Welcome to April!

Spring has sprung, days are longer, it's getting darker later. The likelihood of riding at night is being minimized. 12

GOOD TIMES INDEED!

The summer, with its long days and bright sunshine is almost enough to make a person forget how important the lighting system on their vehicle can be. "Why would I be worried about my lighting if I am not riding in the dark?" This is a legitimate question you might ask.

The simple truth is, on a motorcycle you become less visible in the bright sunshine. At night, there is a good chance your lights will be easily recognized by an oncoming vehicle. Disappearing in the daylight is why auto makers added daytime running lights to cars. It is why motorcycles headlights are ALWAYS ON as an industry standard.

How can I be MORE visible? Simple answer is LEDs.

Light bulbs are old technology. It is a piece of metal, sealed in an inert gas so when electricity passes through the metal, it is a controlled burn, glowing near white hot, thus creating light. This requires a large current flow (amps). As time passes, the metal deteriorates and eventually the bulb burns out.

CONVERSELY,

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An LED, (Light Emitting Diode) is a modern semiconductor that when electricity is applied, light is emitted. Thus, the name. It requires stable voltage and very little current (amps).

The ultimate goal with installing LEDs, is more light and greater visibility (the ability to see and be seen). The unintended consequence is less wear on the electrical system.

Can I install LEDs and be done? For headlights, fog lights and road lights, yes. For turn signals, there is more to it. For a turn signal to flash properly the system must have a certain amount of current flow. LEDs for turn signals can work, but it will require a load compensator of some sort to allow the flasher to function properly. This may require a voltage stabilizer. However, some LED bulbs have compensators built onto them. This will require some research, so be sure to do your research.

I hope you found this article illuminating.
