

IAAF MOBIL GRAND PRIX NEW YORK GAMES **20TH JULY**

THE New York Games may have fulfilled the criteria for its newly acquired Mobil/IAAF Grand Prix status, but it barely assembled a roster of competitors to elevate it beyond the realms of a hefty domestic meeting, Jim O'Brien reports.

In none of the designated Grand prix events did the number of foreign competitors exceed three and in three (the men's 200, 110H and long jump) there were no overseas competitors at all.

New York's predicament lies in attracting a star quality field to the USA for one sole meeting at a point during the Euorpean season when most athletes are taking a break, and this year, gathering themselves for a good showing at the World Championships. Next year the situation could be alleviated somewhat as, in addition to the New York Games, a major meeting has been scheduled in Indianapolis close to the same date. Atlanta, host to the 1996 Olympics, may organise an athletics event around that time.

Still, there were some outstanding performances on the Wein Stadium track, despite temperatures that hovered at or around 100 degrees. World record holder, Leroy Burrell withdrew from the 100m, leaving his Santa Monica mentor and training partner, Carl Lewis, to dominate a largely domestic, but still world class field.

Uncharacteristically quick out of the blocks, Lewis still had to fight hard to draw alongside Mark Witherspoon, but then surged away in the closing 20m to score an exceptional 10.02sec victory, leaving Mike Marsh to overtake Witherspoon for second position,

"Today I felt like me again, commented Lewis. "My start was good. I've been focussing on the long jump and the rest of the time on starting. I wasn't out front, but right in there with the pack. I didn't expect t run that fast today, so I'm pleased. When I start well I can run with anyone and that's what I did today."

Lewis later revealed that he is unlikely to contest the long jump at next summer's Olympic Games, preferring instead to concentrate on the 100m and

Mary Slaney's comeback hit a bump in the road when she was swallowed by a voluminous pack in the home straight of the 800 metres after having set the pace from the gun.

"If I don't run under 2:00 I will be very disappointed.* Slaney had commented 24 hours earlier.

An opening 200 metres split of 28 seconds indicated that sub-2:00 was on the cards, and as she cruised through 400 metres in 59.14 and 600 metres in 1:29 it almost seemed as if she would get her wish in this, her first competitive 800 metres since 1985. Maria Mutola, a high school phenomenon from Mozambique, barely remembers Slaney at her intimidating best in the mid-1980s. As the home straight unwound, therefore, the powerful Mutola led a charge of four athletes who powered

past Slaney, Mutola reaching the finish line first in 2:00.22, ahead of Meredith Rainey (2:00.51) and Celeste Halliday (2:00.53). Slaney placed fifth in 2:01.28

Although the men's 110H was a completely American affair, that also meant that it boasted one of the deepest fields to be assembled anywhere. Both Greg Foster and Renaldo Nehmiah were on the starting line and, as evidenced by their pre-race comments, felt they had something to

"When a person has to run almost their personal best to beat you, that makes you feel pretty good." said Foster of his defeat by Colin Jackson in Rome three days prior to this meeting, "If I had been in the lane next to him, you would have seen a different outcome.

Nehemiah was similarly pointed. "The Brits are a force to be reckoned with right now, but I feel that the real hurdlers have always been here in the US.

Tony Dees undoubtedly concurs, as he relegated both Foster and Nehemiah to a battle for second place. Following no fewer than three false starts, Dees, who failed to make the US team for the World Championships, blasted out of the blocks, glided over each hurdle and swept untroubled through the finishing line in 13.18. Foster, enjoying one of his best seasons in some years, barely held on for second in 13.26, 0.03 up on Nehemiah.

Other outstanding performances were Danny Harris' 49.45 win in the 400H, Jim Spivey's 3:52.74 mile victory, Danny Everett's fast closing 20.13 clocking in the 200, and Gwen Torrance's 11.00 victory over Nigeria's Mary Onyali in the women's 100 metres. Most frustrated athlete of the day may have been Jill Hunter who after a very fast first mile in the women's 3,000 metres (4:49, three seconds up on the pack), she was reeled in with one lap to go, ultimately placing fourth (9:00.05) as Margareta Keszeg from Romania outkicked PattiSue Plumer, 8:54.90 to 8:55.9

GOLD COAST MARATHON BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA 21ST JULY

OLYMPIC marathon silver medallist Lisa Ondieki's medal hopes at next month's World Championships in Tokyo nose dived when she could only manage eighth place in the Gold Coast halfmarathon, Nick Bideau reports.

Ondieki has just resumed running, after three weeks out of action with a hip Injury.

Her time of 1:14:15 is well outside her best of 1:09:45 and it is even slower than she would expect to run the first half of a marathon.

Last month Ondieki returned to racing after the birth of her daughter Emma with a superb victory in the national 15km road championship in Sydney in a personal best of 50:06.

Before her hip injury, Ondieki had been in good form in training in Canberra and there is feeling at the Australian Institute of Sport that she may have overdone it. Unless Ondieki can pick up form quickly she could be in doubt to toe the line in Tokyo.

Her last race before going to Tokyo will be the 14km Sydney City to Surf on August 11th. While Ondieki's performance was below her best Gold Coast resident Jenny Lund ran a big race to be the first Australian in fifth place in 1:13.51 only days after returning from a European track racing tour.

Japanese runners dominated the race taking the first four places with Kaori Kumura winning in 1:11.12.

The men's half-marathon was won by Commonwealth 5,000 metres champion Andrew Lloyd who like Lund has also just returned from racing on the track in Europe. Lloyd used his familiar sit and kick tactics to blast past Victorian Mal Norwood in the final 100 metres to win by three seconds in 1:03.06.

Former national junior 1,500 metres champion Sean Quilty completed his progression to marathon running when he won the national marathon title on the Gold Coast.

Quilty, 24, from Doncaster was fourth across the line behind two Japanese runners and a Russian runner in a personal best time of 2:14.59 in the Gold Coast International marathon to collect his first national title.

Shinji Kawashima took the honours in 2:14.01 after breaking away from the lead pack at 36km.

New South Wales John Andrews took the silver medal in eigth place in 2:16:28 with Mery Johnstone taking the bronze in tenth place in 2:17.14. The women's Australian champion was Jackle Hallam (NSW), 21, was a surprise winner of the women's title in 2:36.21 also a personal best.

Nine seconds benind Hallem was Wostern Australia's Karen Gobby with Soviet runner Zola Gaviluk third in

2:43.04:

Hallam, the current Australian agathon champion and former Australian junior triathion champion even surprised herslet by winning the race in only her second marathon.

IAAF/MOBIL GRAND NIKAIA-MOBIL MEETING NICE, FRANCE 15TH JULY

LIZ MCCOLGAN gave a clear warning that she is on course for the 10,000 metres gold medal at the World Championships in Tokyo hext month when she ran the fastest 3,000 metres in the world this year, Dave Martin reports.

Her time of 8:38.23 beat her PB, set on the same track almost four years ago to the day, by ever one-and-a-half seconds.

The Commonwealth 10,000 metres champion has, of course, run 8:34.80 Indoors when finishing second at the 1989 World Indoor Championships.

Three weeks after moving to second on the 10,000 metres sli-time list, the 27 year-old admitted: "I felt awful for the first three laps," in the stifling Cole D'Azur heat, 1km being passed by the pagemaker, Gina Prociecto, in 2:52.12.

The Scot got her act together with just over three laps to run, leading through 2km in 5:49.78 ahead of PattiSue Plumer, who faded badly, and Susan Simmir.

It was the Kenyan who proved to be the biggest danger, but a kick at the beil saw McColgan open up a sizeable gap which increased to 15 metres at the finish. Sirma was rewarded with a Kenyan record - just failing to break 8:40 while Albertina Dias, in third place, broke the Portuguese record.

Despite the victory, McColgan was disappointed with her performance. She said: "I expected to run closer to 8:30. I have been doing a lot of atrength training, but even so, I believe I should have ran faster. Really, there were too many people in field."

Asked about her Tokyo hopes, she answored: "I would have liked to have attempted a 3km/10km double, but the timetable doesn't fit, although I holieve I could win both events. I feer no one.

Despite his defeat over 400 metres by Roberto Hernandez, one suspects Roger Black also has the same frame of mind as McColgay. On the night the ilmulde European champion souldn't match the finishing speed of the Cubin, who was second ranked in the world just year.

But Black, who slipped when leaving his blacks, has raced and beaten all of the top contenders for the Tollyo little, except Michael Johnson, who will compete over 200 metres only in Japan.

Although he beat Hernandez in Granges he is now lawrene down, having just in Seville and Nice. A sporting Black said: "Hernandez has definitely got to be favourite next month, But, it should be a fantastic race for the medals,"

There were several 1991 world bests achieved but, more significantly, were the performances from Algerian athletes.

Noureddine Morcell moved up to

3,000 metres and a 1:56.7 last 800 metres destroyed an outstanding field. His performance, where he left Brohim Boutalb and Khalid Skah floundering with a 26.0sec final 200 metres, was the best seen this summer and a national record.

Jack Buckner continued his comeback, Antaning 10th.

Assieding Brahmi followed his countryman's example, becoming their fastest steeplechaser, although Dympic champion Julius Kanuki looked favourite until he fall at the last barrier.

In the 1,500 metres, world record holder Salid Acolty held on to win from Pat Scammell, A late run brought Matthew Yates through to third spot - two places sheed of Tony Morrell.

Five worsen bigher has minutes in the 800 metres, the 1969 World Cup winner Ann Quirot notting a 1991 world lending mark of L:5T.34,

The 1,000 metres was a last lap purup, Netelye Artyomeye triumphing from Hassiba Boulmerka, who aid an Algerian record to add to her mile achievements. in Rhoims and Oalo, Chris Canill finished. Meyenth.

In the first trace event of the evening Sandra Farmer-Patrick periame the fitst to run under 54sec for the 400m hurdles. this year. Maria Perec consolidated her European Cup final form, running under 50sec is her home country for the first time.

Probably the most popular victory for the sentimentalists in the crowd went to the high jump world record-holder Status Kostadinova, who wen with a map of 1.95 metres, Times, financially and injury-wise, have been difficult for the Bulgarian over the last two years. One sincerely hopes her luck will now have changed for the better.

DAY ONE

Men 20km walk

THE opening event of the thampionships was marred by the disorganised finish, the two leaders. Maurizic Damilano and Mikhail Shchemikov, tripping over the sprinters preparing for heat 10 of the 100 metres, as they entered the stadium.

Damilano, defending his title, was always among the leading group, following the early pacemakers, Pavol Blazek, holder of the world best for 20km on the road, and Roman Mrazek.

At 12km, Shchennikov showed at the front for the first time. The Soviet's injection of pace quickly reduced the contenders to six, the three Italians, Damilano, Walter Arena and Giovanni De Benedictis, being accompanied by last year's European silver medallist Daniel Plaza and Misyula.

Three kilometres further along the course, Shchermikov, Damilano and Plaza had opened up a six second gap on Benedicus, who led Arena and Misyula by 50 metres.

Shchennikov, still only 23, has already enjoyed a brilliant career, and looked the freshest of the trio as Plaza fell aff the pace just before the 16km mark.

Damilano, 10 years senior to his opponent, was stretching the pace, but it seemed to be hurting him. The pain seemed worth it as he got away just after the watering point at 17km.

But within 400 metres, the Soviet was back on his shoulder, the race looking over as he opened a sizeable gap. But the title-holder called upon his experience and with a kilometre remaining he again got ahead.

Approaching the stadium, neither was aware of the chaos that awaited them. With the 100 metres heats in full swing, officials had clearly forgotten about the walkers and Damilano had to jump over starting blocks and athletes as he entered the arena with an eight metre lead.

Having been caught unawares, more drama unfolded. No one had bothered to place the route bollards in lane four to ensure the competitors completed a full 20km course. Instead of walking the last 500 metres in lane five, the leader, through no fault of his own, headed for the inside lane.

A massive final effort saw Shehennikov accelerate past the Italian and, passing the finishing line, he threw up his hands in victory. There was no doubt he thought he had finished, only realising his error, when Damilano carried on around the track.

Shehennikov's effort may have cost him victory, as a 20-metre gap opened shead of him. Damilano, coming home waving to the crowd in a championship record time of 1.19:37, albeit having walked a little shorter than he should have.

THE reigning gold and silver medallists, Irina Strakhova and Kerry Saxby, were forecast to repeat their Rome duel. However, it was the 4ft 11tn of Italian Anna-Rita Sidoti who led the 42-strong field out of the stadium.

At 5km (22:05), Madelein Svensson made a positive move to the front. Within a kilometre she had reduced the contenders to eight, looking strong and confident.

The opposite was the case with Saxby and Strakhova. Both seemed to be toiling and fell rapidly backwards as Ivanova, Svensson and Chen pulled clear.

It was the Soviet's turn to windup the pace and a short burst established a 100-metre lead by 8km. In the space of a kilometre, she had made the gold bers - barring accident or disqualification

Ivanova came into the arena 50 metres ahead of Svennson, who was having to dig deep to keep ahead of Essayeh. Strakhova was having a second wind and rapidly gaining on the Pinn. The silver and bronze medals were decided in the last 50 metres.

Heinz Webs (78.02m) got ahead of Sedykh's comrades, Andrey Abduvaliyev and European champion, Igor Astapkovich.

In round (wo, Sedykh added \$2cm to his best. Astapkovich, who leads the world this year with 84.26m, improved to 79.66m, pushing the German into third spot.

Abduvaliyev, winner of the 1985 European Junior title, moved into third spot in the next round, the remarkable Sedykh, now 36, having once again thrown over 80m.

WINSCHOTTEN 100KM HOLLAND 7TH SEPTEMBER

THE IAU World Cup under the patronage of the IAAF takes place in Palamos (Spain) on 16th February and with many athletes hoping to gain selection for their national teams it was inevitable that there would be some outstanding performances in this event, Malcolm Campbell reports.

Konstantin Santalov, a 2:14 marethon runner, moved to the top of the all time world ranking list for 100km with 6:26:20, passing the halfway point in 3:05:20. At this point in the race, he was locked in battle with the Belgian, Jean Paul Praet.

The pair gradually drew away from the rest of the field but the outcome was not decided until the last 5km. During the last year. the Soviet Union have amerged as a major force on international ultradistance running and the national men's team, on present form, will be hard to beat.

The same may well be said of the British women's national team and with a number of runners gaining experience of international competition, they have a real chance of winning in Palamos, in Winscholen, Sylvia Watson won with 8:24:05, followed by Hillary Johnson in 8:50:53. After the event, Tony Jones remarked that much had been gained from the race and he was hopeful of further improvement.

The first British runner home was Stephen Moore in sixth position with 7:03:54, followed by Eric Seedhouse. the British 100km N 7:17:06. It seems likely that both runners will have done enough to satisfy the selectors, and probably other British ethletes will be in action in Santander (Spain) next month.


