"I Cannot Tell a Lie..."

Most of you can guess who supposedly spoke that line. According to the popular legend initiated by early biographer Mason Locke Weems and later popularized by William Holmes McGuffey, it was young George Washington who made that famous confession to his father Augustine Washington. As the story goes, George had received a hatchet from his father for his sixth birthday and decided to test out its sharp blade on one of their fledgling cherry trees. When Dad confronted his son about the damaged tree, the lad uttered the nowfamous quote and confessed to his misdeed. The enduring story ends with his father embracing the boy, rejoicing that his son's honesty was worth a thousand such trees.

It is with that lead-in that we talk a bit about Washington's Birthday, a federal holiday that is celebrated annually on the third Monday of February, this year falling on February 17. It is also informally known as Presidents Day. There was an attempt during the 1950s and '60s to officially rename the federal holiday as Presidents' Day, giving a nod to both Abraham Lincoln's birthday on February 12 and Washington's birthday on February 22, along with also recognizing the office of the presidency. Despite several attempts over the years, this change never happened and the issue was finally resolved on June 28, 1968 when the federal holiday's official name of Washington's Birthday was signed into law.

I cannot tell a lie...it gets more complicated. The holiday is also celebrated as a state holiday by over half of our country's states, with many of them using different names. Since federal holidays are applicable only to our federal government and the District of Columbia, Congress has never made a

national holiday binding to all states. Each state may choose its own particular legal holidays. Many of them have named this holiday for Washington or both Washington and Lincoln or even Washington and someone else. Others opt for a variation of the word President, e.g. President's, Presidents' or Presidents (Day). Yep, it's complicated!

Another interesting fact about George Washington's birthday is that it differs depending on which calendar is used. According to the old Julian calendar commonly used during his birth, George Washington was born in Virginia on February 11, 1731. However, Britain and all its colonies adopted our current Gregorian calendar in 1752, which resulted in moving Washington's birthday a year and 11 days to the now recognized date of February 22, 1732.

The federal holiday honoring Washington's Birthday began as an Act of Congress in 1879 for all government offices located in Washington, D.C. In 1885, it was expanded to include all federal offices in the country and to be celebrated on Washington's birth date of February 22. However, the federal holiday was changed on January 1, 1971 to the current third Monday in February observation by the Uniform Holiday Monday Act, which makes the holiday always occurring between February 15 and 21...and never falling on Washington's actual birthday of February 22! (Side note: The reason behind the Uniform Holiday Monday Act: It was created to increase the number of three-day weekends for federal employees.)

There you have it...almost everything you may (or may not) have ever wanted to know about Washington's Birthday. Eat some cherry pie on that day...it's the food traditionally associated with the holiday. 
