It was a fantastic opportunity for staff and members from across the country to meet face-to-face and share updates on the work being done!



This award recognizes an outstanding investigator in the early stages of their career. Nominated by their fellow scientists, recipients of the Rising Star Award are innovative leaders who are advancing Crohn's and colitis research in Canada and have made an outstanding contribution to the mission of Crohn's and Colitis Canada.



CIRC's second \$1M PIONEER Grant has been awarded to Dr. Kevan Jacobson and Dr. Genelle Lunken for their study Open Label Multicentre Randomized Dietary Intervention Study in Pediatric Crohn Disease Patients Initiating Anti-TNF Therapy (DISPENSE-T).



The study will look at the benefit of combining nutrition therapy with biologic therapy (Infliximab) in children with newly diagnosed Crohn's disease at CIDsCaNN research sites across Canada. Their goal is to improve the effectiveness of Infliximab through the addition of diet to help control inflammation, reducing the amount of drug therapy required.



Target: 200 antiTNF, 100 UST
