





Nobles

I recently found myself thinking about one of my mentors whom I haven't seen or spoken to in several years. Despite the fact that we live in different states, I have always made it a point to see him during least one or two Masonic events a year in the last few years. Honestly, I know that he won't be around much longer.

I first met him when I was 12 or 13 years old. He was one of the nice older gentlemen in my father's Masonic lodge who was always glad to see me hanging around the dining room on meeting night. When the time came, he was part of the conversations that convinced me to start my Masonic journey and he volunteered to be on my investigating committee. He made a point to drive two hours each way to attend each of my degrees and to attend my installation as Master of our Lodge a few years later.

By that time, he was the Grand Treasurer of the Grand Lodge of Texas and would often call me to ride with him in the summer to install Lodges or when he needed help with a cornerstone ceremony somewhere. No matter how long the drive, I was never allowed behind the wheel...but I was allowed to listen. I was allowed to listen as he told stories of surviving the nightmare of Peleliu and turning 21 on Okinawa. He talked of being responsible for two Navajo Code Talkers and ensuring that they were never captured. After the war, he opened an electronics shop in Austin, and became the only man that President Johnson would buy a TV from. By the time I met him, he had turned the business over to his son and was pretty much a full-time Mason.

I share this story with you not to brag about my mentor – although I am incredibly proud of him. I share it with you because this extraordinary man, like so many who walk the halls of our Lodges and our temples, doesn't see himself that way. I'm lucky that he chose me to share his stories with, and he shared so much more about how to become the man that I want to be (I'm still working on that) and what it means to be a servant leader. We are fortunate in our fraternity to have countless men like him – men who are willing to share their life experiences with others, and countless men like me – men who are still trying to figure this whole life thing out.

Our membership in this great organization provides us the opportunity to get to know exceptional men and their families. I'm confident that you've probably thought of at least one Brother that you've encountered in your Masonic journey while reading this article. It's just as possible that at least one Noble has thought of you. Perhaps you know him, but you may not...and you may never know the impact that you've made on him. What matters is that at some point, someone was present for you when you needed his example, and you were present when someone needed you to be...whether you knew they were watching or not.

And that, my Brothers, is the point of this: our responsibility to show up and be present for our fellow Nobles...to be there when they need an example, a mentor, a friend. We are someone's impression of this great fraternity. So, please, show up and be present at the temple meetings, at club and unit meetings, at your Lodges, in the other organizations that you belong to. Somebody there needs you. It might even be me.

A Step Back in Time with the Oriental Band

ow important are "Date" Books! Very!!

Art Kinder, a member of the Shrine since 1976 and active in the Oriental Band as well as Assistant Director of Shrine Clubs under Vern Hilliard for many years has many Calendars of Event books saved. When a question comes up, where does Art go, but to the COE books.

In watching TV on the 27th of February this year, we see a birthday party being shown and the name rang a bell - Gertrude Stern. To the Books. This was what came up.

Did you know that the Oriental Band was once called the Ararat Shrine Sentinels? In 1948, a roster book with some 80 members listed was found. Written in blue was Roster of the Oriental Band of Ararat Shrine Temple 1952. This brought up, what about the women! In the last book of the Casbah Darlin's I found was 2017. The past presidents started in 1958. In 1964-65 Gertrude

Stern was president. Which if one puts it all together – the wife of the president of the Oriental Band, will be president of the Casbah Darlin's.

Art, Jerri Dowdy, Larry Cory and I went to visit Gertrude!

The birthday party on TV on February 27 was for the oldest woman in the state of Kansas, Gertrude Stern - 112 years young. She was her usual self - a smile on her face, her hair fixed, her makeup on and ready to talk.

In 1976 when Art joined the Shrine and opted for the Oriental Band, Morris Stern was a member of the Oriental Band. Morrie, as he went by, played the musette and that was the instrument that Art took up. Practice every Monday night and in parades during the summer. Oh, Happy Day!!!! Morey had two special cars – a Chevrolet Convertible and a Chrysler Imperial. The year Ann, Art's



daughter, was Queen of Job's Daughters, Morrie drove her in his convertible in the parade. His other special car – the Chrysler sat in the garage until Gertrude moved into the Atriums. It had not been driven since 2014 – license given up at age 104. Remember when!



In 2017, the Casbah Darlin's decided to honor the women who had served as president of the organization. A dinner was held and there were 6 past presidents – Donna Hunt, Doris Klinock, Rosie Hasselbring, Lil Haviland, Gertrude Stern, and Alma Ziegler. This was the last get together that was had by these ladies.

Since Morrie's death, a sundial – which has some meaning to the Masonic Ritual – has found a resting place in our yard. Art and I have kept in touch with Gertrude over the years by phone and by visits.

An hour of reminiscing with Gertrude and good memories is what we have to remember. Two days after our visit a message came to us – Gertrude had gone to be with Morris

April 2022 Temple Meeting Notes

llustrious Potentate Donnie Fowler Called the meeting to order at 7: 04, April 13th, 2022, Bennett Auditorium

Assistant Rabban, Mark Koontz informed the Captain of the Guard, Bud Higginbotham that the Potentate was about to open Ararat Temple for business. That Done, Captain of the Guard, Noble Bud informed the Outer Guard, and then reported to Noble Mark, who informed Illustrious Sir Fowler that the Temple was under a double and trusty guard.

Chief Rabban, Mark Dobson then surveyed the crowd and informed the Potentate that our Temple was free from jeopardy as there were none present save members of our order. Illustrious Sir Fowler said "Tis Well".

Noble First Oriental Guide, Ben Allen, Prepared the Alter

Noble Chaplain Wes Wingfield remembered our Nobles who had been visited by the Black Camel and gave the invocation

The Colors were placed prior to the business meeting beginning. The assembled Nobles, led by Chief Rabban, Mark Dobson recited the Shrine Pledge of Allegiance, and Noble Jacque Mote led the singing of the National Anthem.

There was an alarm at the door.

Illustrious Potentate Fowler suspended the meeting and ask the Marshal, Noble Keith Stoneking to ascertain the cause of the alarm. Three members of the Ed's Possie were present to make a presentation. Noble Jeremy Yates spoke on the past projects that Ed's Possie has done to help out charitable organizations like March of Dimes, and that they have been helping the Ararat Shriners for about four years now. Ed announced that they love to help kids and that is what the shrine does. They presented \$1700.00 from a collection event last weekend and \$490.00 from an event one of his daughters had at Farmers Insurance. Both of those are for Ararat Temple. They went to the Kansas City Snake Saturday Parade and placed fourth place and presented \$2000.00 from that event to the Shrine Hospital. After the event, on Sunday Morning, one of their members lost his life in an accident. This year will be dedicated to Matt Bird, to honor him for his work.

Illustrious Potentate Fowler called the meeting back to order. Illustrious Potentate Fowler thanked the Band for their entertainment tonight.

Recorder's Minutes

y most recent article to appear in this publication was approximately one year ago and dealt with what at that time seemed to be preparatory to relocating the home of Ararat I Shrine. Practically before the ink was dry on that issue of the Ararat Shrine News, the buyer's source of finance abruptly pulled out of the negotiations and the buyer subsequently withdrew the offer. Since that time the property has technically continued to be for sale but with little serious interest from any prospective buyers.

In recent weeks some new interest in the property has developed and it has been shown several times through a new listing agent and letters of intent from a couple of prospective buyers have been received. None of the offers made were immediately taken seriously however counter offers closer to the approximate value of the building were submitted to the interested parties without reply.

It comes as no surprise that sometime in the future, the declining membership of our Shrine will no longer be able to sustain the maintenance and operation of a facility as spacious and magnificent as we now have. But that doesn't mean that we should have to settle for substandard accommodations either. Per the bylaws of Shriners International, which I have copied below, specify the process required to accomplish any relocation.

- § 322.5 Change of location. A temple may change its location in the following manner:
 - (a) Proposal. The proposal to move the location of the temple must be in writing, signed by at least 100 members of the temple or ten (10%) percent of the membership, whichever is less, setting forth the details of the proposal. It must be presented to the Potentate. Amend 2017
 - (b) Notice. Thereupon the Potentate shall direct the Recorder to mail a notice of the proposal to each member stating that a meeting of the temple will be held within 90 days to vote upon the proposal.
 - (c) Meeting. Before the expiration of 30 days after the receipt of the proposal by the Potentate, he shall fix the time and place of the meeting and notify the Recorder.
 - (d) Time and Place. Thereafter not less than 20 days nor more than 30 days prior to the meeting, the Recorder shall mail to each member a notice of the exact time and place
 - (e) Vote. If two-thirds or more of the members voting at the meeting are in favor of changing the location of the temple, the result of the election shall be certified to the Imperial Recorder at least sixty days before the Imperial Session of Shriners International at which it is to be submitted. Every such proposal shall be published with the notice of the Imperial Session. Amend, 1984
 - (f) Dispensations and Charters Committee. If the Dispensations and Charters Committee finds the move to be in the best interests of the Order, it may approve the proposal and report to Shriners International of an amendment to the charter changing the location of the temple. Amend. 2017

These are the rules as prescribed by the bylaws of Shriners International.

There are sheets being circulated at events at the temple and in outlying areas at Shrine Club meetings to get the necessary signatures to move forward.

A copy of the petition being circulated is copied below:

Pursuant to Imperial bylaws regarding the change of Temple location:

- § 322.5 Change of location. A temple may change its location in the following manner:
- (a) Proposal. The proposal to move the location of the temple must be in writing, signed by at least 100 members of the temple or ten (10%) percent of the membership, whichever is less, setting forth the details of the proposal. It must be presented to the Potentate.

Therefore, the undersigned of this notice or a facsimile thereof, propose the relocation of Ararat Shriners, pursuant to the sale of the existing property at 5100 Ararat Drive, Kansas City, Missouri 64129 for a reasonable monetary amount and the prospective purchase or lease of a suitable replacement property to be earnestly addressed upon meeting the requirements of this proposal.


