
The Secret to Power Moves?

D is for *Dreamer* – someone who understands the industry, the trends, and what's possible. They'll help you see around corners, imagine new paths, and prep you for those next-level opportunities. My Dreamer? She could see five steps ahead when I could barely see one.



Once I assembled my WIND crew, things started to shift, not instantly, but steadily. My vision got clearer. My confidence grew stronger. I stopped operating from fear and started moving from purpose. I had a team that reminded me I wasn't in this alone, and that I didn't have to be.
