

### **DOE Introduction: K-12**


- Impact: Ensure students have access to consistent, quality education
  - School Accreditation
  - Educator Certification
  - Federal programs
  - Academic content standards
  - State aid to education



### **DOE Introduction: K-12**

- Who we work with:
  - 149 public school districts
  - 47 non-public schools/systems
  - 19 tribal/BIE schools

 Plus special schools, education cooperatives, & other approved programs






### **DOE Introduction: K-12**

- Who we work with:
  - 136,026 public school students
  - 14,499 non-public school students

### **DOE Introduction: Libraries**

- Six areas of focus (SDCL 14-1-44):
  - 1. Promote adequate library service for all South Dakotans
  - 2. Supplement services of local libraries
  - 3. Train library staff
  - 4. Provide specialized library services
  - 5. Operate state publications distribution program
  - 6. Collect and report annual data





### **DOE Introduction: Libraries**


- Impact:
  - Promote adequate library service through voluntary accreditation
  - Offer specialized services through Braille and Talking Book Program
  - Supplement local library service through:
    - Interlibrary loan
    - Subject-specific electronic databases





### **DOE Introduction: Libraries**

- Who we work with:
  - 111 public libraries
  - 381 school libraries
  - University libraries





# **DOE Introduction: History**

- Five areas of focus:
  - 1. Archaeology
  - 2. Archives
  - 3. Historic preservation
  - 4. Museum
  - 5. Publications/press





## **DOE Introduction: History**

### • Impact:

- Publish 4-5 books/year on SD history and culture
- Manage processes that preserve historic sites
- Showcase state's rich history at the history museum & archives
- Conduct site surveys to ensure protection of cultural resources





### **Federal Response**

- Waivers from testing
- CARES Act funding
  - Education Stabilization Funds
    - \$41.3 million ESSER
    - \$5.7 million for K-12 GEER
  - CRF Funds
    - \$75 million to K-12 schools, education cooperatives, & state special schools

### **Governor Kristi Noem**

"It is critical for our students' well-being that our schools reopen. We know that children thrive on routine and being in supportive, social

# **Priorities Beyond COVID-19**

- Taking positives forward
  - Meet students where they are
    - Academic supports
    - Support social-emotional needs
  - Support boards, educators, and staff
  - Prepare students to be engaged, productive citizens



## **Priorities Beyond COVID-19**

- Refocus efforts to:
  - Identify & replicate bright spots related to Native American education
  - Update distance learning
  - Strengthen competency-based models of instruction
  - Support good teaching
  - Teacher recruitment/retention
  - Guide schools in spending unprecedented federal funds for meaningful, long-term impact



## Federal Funding: Round II

- Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act
  - \$170 million for SD through ESSER II
    - 90% allocated by formula to public school districts
    - 10% for state-level activities and administration
    - Flexible uses of funds prioritize learning loss and impacts from COVID
    - Eligible non-public schools may apply for funding through separate program
    - Funds must be obligated by Sept. 30, 2023




#### **COVID-19 Cases\* Within South Dakota K–12 Schools**
