## **Out for Blood By Christopher Lane**

Yes, I am indeed out for blood...vour blood. If there's one thing you can do for the good of your fellow man/woman/child, making a blood donation is pretty much at the top of the list. Utilizing current methods of blood component therapy, your one donation can help save three lives.

Every June 14, countries around the world join the World Health Organization (WHO) in celebrating World Blood Donor Day to thank blood donors for their voluntary lifesaving donations, while raising awareness of the constant need to maintain adequate supplies, which can only be accomplished with regular donations by unpaid blood donors. The WHO has designated this year's theme for the worldwide observance as being "Safe Blood for All."

First celebrated in 2004, the June 14 date honors the birthday of Dr. Karl Landsteiner, an Austrian biologist, physician, and immunologist. Dr. Landsteiner developed the classification of blood groups A, B and O and later identified the Rhesus factor (also known as the Rh blood group system), enabling the safe transfer of blood without endangering the recipient. Dr. Landsteiner received the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in 1930.

Here in Greenville, the need in area hospitals for whole blood and its components of plasma, platelets, and red cells requires over 600 donations every single day. At the forefront of local donation efforts is The Blood Con-

nection (TBC), a non-profit organization that traces its roots back to 1962, when the Greenville Blood Assurance Plan began recruiting volunteer blood donors for Greenville County hospitals. The Carolina Blood Center was then formed in 1978 and became the area's prime resource for blood collection and processing. In 2000, its Board of Trustees officially changed their name to The Blood Connection. TBC is now the region's largest independently managed, non-profit blood donation organization, serving about 60 hospitals in South Carolina, North Carolina and Northeast Georgia.

The Blood Connection is now in the 10<sup>th</sup> year of its very popular Lifesaver League blood drive, in partnership with the Greenville Drive, the Asheville Tourists and the Durham Bulls. This year's theme is "Meet Us At The Mound" and in Greenville, that means the donation event happens on the playing grounds of Flour Field! Donors can meet favorite players, receive a shirt and hat and score some pretty cool prizes. Upcoming dates to donate at Flour Field are:

- Tuesday, June 11<sup>th</sup>, 11am-8pm Sunday, July 21<sup>st</sup>, 1-6pm
- Thursday, August 8th, 11am-7pm

# Home Buyers are Optimistic About Homeownership!

When we consider buying an item, we naturally go through a research process prior to making our decision. We ask our friends and family members who have made similar purchases about their experience, we get opinions and insights, and we read reviews online. There's no difference when considering a home purchase!

Most homebuyers start by listening to the news to hear what is being said about the real estate market. They check with family and friends about their experience. They spend time online reading reviews about their desired neighborhood.



The challenge is that comments from the news and those closest to us can contradict the data and reports. One source says one thing, while another source says something completely different.

There is a group of homebuyers that are not allowing comments about an upcoming recession to interfere with their decision to buy a home. According to a survey by *realtor.com*®,

"Nearly 70 percent of home shoppers this spring think the U.S. will enter a recession in the next three years, but that hasn't stopped them from trying to close on a home...Despite the fact that they foresee an economic downturn, they generally expressed confidence that a future recession will be better than 2008 for the housing market."

The report provides more insights from the survey:

- Nearly 30% of the active home shoppers\* surveyed expect the next recession to begin sometime in 2020.
- 56% of shoppers believe home prices have hit their peak.
- 41% believe housing will fare better than 2008.

- 45% of home shoppers feel at least slightly more optimistic about home-ownership.
- 33% reported no impact on their feelings about homeownership.

Homebuyers are aware and making decisions with their eyes wide-open. As the report mentioned,

"The fact that some [36%] home shoppers expect the next recession to be harder on the housing market than the last recession suggests that they are buying homes with eyes wide-open and very sober, if not slightly pessimistic, views of the housing market.

This is a stark contrast to the years leading up to the last recession when 'irrational exuberance' was more common and yet another reason to expect that the next downturn will be very different for the housing market than the last."

# Let go of STRESS for better heath

Stress has become a buzzword these days, to the point of seeming overused and meaningless. However, there is a stunning amount of research showing the harmful effects of stress and specifically chronic stress, which has become an epidemic in our country. A recent Gallup Global Emotions Poll revealed 55% of Americans as having felt a lot of stress the day before...well above the global average of 35%. The U.S. also scored high in respondents who felt worried or angry the day before.

A recent documentary *One Nation Under Stress* by Dr. Sanjay Gupta sought to understand why the U.S. is the only developed country with a *declining* life expectancy and rising mortality rates. The primary factor was a toxic level of stress.

Whether stress stems from traffic. loss of a loved one, illness, work, financial insecurity, political divisiveness or personal relationships, our bodies experience stress with a flood of hormones...a prehistoric "fight or flight" response to threats. A normal part of life, stress is experienced by all of us. But it's chronic stress and our reactions to stress that contribute to emotional and physical health problems such as cardiovascular disease, high blood pressure, inflammation and obesity, as well as declining brain function, poor decision-making, depression and anxiety.

Research reveals proven ways to lessen chronic stress and promote health longevity. The good news is that to regain control and minimize stress requires only 10-15 minutes a day of effort to "reset" your attitude & let go of stress.

Whatever you choose, it should be something that is natural and enjoyable for you. In other words, find a stress-reduction technique that doesn't stress you out!

Here are some quick, easy ways to reduce stress:

• Focus on your breathing. Take long slow, deep breaths while gently releasing your mind from distracting thoughts and sensations.

• **Step outside.** Studies have shown that being in nature or even just looking at images of trees reduces stress.

• Shift your focus. Think of something pleasant, doodle, squeeze a "stress" ball, do some stretches, smile, make a "to do" list.

• **Do gentle stretches.** Stretch your muscles & change positions.

The following are long-term strategies to reduce stress and improve health:

• Exercise. Find an activity you enjoy, even walking a few minutes a day.

• **Create positive thinking.** Learn to catch your negative thoughts, challenge them and change them. This can become a good habit.

• Try yoga, tai chi, or qigong. These practices combine rhythmic breathing with a series of postures or flowing movements for mental and physical benefits.

• Meditate. Choose a meditation form that feels natural to you and practice it daily. You can also try using a meditation app such as Calm or Insight.

• Seek social support. Keeping in touch with friends, family, our pets, and having everyday connections with strangers all provide a sense of community.

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

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
