My name is Amber Moreland, PhD, and I am the owner of Integrated Psychological Connections. I hold a PhD in Clinical Psychology with an emphasis in Neuropsychology and am licensed to practice psychology in Washington, Colorado, and Texas. I am also certified by the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (APIT) to provide interjurisdictional telepsychology services in 43 states across the United States.

I specialize in conducting psychological, neuropsychological, and forensic evaluations for court-involved individuals, utilizing an evidence-based approach to ensure scientifically grounded, objective assessments. My expertise includes working with diverse populations—including children, adolescents, and adults—in both community and residential settings. I have extensive experience assessing a variety of neurodevelopmental disorders, neurological conditions, and personality and emotional functioning. I am particularly skilled in trauma-related assessments and evaluating complex family dynamics, having undergone extensive postdoctoral education in trauma and evaluations related to high-conflict divorces. Additionally, I am certified by the National Register of Health Service Psychologists and trained in prevention, consultation, assessment, and treatment services.

Scheduling:

- Initial intake appointments can typically be scheduled within 1-2 weeks.
- Remote evaluations can generally be scheduled within 3-4 weeks.
- In-person evaluations can typically be scheduled within 4-12 weeks, depending on location and travel schedule.
- Expedited (rushed) evaluations are available for an additional fee.
- Reports are generally completed within 10-14 business days after the evaluation is completed (including all collateral records being received and interviews being completed).

Evaluation Process Overview:

1. Onboarding and Intake Appointment: There is a mandatory initial intake appointment which costs \$350. This is a meeting with Dr. Moreland and the evaluatee to go over case – related information as well as scheduling, evaluation process, and administrative tasks.
2. Submission of Collateral Documents
3. Psychological Testing
4. Clinical and Collateral Interviews
5. Evaluation Findings and Comprehensive Report

Fees and Financing Options:

Retainer: Dr. Moreland does not bill insurance for these evaluations and requires a minimum retainer, generally starting at \$4,500 (varies by case complexity).

- For cases where I am only providing a general psychological evaluation report, my retainer is \$4500. This will include up to one collateral contact, a comprehensive collateral record review, and a report that includes a diagnostic impression, recommendations, and testing data.
- Unless otherwise agreed in advance, an initial retainer of \$6500 is required for full forensic and/or legal evaluations that include neuropsychological testing or additional individual components (e.g., parenting components, risk assessments, etc.). This will include a comprehensive collateral record review, up to three collateral interviews, and a comprehensive report that includes a biopsychosocial history (25-35 pages).

Financing: To assist clients with immediate financial concerns, I partner with CareCredit to provide flexible financing, including deferred or no interest if paid in full within 12 months.

Hourly Fee: My fee is \$350/hour in quarter-hour increments, for forensic and legal services including but not limited to: client contacts, examinee and collateral interviews, psychological and neuropsychological testing, scoring, and interpretations, record review, telephone calls, research and literature reviews, letters, report writing, observations, and travel time. Psychometrist time is charged at \$200/hour in quarter hour increments.

Expert Witness: For matters involving expert witness testimony, my fee is \$350/hour, which includes trial preparation, case review, travel time, time spent waiting to testify, and testimony.

Remaining Balances: Any remaining balance beyond the initial retainer paid must be paid in full before I release the final report.

Remote and In-Person Evaluations: Most assessments are conducted remotely via secure telehealth platforms. Limited in-person evaluations are available in WA, CO, and TX for cases requiring face-to-face assessment.
