


Enviable Open Spaces



Restated & Recorded in 2019 per Davis-Stirling Act.



Rules & Regulations (R&Rs) & Architectural Guidelines

Revised as required by changes in State Law, County Ordinances, or as needs are recognized within our community.

CC&R Restatement

- Amended and restated to correct code references to the CA Davis-Stirling Act/CA Civil Law.
- Some paragraph renumbering for consistency.
- Association's Corporate Legal Counsel and BHHA Board President affirmed "no changes to substance."
- Formally recorded with County 10/26/18.

Rules & Regulations

- Revised per changes to state law, County Ordinances, or as needs recognized within community.
- Updated by Board, with inputs from homeowners.

Conformance Inspections

Architectural Control Committee (Conformance)

- 2-week inspection schedule
- 4-step process for new violations



Board seeks homeowner conformance with CC&Rs and R&Rs.






