Equipment Donations

The progressive nature of ALS, a neurodegenerative disease, requires multiple pieces of equipment inclusive to Alternative and Augmentative Communication (AAC), Activities of Daily Living (ADL), and Durable Medical Equipment (DME) to support basic activities of daily living that contribute to patient quality of life. Multiple surveys by local ALS Chapters indicate that those living with ALS have a need for this variable equipment, particularly, if they have no or limited resources for payment; reasons include not being insured, not having coinsurance, those admitted to hospice, or those living at or near the poverty level. Other reasons include extensive wait for the delivery of customized equipment (possibly from insurance) or intermittent equipment required for particular stages of the progressive disease. If you are interested in donating equipment, please review the donation process and equipment accepted lists provided below.

Donation Process: The Chapter collaborates with two durable medical equipment (DME) companies, Numotion and Ability Medical Supply, who donate their time to our Chapter's Statewide Equipment Loan Program. The Florida Chapter will send a formal request via email to arrange for pick up of the equipment; however, because Numotion and Ability Medical Supply service the whole state, we ask you to please allow 10-15 business days for the DME company's representative to make arrangements for the equipment. Once the DME Company has picked up the equipment and we have received confirmation from them, the Florida Chapter will happily send you an Acknowledgement Letter as a "Thank you" for your kind donation to our Chapter. Please note that the Florida Chapter is not able to provide an appraisal value for your donation, nor can we include any values within the acknowledgement letter. It is strongly suggested that you contact your tax advisor/consultant regarding your donation before the equipment is picked up.
