I believe that my role as a teacher must include committing to a student's overall experience at their school, which is one reason I coach basketball and what motivates me to direct this prestigious event.

My personal vision in coaching is Relationships, Growth, Victory. I believe that if we connect around relationships, we grow as an individual to a more "team" oriented base. No matter how many times you win in the game of basketball or in life, if we work together, become connected and grow then we will be victorious as a person. I also want to give a heartfelt thank you to my wife and boys who support me everyday in my pursuit as a coach and now as a Director. I will state what was most important to Ken and that was his family. His love for his wife Patsy, son David, daughter Kim along with his parents, these were at the top of the list. He spoke proudly of Patsy's drive and devotion as a mother, teacher and provider. He spoke with joy of David and Kim's accomplishments as athletes and later to become teacher's and coach's as well, impacting students for years to come. Ken passed shortly after the birth of his 1st grandchildren, Tyler and Maddison but would be so proud of them today and their siblings, Nolan and Kennedy, who all have a love for sports and learning.

On my personal note I was blessed to have Ken come into my life when I attended Glendale SS in the 60's. He was for my 1st two years a teacher first and then a coach and he left his mark on me in a number of ways. His support of selecting me for the 68-69 Sr team gave me confidence that I could compete even though I was the youngest and shortest in a group of just 8 players. That year Ken cut 6 Sr players by Christmas but kept me for reasons I would keep in mine years later when I started coaching. I fell in love with the game because of him. I would follow that love for the game later when I was given the opportunity to coach at Glendale. During that time I would be fortunate to coach against him while he coached David at Scott Park, coach with him on an All Star team with David playing and then spend time on the bench with him in his last year of teaching at Hill Park. I treasure the road trips, his challenge to me in recalling basketball history, the talks over a drink about family and most memorable his time for me after my Dad passed and his kindness in getting me through that difficult time.

We honour his memory and many accomplishments as a coach by naming one of our Flight Championships in his name.

Bob Croft

1946 - 2014

I first saw Bob out of curiosity as a young kid in 1965 when I first started playing for my elementary school and my dad took me to see this extraordinary tall boy being spoke of in the Spectator playing at Hill Park. It would be the only basketball game my dad ever saw. We sat in the bleachers high above the court and watched this young, athletic, dominating man standing 6'10 do things I had never seen before. I would follow his story via the paper until I graduated.

Bob was the 1st Canadian Basketball player to receive a D1 scholarship to play in the U.S.A. at Tennessee from 1966-1970. He was co-captain on his senior year and would happily boast years later he never lost to my favourite player and H.O.F. member, "Pistol" Pete Maravich who attended L.S.U.. Bob would be drafted by the Boston Celtics of the NBA but went to the Dallas Chapparell's of the upstart ABA league. He would later play for the Kentucky Colonels in the ABA alongside future NBA greats Dan Issel and Louie Dampier. Red Auerbach of the Celtics would offer Bob a contract to come to the Celtics at the end of his contract with Kentucky but Bob decided his time with the game was over and returned home to begin his working life.

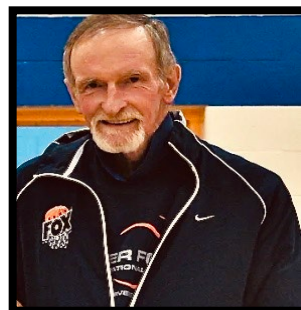
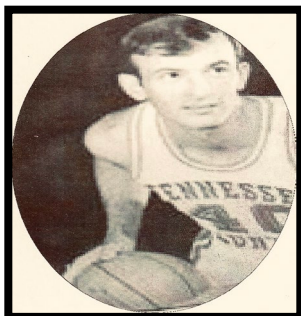
I would not come across him for the next 30 years until I became an assistant coach with David Ormerod at Saltfleet. David informed he he had a special young man coming back to the school from a year of attending and playing in high school in California where his dad lived. That young man was Keenan Jeppesen. One day after a practice Bob walked into the gym and I immediately went to say hello and ask what brought him by. He would smile and tell me he was there to pick up his nephew, Keenan!! With that we would start a friendship that evolved into him becoming a member of my Silver Fox Committee. He would give his opinion of All Star selections, give his insights into the games and players and keep us entertained with stories. He was at this time an assistant coach at A.C.M.T. and under his guidance helped guide the program to 3 OFSAA "A" Championships and develop players to go onto play at post secondary programs.

Bob is a legend in Hamilton Basketball both for his accomplishments on the court and his passion for the game.

“In the Paint”

It is always hard to find words to describe a friend at a time of loss. My friend and a friend to so many in Basketball and cycling communities across the province left a lasting impression with everyone he came into contact with.

Jim Thomas was a pioneer when it came to promoting players talents in high school to post secondary coach's on both sides of the border. Remember this was being done long before the present social media opportunities of today. Jim would visit hundreds of high school gyms to watch players compete in league and tournament games. He would then type up reports on each player he felt had the potential to play at the next level and compile this info in a booklet and with a minimal cost see that post secondary coach's had the info to review. This took enormous time and effort but he became a focal point for players who searched him out to talk about their games and aspirations. Jim told every player the truth and facts and never misled any player about their chances as he saw it.

Later he would start up a media post called “In the Paint” which drew lots of attention and support by coach's on both sides of the border. His reports were taken seriously by players, parents, coach's and recruiters.

Jim's involvement with the Fox began back in the mid 90's when I first met him at Mac while he was watching his beloved Marauders. We struck up a conversation and an instant friendship because of the game of basketball. I asked him shortly after another conversation to come on board as a committee member to help select teams for the Fox. His recommendations over the years helped elevate the status of the Fox as a must play tournament. He simply made the Fox better in a competitive manner and allowed us to showcase the top talent in high schools across the province and in some situations from other provinces.

We would have hour long phone calls taking ball and life. His love for the game and people of all ages was infectious. His laugh and whoop at his Marauders games still ring in my ears when I'm in a gym. His guidance to all the young men he came in contact with showed his compassion and support no matter the circumstances that young man was faced with.

I miss him at this time of year especially around the Fox but just as important I miss him as a dear friend. I was honoured to be one of the speakers at his funeral and cherish the moment to speak about him.

He was always having fun, smiling, remaining positive and wanting badly to play at the next level in post secondary. Ron believed his sport mimicked life, you put in the effort and work and success will come your way.

Ron worked to become a great team mate, improve his skills, took an interest in others, listened to his parents, teachers and coach's to become a responsible adult.

Ron played for coach Weatherbee at Glendale, then St Mary's University in Nova Scotia. He would briefly appear in the National Championship game under the then banner C.I.A.U. in his first year. He would return home after one year to be closer to his family and attended McMaster University to play under Coach Joe Raso. Ron would graduate with his BA in Commerce and move on to his working career in business. He would continue his love with the game playing for the local Serbian Men's travelling team around North America.

In February 2004 Ron was diagnosed with cancer at the age of 32. He remained optimistic and strong throughout this difficult time until his passing on July 31st 2005. He made his mark on life and found what he loved by putting his efforts into actions in everyday. He laughed, loved, worked hard and enjoyed life.

We hope you all live well, love often, smile daily and enjoy life with a passion.

Jim Lyle 1927-2020



No stopping this court whistle-blower

'I'm 74, so I'm not sure how many more games I can do,' says the 50-year veteran of basketball officiating

It was Jan. 7, 1952, when Jim Lyle made his debut as a basketball referee.

"I can't remember what I had for breakfast today," he says, with a laugh. "But I have a clear memory of that day. I was scared to death."

He recalls the game being played in the basement of the old First United Church, at Wellington and King streets. The gym was small and the out-of-bounds lines were defined by a brick wall.

The game was between Melrose and First United, two powerhouse midget teams in the city-wide church league.

He remembers many of the players from both teams, he remembers collecting \$1.50 for his efforts, and he remembers the post-game assessment from the First United coach.

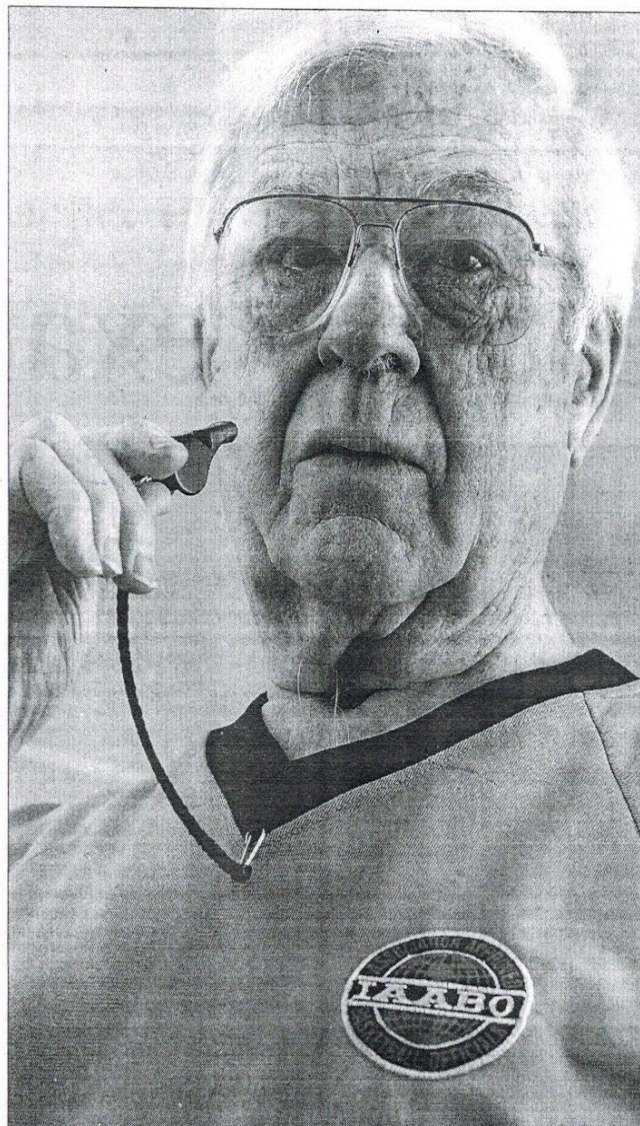
"He let me know how stupid I was."

Lyle must have got smart real fast because he's still on the job. He worked a game Monday night, exactly 50 years after his debut.

"I'm 74, so I'm not sure how many more games I can do. But I still enjoy it, especially the camaraderie."

Lyle played basketball in the church leagues and later while attending the Hamilton Technical Institute.

"Most of the guys played hockey but skates were expensive and my parents had more important things to do with their money. I owned sneakers and shorts so basketball became

my game."

He continued to play in senior leagues until 1951 when he was invited to join the men in stripes.

"I was very fortunate, Kitch McPherson was my mentor."

McPherson, who died in 1998, was among the world's best. He worked

the 1959 Pan-Am Games and all seven matches when the Russian national team made its first tour of the United States in the early 1960s.

McPherson was the first Canadian member of the International Association of Approved Basketball Officials and founded the Ontario Referees Association.

"He made us an affiliate of the international association," Lyle says. "He wanted us to be the best and he knew we would have access to their clinics and teaching materials."

Lyle is vice-president of the Hamilton board and they now have 160 referees, including 32 women.

He says referees must attend a series of classroom sessions every year and pass a written exam. They also attend a workshop where they referee simulated games. And senior officials sit in on real games, grading the younger referees on their floor work.

"It's one thing to know the rules, but it's another thing to know how to apply them."

He says basketball has enjoyed a growth spurt the past few years and the quality of coaching and players has snowballed, especially among women.

"We had an OFSAA tournament here last month and the girls were fantastic. Some of them could play with the boys."

Lyle retired in 1949 and all three of their children had a fling with basketball. He was a purchasing agent with a small machine company before joining Stelco in 1967 as a buyer. He was superintendent of purchasing for Hilton Works when he retired in 1991.

A wonky back forced him to reduce his basketball schedule this year but he expects to referee a few more games before the season closes.

"It's a wonderful opportunity to spend time with good kids. That's not a fringe benefit you can put in your pocket, but it certainly makes your heart swell."

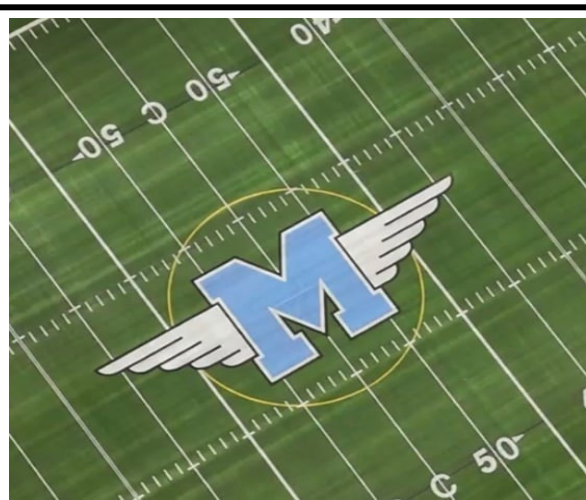
