from the desk of Board Chair, Brad Butler

Happy summer! My family has certainly enjoyed the sunshine and warm weather. This month, the Owen Brown board tried something new! Mike (our CA representative), Adil (OBCA board member), and myself hosted a casual open forum at the Lake Elkhorn Playground. Several residents came by to chat about issues ranging from environmental stewardship, to traffic calming, to common area maintenance. We plan to do this again, 9:30am on Saturday July 19th. Keep an eye on our social media for updates, and please join us if you can.

The Board focused on setting and refining goals for the year. We also approved our financial statements for the fiscal year that ended April 30th, and closed two architectural violation cases. Those financial statements will be published as part of our annual update, which you will find posted on our website. I'd encourage you to read it to see how we're spending your money and advocating on your behalf, and certainly send us feedback.

Our county council representative's office provided an update on several projects coming to Owen Brown, including safety upgrades to Cradlerock Way and Dobbin Rd, and the new East Columbia Library Park. These are all in various phases of final design, and are funded to start construction sometime in the next year. Howard County DPW also stopped by to tell us about sewer repair projects on the other side of Broken Land Parkway, behind Allview, to try to prevent leaks from exposed pipes like the one that occurred upstream of Lake Elkhorn this Spring.


There is a lot going on in the community, please see the list of OBCA-sponsored events on the opposite page! Soon, we will begin planning OBCA's input to the county & CA budget cycles, and we will engage the other nine villages to renegotiate how we divide up the portion of your annual charge payment to CA that is allocated to village associations. As I've written before, Owen Brown receives a significantly smaller per-capita grant than most other villages due to a parameter in the funding formula that we're seeking to change. This would enable us to host more resident-facing events, support more Owen Brown-facing organizations, or expand our open hours at the community center.

CA Works to Streamline Policies and Related Documents; Lakefront Live Is in Full Swing!

Since my last report, the Columbia Association (CA) Board of Directors has held one meeting on May 29. The new Chair, Collin Sullivan, highlighted that he will place higher emphasis on professionalism, efficiency, and civility at board meetings. I support his efforts and believe they will make board meetings more productive and welcoming for staff, board members, and residents interested in observing the Board.

Representatives from the county provided an update on several sewer maintenance projects. One project is continued work on the sewer line that runs adjacent to Broken Land between Cradlerock and Steven's Forest. You've probably noticed construction efforts there for some time as the county continues to identify exposed portions of the sewer line and works to mitigate the risk of a break. The other is a similar project located in Town Center that will require the closure of the path running from Lake Kittamaqundi to Toby's. These are both responsible and targeted efforts to protect sewer infrastructure as stormwater erosion has exposed these pipes.

The Board continued its efforts to organize CA's policies into a more searchable and up-to-date system. In support of this we approved the consolidation of several different documents into a single document, formally retired some obsolete policy documents, and formalized a system for organizing and updating policies going forward. This is all a paperwork drill to better organize our documentation and, despite some confusion, did not actually alter any of CA's operations.

Over the next few meetings, the Board has asked the staff to present potential changes to our ethics policy, code of conduct, and related governance documents for our consideration. Additionally, the Board will be thinking about the number and nature of the meetings the Board has and whether there are opportunities to conduct our business more effectively while providing better opportunities for resident engagement.

CA's Lakefront Live is in full swing. The kickoff event was a great time. I encourage everyone to check out the calendar of events: https://columbiaassociation.org/lakefront-live/. I hope to see you and some of these events. Additionally, CA hosted our local recognition of Gun Violence Awareness at the Lakefront on June 6th. It included several acknowledgements from CA and local politicians and was a somber time to recognize those who have lost their own lives or loved ones to senseless violence, thank those that draw attention to these issues, and reflect on how we can implement practical solutions that reduce the culture of crime and accessibility of weapons that make criminals and suicide attempts so dangerous while respecting the individual rights that define our society.


