Climate Change Challenges Present Individual Opportunities

Some of you may remember that in every April issue, I like to use this unique opportunity to promote greater awareness of Earth Day, which is always observed on April 22. Now celebrating its 50th anniversary, Earth Day is recognized around the world as an enormously important movement that began in America back in 1970 when over 20 million people rallied for higher environmental standards. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) was created that year and the vitally important Clean Air, Clean Water and Endangered Species Acts passed in 1972-73. Since going global in 1990, more than one billion people participate in Earth Day activities each year, making it the largest civic event in the world.

Earth Day Network, the world's largest recruiter to the environmental movement with more than 75,000 partners in over 190 countries, is focusing their campaign theme this year on the need to address the challenges and opportunities facing us when dealing with climate change. Per their website, "Climate change represents the biggest challenge to the future of humanity and the life-support systems that make our world habitable."

The heating and cooling of our planet's climate systems is what creates our weather and it is the long-term averages and variability of weather that define any region's normal climate. When new long-term weather patterns happen, that climate is then experiencing climate change. While Earth has experienced many episodes of climate change during its existence, global warming of Earth's climate has become more affected by human activities over the last 150 years, primarily due to greenhouse

gas emissions of carbon dioxide and methane. The majority of these emissions come from burning fossil fuels (crude oil, coal and natural gas) for electricity and heat, cultivation of livestock, deforestation, chemical emissions from manufacturing, and a transportation industry that uses mostly petroleum-based fuels.

The concept of positively affecting climate change may seem out of reach for us as mere individuals. But as a collective society working together within even a small region such as Greenville County, we can make a difference. The list of opportunities for change is quite long...but some obvious actions include reducing home energy usage, investing in solar, carpooling, combining different errands into one trip, owning an electric vehicle, walking or bicycling when possible, reducing our use of chemical fertilizers and herbicides, using an electric lawnmower rather than a gaspowered one, dumping less into methaneemitting landfills by more aggressively recycling, donating to a tree-planting charity, and yes...even eating less beef. Besides being much healthier for us, eating a plantbased diet is now one of the top proven solutions for climate change since it would ultimately lead to less methane emissions from cattle production and less deforestation for grazing land.

There's a lot we can do as individuals, as groups such as schools and companies, and as a region to positively affect climate change and global warming. You can start by educating yourself with an online visit to earthday.org or do an online search for climate change, global warming and good environmental practices. Let your imagination soar and discover what might ultimately stimulate a passion for change. Because our world needs all of us to participate in making a difference.





For me, it was while taking a walk and excitedly capturing photos brimming with vivid colors, sunlight, shadows, tiny details of flowers, stones, acorns, and the grandeur of a huge tree entwined with ivy, it's massiveness against a bright blue sky. The ordinary became extraordinary. I was totally present. As a child I frequently ventured outside with my little brownie camera patiently taking photos of squirrels darting by, dogs, cats, frogs and birds. My marvelous photo collection of distant, black and white images, I named my "animal scrapbook".

The creative spirit is available to each of us, ready to enrich all areas of our lives. Creativity is not reserved for the artist, playwright, or other extraordinary talent. In her classic book, The Artist's Way, Julia Cameron shares tools for freeing the creative spirit in each of us. I've practiced her "morning pages" journaling tool for years.

The impetus for writing this article came recently from a photo of our little three-year-old great niece. With her little blond curls cascading down her face, eyes laser-focused on the page and her little chubby fingers firmly holding the crayon, Fiona was totally engrossed in making bold, colorful capital A's on the page in the activity



book her grandma had given her. The time was right and she was truly focused.

Two similar concepts describe the idea of losing oneself in a creative endeavor. The first is called "flow". From positive psychology, a flow state is the mental state in which a person performing an activity is fully immersed in a feeling of energized focus, full involvement, and enjoyment in the process of the activity. The Zen concept of "no-mind" similarly can be described is an intense and precise awareness in which the person is free of the mind's typical distractions and chatter. These states are without self-consciousness or criticism.

Children, who are not little adults, are naturally curious. Creativity takes root first in childhood. We can take our cues from children and find ways to remember what is was like to explore, be curious observers and unabashedly create in the moment. Children enter this ultimate state of flow much easier than adults. Maybe as Ursula Laguin says, "The creative adult is the child that survived." We can all find that free and creative child within.

According to Goleman, Kaufman and Ray, authors of The Creative Spirit, there are four powerful tools to develop your own creativity:

- · Faith in your own creativity knowing you have the creative power within you
- · Absence of judgment being able to quiet the inner critic
- · Precise observation seeing the world through the eyes of a child with freshness and sense of wonder
- · Ability to ask penetrating questions take the risk to ask and let go of assumptions.
- "The desire to create is one of the deepest yearnings of the human soul." (Dieter F. Uchtdorf)
