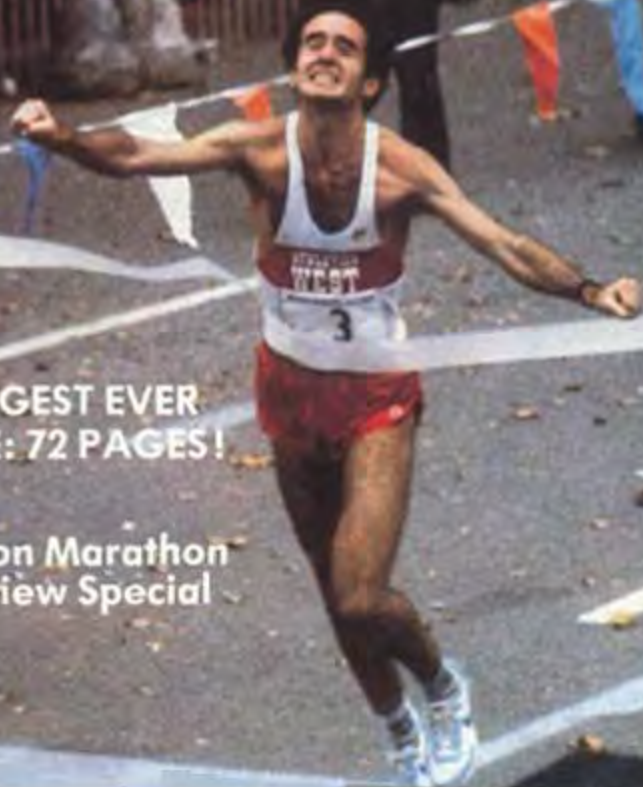

USA: Bob Roggy over 93m

Bob Roggy broke one of the oldest American records at the Jenner Invitation at San Jose on April 17th. He threw the javelin 93.72m to break Mark Murro's record of 91.44 set in 1970. There were only about 125 people in the stands when he had his record throw. The event was started late and nearly all of the crowd of 7500 had already left the stadium. His series was 79.82, 79.60, 90.92, 93.72, 91.34, foul. The throw was the longest ever made from a grass runway. Roggy is 25, 1.88/6'2" tall and weighs 110kg/242lb. "I didn't feel any strain on the throw. I have been consistent with throws at about 90m, but that doesn't matter unless you pop the big one. The conditions were good, but not ideal, as there was a slight crosswind. The only thing I'm doing different, as far as technique goes, is that I am trying to get more rotation into my throws", were Roggy's comments. This field has never been surveyed and the record won't be recognised until one has been made.

Earl Bell won the pole vault at 5.50m when Billy Olson failed to clear a height. Carl Lewis won the 100m in 10.13, the fastest time in the world this year. He then ran a dead-heat with Jeff Phillips in 20.27 for the 200. Lewis seldom runs the 200 and this was a lifetime best for him. He thinks that he will be able to run under 10 seconds for the 100 this year and that he can be consistently over 8.50m in the long jump. At the Kansas Relays in Lawrence, James Butler returned to form after a year of relatively poor runs. He ran 20.18 for the fastest time in the world this year for 200. Butler won the US "Olympic Trials" in Eugene in 1980, but had a disappointing year in 1981 due to injuries.

STAGGERING NEW WORLD HAMMER RECORD

THAT human spinning top, Sergey Litvinov, has regained the world hammer record from Soviet compatriot Yuriy Sedykh. Competing in Moscow on June 4th the 24-year-old Olympic silver medalist reached the staggering distance of

83.98m to add over two metres to the previous record! Litvinov, who uses four lightning-fast turns, is only 1.80/5'11" tall and 97kg/213lb. The gain of 2.18m over the previous record is the biggest single jump in world record evolution since 1965 when Hungary's Gyula Zsivoczky added 2.48m to Hal Connolly's previous mark of 71.26.

The mark didn't last long, though, for Sue Cook of Australia was credited with 22:32.4 en route to another world record of 46:42.6 for 10,000m in Melbourne on May 24th.

Detlef Michel threw the javelin 94.52m in Berlin on May 9th for not only a GDR record but the longest ever throw by a non-Hungarian! Only Ferenc Paragi (96.72 and 96.20) and Miklos Nemeth (94.58) have ever surpassed that distance. Her fans all over the world will be delighted to hear that Sara Simeoni is back in action and jumped 1.95m at Formia on May 20th.



FRANCE: No record for Coe

Although labelled as an attempt on John Walker's formidable world record of 4:51.4, the 2000m race set up by Michel Jazy in Bordeaux on June 5th fell far short. Five laps of a shade inside 58.3 were required, but the pace proved very uneven. A hare covered the first 200 in a too-fast 26.5 and 400 was reached in 56.2 (29.7 second 200) by Carlos Cabral, a Portuguese 1:47 800 runner. Seb Coe followed in 57.8. Cabral passed 800 in 1:55.9 and 1000 in 2:25.3, but Coe remained nearly a dozen metres behind in 1:57.4 and 2:26.8. The Briton, racing the distance for the first time, closed to 5m at 1200 (2:56.2 to 2:55.6) and shortly afterwards, with almost two laps to cover, was on his own. He would have needed to run that last 800 in 1:55 to succeed; instead he took over 2:02, settling for victory alone. "It was a pretty average time", said Coe, "but I came here for a good week's training and I'm not disappointed". A leg injury has prevented him from racing since.

GDR win summit match

Ion Hodge reporting

BOTH the GDR and the USSR fielded strong teams for their annual encounter on June 25th/26th. The decision to stage the meet at Cottbus was surprising as the stadium could only accommodate 15,000 and it was only half-full on both days. However fine weather and good competition helped produce seven world leading marks, not including relays.

Nikolay Selivanov ambitiously had the pole vault bar raised to a world record 5.82m after a comfortable 5.60 clearance but he could not emulate his Soviet colleague Vladimir Polyakov, who set the current world record of 5.81 in last year's encounter. In the shot, Udo Beyer reached a season's best of 21.08m in round 3 and then launched one out to 21.73 two rounds later, placing him well clear of the rest of the world and he seems set for his best year since 1978. The

hammer brought together the first confrontation during 1982 of double Olympic champion Yuriy Sedykh and the man who recently deposed him as world record holder, Sergey Litvinov. The result, although close in terms of distance, was never in doubt. Sedykh took the lead in round 3 with 79.22m, and followed this with 79.60, 79.12 and 79.40. In contrast Litvinov finished with four

fouls and as at the Olympics his all-out effort for one massive throw led to a deterioration in technique. Heino Puuste, 4th in Moscow, created an upset in the javelin by defeating both Detlef Michel and Dainis Kula with a last round personal best of 90.72m. Michel, whose two valid throws surpassed 89m, was unlucky to overstep the runway in the 4th round — the spear sailing out to something like 93m.

In the women's match the 100m brought together the Olympic winner and runner-up for their first race since Moscow. Lyudmila Kondratyeva had been injured for much of the intervening period, and is obviously still not the force she was as Marlies Göhr proved an easy winner. Barbel Wöckel, 2nd in the 100, came back with a comfortable win in the 200, easing up before the finish. The girl Barbel has already beaten over one lap in 1982, Marita Koch, showed she has recovered from her injuries of last year by sweeping to a 49.49 clocking. Passing 300 in 36.1 she recorded a time only herself. Jarmila Kratochvilova and Irena Szewinska have ever bettered.

The points scores saw the USSR win the men's match 113-99 and the GDR the women's 91-65, the East Germans therefore taking the combined event 190-178.

LJ: Szalma, 4th in the Olympics, has the credentials to succeed in an event which has no clear-cut favourite, but although (at time of writing) he has jumped only 8.00m this year for 17th place on the list of contenders the man everyone will be fearing is Olympic champ Dombrowski. SG — Abayassov, Szalma,

Dombrowski; RH — Dombrowski, Szalma, Stekic; MW — Dombrowski, Szalma, Belskiy.

TJ: Connor, the finest athlete in Britain in Daley Thompson's opinion, is poised to add the European title to the European record he set earlier and thus clinch world's no. 1 ranking — but he'll need to be at his brilliant best to withstand a strong Soviet challenge, while Bakosi (beaten by Connor the other week) remains a threat. SP: This title has remained in East German hands since 1969 and with Beyer present to defend there seems little prospect of it going elsewhere. DT: World record holder Wolfgang Schmidt will not be defending; the word is that his international athletics career is over as the GDR authorities consider him a political risk because of his pro-Western attitudes. HT: It will be considered a major upset if the USSR do not provide all three medalists... after all they had to leave an 80m thrower at home! There were no real surprises as far as the gold was concerned as Frank Emmelmann hit peak form when it really mattered. But there was disappointment for Cameron Sharp and the entire British squad as, in with a definite medal chance following his 10.22 in Brussels last month and a very comfortable 10.28 heat win, he was edged out by the narrowest of margins for bronze by Marian Woronin, who produced an excellent dip just on the line.

In lane one Emmelmann began to show almost from the gun but there wasn't much to choose from between him, Woronin and Sharp, and these three looked almost certain medal winners by 60m... until, that is, the Italian Junior Pier-Francesco Pavoni produced an amazing Mennea-like burst to scream through over the final 40m and overhaul Woronin and Sharp who had been running so close throughout. There was no way Pavoni was going to reach Emmelmann, though,

as the East German showed no signs of slowing and maintained his form with an excellent lean on the line which took him to a time only 2/100ths slower than his best, set last year.

The decision for the bronze was so close that the British team considered an official protest over the result but this never materialised. A poor start in the heat, after a 'flyer' by Burkart of Switzerland, cost Jim Evans a place in the semi.

British interest evaporated in the heat of the qualifying competition as Richard Slaney's only valid throw was a mere 55.98m. Richard has all the physical attributes of the top Eastern men and one hopes that John Powell, who is coming to Britain shortly for a six month coaching stint, may be able to offer the necessary advice.

HAMMER

Of all sportsmen, Ian Botham has proved in recent years that when your back's against the wall he's the man to bail you out, but when it comes to self-survival there can't be many better competitors than Yuriy Sedykh.

He entered the arena in Moscow as number two to Sergey Litvinov yet blasted out 81.80m with the very first throw of the competition to lift the gold medal and set a new world mark; and he wasn't far short of a similar achievement in Athens. On June 24th he had seen Litvinov regain the record with a magnificent throw of 83.98m, and just a week before the qualifying competition in these Games, in Athens, current Soviet champion Igor Nikulin unleashed an 83.54 to overtake Sedykh on the world all-time list.

Sedykh, however, had exactly the right answer. The Soviet throwing order put Litvinov first, and he set the show on the road with 76.88. Three throws later, Sedykh entered the circle and embarked on one of the most impressive series of hammer marks of all time, starting with an 81.66! Nikulin opened with a 79.44, but the psychological damage had already been done, and Sedykh was on his way to another major title.

Litvinov improved in the third round to 78.66 whilst Nikulin, try as he did, never bettered that opener, and it was left to Sedykh to demonstrate the art. His complete series was 81.66, 80.48, 80.96, 79.36(!), 81.62 and 80.94 — a mere 64cm short of an 80m-plus series. Wow!

Martin Givran put in solid efforts of 70.42, 70.62 and 70.10 in the qualifying round, but that placed him only 15th and he missed the final. Martin's consistency suggests that when he does

get involved in a major final he could well get close to that elusive 75m.

JAVELIN

In last year's European Junior Championships, Uwe Hohn (born 16.7.62) launched the javelin out to 86.56m in the first round to set a European Junior record and destroy the opposition. An improvement to 89.86 this summer ranked him fifth in Europe prior to Athens, although entering the final he was in bronze position as the two Finns ahead of him — Jorma Markus (absent) and Pentti Siimesaari (failed to qualify) — were missing; but a gold medal was nevertheless a long way off.

And it looked even more remote when Soviet spearman, Heino Puuste, threw 89.56 as an opener. Of the men 'most likely to', Olympic champion, Dainis Kula moved into second place with his second effort of 87.84 before Puuste fouled and Hohn took third with 87.58. Thus it stayed till the fifth round, with Detlef Michel, 1982 world leader and longest ever 'cack', unable to get it together though throwing an advantageous last.

Suffice to say that Hohn's fifth throw reached

Gohr & Koch Star In Tokyo

European champions and world record breakers Marlies Gohr and Marita Koch were responsible for two of the finest performances at the Eight Nation Games in Tokyo on September 24th. Gohr defeated Angella Taylor in the 100 in 10.97 and Koch had nearly 20m to spare over Gaby Buxmann in a 49.58 400, but the GDR's other great sprint star Barbel Wöckel suffered a rare defeat in the 200, by Taylor. On the men's side no fewer than five of East Germany's newly crowned European champions — Frank Emmelmann, Olaf Prenzler, Thomas Munkelt, Udo Beyer and Uwe Hohn — were beaten although the GDR still won the men's match narrowly ahead of the USSR. The USA fielded a woefully weak team, Carl Lewis (100) providing the Americans' only victory.
