# OUR CITY HAS A HOUSING AFFORDABILITY CRISIS

One out of every four renting households in the District spends more than half its income on rent. Rock Creek West, including Chevy Chase, has the fewest dedicated affordable units in the District -- less than 1 percent of the total. How can we help?

## **BE PART OF THE SOLUTION**

Chevy Chase DC can't solve the problem alone, but we can be part of the solution! Our well-used, but well-worn, Community Center/Library site is up for redevelopment, to include a new state-of the-art community center and library, better and more accessible outdoor recreation/relaxation areas, and a significant amount of housing that would welcome a greater range of incomes, ages, and racial diversity to our neighborhood.


# COMMONS OR CORE, OUR PUBLIC SPACES CAN USE A REFRESH FOR THE 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY

Underground parking for cars that leaves the *outdoor public spaces and gardens for people and activities*, not vehicles.

And new apartment homes that will likely bring our neighborhood increased diversity and inclusion, while we make an important contribution to easing the District's housing crisis.

This won't happen by itself, and it won't be easy. Decision-makers need to hear from YOU that our community wants the full package: Library/Community Center, AND affordable housing.
