1. PURPOSE

To define the composition and role of the Advisory Member of the different Committees (Provincial and Regional)

2. SCOPE

a. This policy defines the role of the Advisory Member

b. This policy establishes the privileges and fees for the Advisory Members

4. DEFINITION OF ADVISORY MEMBER

- a. A person is eligible to be an Advisory Member who is currently working in, or associated with, the Emergency Management field and their position has a direct relationship with the Special Care Sector
- b. Advisory Members will be provided with a seat on either the Provincial Committee or a Regional Committee, where their expertise is able to assist and help guide the Committee in achieving their goals and objectives
 - Advisory Members representing a Provincial organizations or body, would sit on the Provincial Committee
 - ii. Advisory Members representing a Regional, Municipal and/or Local organization or body, would sit on a Regional Committee
- c. Provincial Advisory Members are determined and invited by the Executive Committee
- d. Regional Advisory Members are determined and invited by the Regional Executive Team
- e. Advisory Members are entitled to attend and participate in meetings, conferences and working groups, however they have no voting privileges and cannot hold office in the Association

- If the Advisory Member is also a Member in good standing, they retain all rights and privileges of membership (such as voting and holding office), but not when in their Advisory role
- f. Provincial Advisory Members may include, but are not limited to, representatives from:
 - i. Department of Health and Wellness
 - ii. Department of Community Services
 - iii. Emergency Management Office (Provincial)
 - iv. Office of the Fire Marshal
 - v. Other provincial organizations as determined by the Executive Committee
- g. Regional Advisor Members may include, but are not limited to, local representatives from:
 - i. NSHA Management Zone (Former DHA's)
 - ii. Department of Community Services
 - iii. Red Cross
 - iv. Emergency Management Office/Organization (Local, Regional, Municipal, etc.)
 - v. Fire Department
 - vi. Police Services
 - vii. Emergency Health Services
 - viii. Physicians / Clinics
 - ix. Other local organizations as determined by the Regional Executive Team

5. ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEES

- There is no fee to be an Advisory Member and as such Advisory Members have no rights or benefits of membership as outlined in the By-Laws of SCEPA Policies
- Advisory Members will receive the same discount as a member in good standing, to any Conferences, Workshops or other meetings requiring a registration fee
- c. Registration fees may be waived for Advisory Members who are presenting at a Conference or Workshop. The waiving of any fees will be at the sole discretion of the Executive Committee
