Weight is everything (heavier can be better)

We all know oil has a number to explain weight. But what is it really? Without all the boring engineering, simply put, weight is how thick the oil is and how the oil performs 0°F and 100°F.

Why is this important?

Oil thickness (or lack thereof) will directly affect the longevity of your equipment. What must be understood is exactly what operating conditions you see as to what oil weight is best for your ride. Air cooled engines are even more susceptible to oil breakdown since engine temperatures are not as closely regulated (no liquid cooling system to cool the engine). It can be maddening to understand the engineering and practical application thereof.

Since most riders never ride below 40°F, and usually see temperatures up to 90°F, a thicker oil is not required, but may be a wise choice. The link to this article (on the next page) contains some great information on understanding oil weights and how to choose the best oil for your bike.

Viscosity - Choosing the Right Oil Weight - CIRCLE TRACK WAREHOUSE | PERFORMANCE RACING DISTRIBUTOR | AUTOMOTIVE PARTS - Viscosity is the most important property of a lubricant. Understanding viscosity can help reduce wear, improve fuel economy, and make more horsepower.

As you can see, ambient temperature is going to have a lot to do with what oil you use. Please understand, manufacturers have to make a call as to what one product will serve best for all customers. It is a guideline, not a cemented rule. This is an educated decision for you, the customer, to make to protect YOUR INVESTMENT. So when you do your research, ask questions. Don't listen to just one source. Dig, read, probe. You will find the answers that work best in the real world.

In personal experience, my 103 cu. in. twin cam Harley has responded very well to full synthetic 50W oil. Compared to Harley Davidson SYN3 in 20W50, the oil performed better, showed less breakdown over 5000 miles, no leaks developed and most of all, no oil consumption.




Ultimately, the best choice for oil comes down to how well it is engineered, does it meet the requirements of the manufacturer and all real world testing before it goes to market.


