Thank you to everyone who attended our Annual CIDsCaNN Face-to-Face Meeting in Toronto in November.


It was a wonderful opportunity for members and staff from across Canada to gather, and hear updates on the amazing work being done. We appreciate everyone's efforts to be there with us!





Assessment of Mucosal Biochemical and clinical response to Interleukin-12/23 or TNF Inhibitors in biologic-naïve Crohn's Disease

Inclusion criteria: Children age 2-17y with Crohn's disease starting first biologic as antiTNF or UST for luminal Crohn's disease Participating sites: All

Target: 200 antiTNF, 100 UST




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
Congratulations to David Mack, recipient of the Crohn's and Colitis Canada 2023 Research Leadership Award!
