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Locality Act (2011 - 2021) | Regulations (2012)
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- [Established for] the express purpose of promoting or improving the social, economic and environmental wellbeing of an area that consists of or includes the **neighbourhood area** concerned
- A purpose that reflects the **character of the area** in general terms
- Membership open to people living and working in the area, and elected members for the area (reasonable steps must be taken to secure at least one of each)
- A minimum of 21 members from above groups, maximum effort to recruit business leaders
- Membership drawn from different **places** in the area and different **sections** of the community.
- The FORUM will NOT be a company regulated by company legislation

Locality Act (2011 - 2021) Incorporation

A community interest company (CIC). A CIC is a legal form which was set up primarily for social enterprises – i.e. organisations trading for social benefit. A key advantage of a CIC is that it reassures funders and stakeholders that the asset lock and community purpose are regulated. Regulated By Companies House. (CIC 36 Objects)

Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) A CIO is an incorporated structure regulated by the Charity Commission. The Charity Commission publishes model documents and the objects of your organisation must be charitable. To register as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, you must have an income of £10,000 or a business plan showing that you expect to achieve an income of £10,000.

Community Benefit Society (CBS) If you are considering a community share issue (for example to purchase or renovate a local building) then a Community Benefit Society is likely to be most appropriate. Community benefit societies are regulated by the **Financial Conduct Authority**.


Neighbourhood Area Of "Tettenhall District"

Consisting Of Tettenhall Regis and Tettenhall Wightwick Wards

Population Approx 23,000, Households Approx 9,900 (2021 Census)

Comprising the 12 neighbourhood areas of: Castlecroft, Claregate, Aldersley, Compton, Finchfield, Regis, Smestow, Stockwell End, Tettenhall Village, Tettenhall Wood, Wergs & Danescourt, Wrottesley

Duration of the forum (5 years from being approved, as set out in legislation)





Justification Of Neighbourhood Area / Forum

The TDCT, in its aims and through a revised neighbourhood plan, seeks to **embed** community consultation on planning issues to help bring appropriate development whilst allowing residents to have a greater say over what happens in the area.

This Neighbourhood Plan aims to encourage economic growth in the area by providing for new homes, protecting local employment and enhancing its attractiveness to visitors, whilst equally ensuring its heritage, character and environment are protected. It recognises that development, if delivered in ways acceptable to the people, can positively contribute to the infrastructure requirements, as identified by local people and previously set out in the 2014 Neighbourhood Plan.



Justification Of Neighbourhood Area / Forum

Many changes in legislation recently have removed rights from the LPA and placed permitted development, legislated responsibilities and other planning obligations and developments in national level or to organisations outside the LPA. We consider it essential that WCC supports this application for the TDCT to act as a community council, to ensure the aims and development of the district are well managed.

* CSO: large international charities, trade unions, NGOs, national and local charities, community, social and recreational clubs, online networks, and faith groups. They are formed to serve many different purposes, but generally their purposes are non-profit making and often, but not always, they focus on achieving charitable aims or societal goods.

** The Community Right to Challenge: is the right for community organisations to submit an expression of interest in **running services of local authority** and fire and rescue authorities on behalf of that authority.

Written Statement

Compliance: Purpose, Activities & Related Benefit

- 1. The Forum's membership is open to individuals who live or work in "Tettenhall District", or who are elected "Trustees" of "Tettenhall District Community Trust" serving a 5 year term, or who are elected ward councillors whose ward (or part of their ward) falls within the Neighbourhood Area concerned. Ward councillors may apply for election as "Trustees", or attend Trust committee meetings on a co-opted basis, or attend the forum's working group association "Tettenhall Community Forum" since the district consists of their electoral wards.
- 2. The Forum's membership includes a minimum of 21 individuals.
- 3. The Forum has a written constitution.

Subject to Council approval the applicant confirms this application is compliant with Section 61F(7) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990. No such further conditions other than as laid out in this written statement were prescribed by Wolverhampton City Council ('WCC'), as per clause 5(e).
