Global Peace Secretariat Pays Tribute To Former First Lady Mrs. Rosalynn Carter



As the world bids farewell to former First Lady Mrs. Rosalynn Carter, Global Peace Secretariat would like to say "hat's off" to Mrs. Carter's decades of work with women's rights and mental health.

Mrs. Carter was elected to the Board of Directors of the National Association of Mental Health for her work in removing stigma of mental health and honored by the National Organization for Women with an Award of Merit for her vigorous support for the Equal Rights Amendment.

Mrs. Rosalynn Carter was the first First Lady to sit in on the President's Cabinet meetings on invitation of the President and established the Office of the First Lady in the East Wing.

TIME magazine famously called Mrs. Carter the "Steel Magnolia" for having a fragile and feminine appearance that concealed a "tough as nails" interior.
