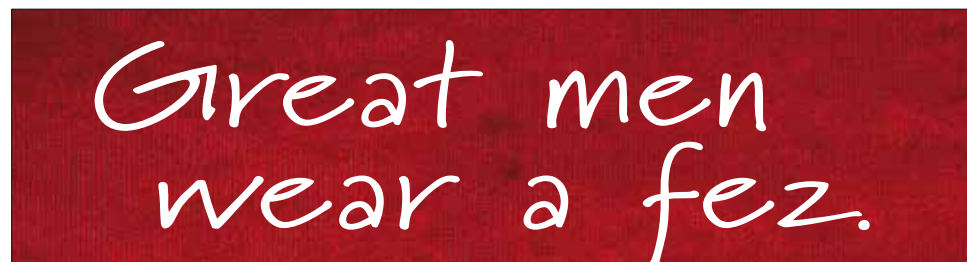


The entire group on the Potentate's trip.

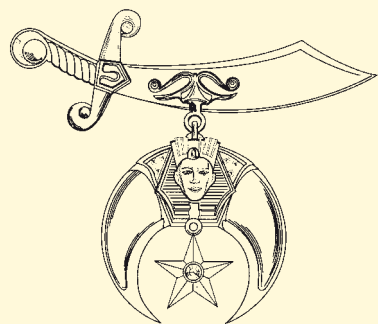
Hospital Van Drivers

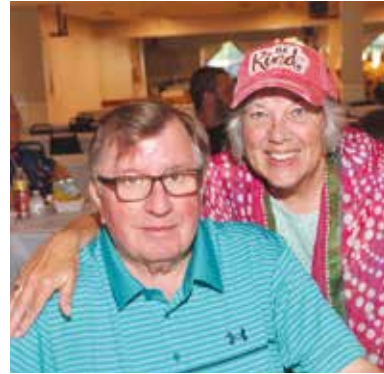
