

CA Refines Budget While Emphasizing Strategic Priorities and Facing Increased Insurance Costs

Since my last update, the Columbia Association (CA) Board of Directors held regular board meetings on October 23 and November 13. The primary output of the October meeting was to continue the FY27 Budget process and approve strategic priorities for next fiscal year's budget. Overall, the budget will continue to provide the services and amenities residents expect while the following board approved "strategic priorities" will serve as areas of emphasis to guide the budget:

- Work towards attaining a AAA credit rating for CA, funding long term capital expenditures
- Prioritize maintenance of assets
- Evaluate reducing resident costs
- Evaluate affordability of membership plans, rates and service offerings
- Assess CA's compliance with ADA standards
- Increase access to before/after school programs
- Prioritize grant giving to charitable organizations
- Expand solar installations and evaluate programs to reduce resident utility costs
- Enhance and implement invasive plant and wildlife efforts
- Improve website functionality and increase versatility of GIS tool
- Continue to upgrade and enhance IT systems

The staff and Board will continue to refine the FY27 Budget over the next few months before finalizing it in early 2026. Of note, CA is facing several external constraints: CA anticipates healthcare insurance costs to go up 8.5%, all other insurance costs to increase 10%, and increased supply costs due to tariffs.

The Board also approved an updated President/CEO evaluation process and procedure. This should help the board provide more helpful input to and oversight of CA's leader.

At the November meeting, the board discussed high-level parameters for the FY27 Budget. Those parameters include maintaining the current Assessment Charge rate and cap, standard annual merit increases, and a capital budget of \$15M. These (or modified) parameters will be finalized at our next meeting on December 11. Between the two meetings, the board received a few updates of note:

- The Long Reach Village Center redevelopment led by the Columbia Concepts LLC is working through the county's approval process. There are significant details that still need to be worked out.
- CA CEO provided an update on an internal CA reorganization. These changes should result in greater organizational efficiency but won't be observable to the average resident.
- Representatives from the county shared the current plans for the new Central Library. CA Board members raised several pragmatic issues including the impact the library could have on CA's use of the lakefront and the need for the county to closely engage CA.
- Staff provided an annual briefing on CA's support to the ten village community associations. A substantial amount of your Annual Charge goes to villages with over 16% of that revenue being spent on the ten villages collectively, not including in-kind support.
