If this occurs at the end of the shift, oncoming staff must relieve you of being with the resident on the bedpan. You do not leave the resident alone under any circumstances. Accident Prevention

Resident with Alarms

Policy:

Residents with any type of alarm to prevent unassisted ambulation will be monitored by staff when the alarm is not in place.

Procedure

1. Residents with an alarm to prevent unassisted ambulation will not be left unattended while in the bathroom
2. Staff member will keep resident in view while resident is on the toilet. (Provide as much privacy as possible)
3. If you require assistance from another staff member, pull the bathroom call bell for another staff response. Do not leave the resident unattended or out of view.
4. When administering assistance to a resident who has an alarm order for unassisted ambulation, do not leave resident unattended if the alarm is not in place.
5. Upon completion of care or assistance to a resident, ensure the alarm is in place and functioning prior to leaving the resident.
