

Samantha Morin received an AMPLIFY Doctoral Salary Award



Sam Morin's doctoral research explores how movement behaviours – such as physical activity, sedentary time, and sleep – are linked to health outcomes in children and adolescents with inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) treated with Infliximab. Using a mixed-methods approach, her work examines associations between movement and drug levels, daily disease-related wellbeing, and patient and caregiver experiences during treatment. This research aims to inform more holistic care strategies to ultimately improve treatment response, quality of life, and long-term outcomes for youth living with IBD.

Rabia Khan received an AMPLIFY Postdoctoral Salary Award During research training, Rabia has led various projects at SickKids Hospital focused on IBD. Her current research includes assessing the health services using patterns and outcomes of children with IBD and Primary Sclerosing Cholangitis (PSC) in Ontario. This work will contribute to valuable

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IBD, informing patient counselling, identifying those at risk of poor outcomes, and aiding in health system planning for better treatment strategies.


