Reminders From the Board

As the dog days of summer roll through the Bonita Highlands, it's important to practice good lawn care to keep our yards green. Our last Highlands inspection revealed that we have a large number of homeowners with yards that are dying or have already crossed the finish line. It doesn't take much to keep our green grass thriving and if you plan ahead, it also doesn't cost much as you think. Here are just a few hints.....

<u>Aerate</u> 1-2 times a year. This is a necessity for clay soil, it is essential to perform this task at least once a year and twice is optimal. The recommended times are spring (April/May) and fall (October/November). If you choose to only do it once a year, go with spring. When you aerate in the spring, apply gypsum afterwards which will help to loosen the soil and improve the soil structure for optimal grass growth.

<u>Fertilize</u> every 8-10 weeks. Go to a landscaping store and they can recommend fertilizers specific to the season and your soil that will optimize the growth of your grass and minimize the weeds.

<u>Water</u> twice a day for six minute intervals, 3-4 times per week is all it takes as long as you choose your watering time wisely (5 am and 8-9 am are optimal). If you water once a day, then up your time accordingly and water between 5-6 am. Temperatures and seasons are critical factors in choosing your watering times. AVOID evening watering as that will lead to fungus growth! And afternoon watering is subject to fast evaporation!

Sprinklers, last but not least, check your sprinklers on a regular basis to ensure everything is operating properly. Check for faulty sprinkler heads, broken risers, and any possible breaks in the pipes, and repair/replace components as necessary to ensure you are properly watering you grass and/or plants. And always check the weather report so you can turn your sprinklers off when its raining!

Let's work together and keep the Bonita Highlands green and beautiful!

- 1 OCT 2025 Candidate Qualification forms are available.
- 1 NOV 2025 Notice of Nomination Procedures will be issued.
- 1 DEC 2025 Nomination Deadline. All Candidate Qualification forms must be received by this date to be considered for nomination to the Board.
- DEC 2025 The candidate list will be finalized and the election officials selected. Homeowners will be notified of voting procedures, including time, date and location for in-person voting.
- JAN 2026 The election ballots, instructions, and return envelopes will be mailed to all current homeowners the last week of January 2026.
- 2 MAR 2026 Homeowners must submit their ballots so they are received by March 2, 2026 to be counted.
