VILLAGE ELECTIONS COMING SOON: BECOME A CANDIDATE!

In April, village residents will have the opportunity to elect <u>three</u> Village Board members for a two-year term, beginning on May 1, 2021. These elected volunteers oversee the work of the Association and represent the interests and concerns of the Village to both the Columbia Association (CA) and the County. Candidate Packets will be available at the Owen Brown Community Center or by email beginning **March 1**. Requests for an electronic Candidate Packet should be sent to: **manager@owenbrownvillage.org.**

Each candidate must complete the Declaration of Candidacy Form, which requires the signature of ten members of the Owen Brown Community Association. Candidates also have the option of submitting a 150-word statement and photo. The form must be returned by email or to the Village office no later than 12 p.m. (noon), Friday, March 19, 2021.

OBCA BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

from the desk of Board Chair, Michael Golibersuch

The Owen Brown Board of Directors held our monthly meeting on February 2. At the meeting, representatives from the Columbia Housing Center introduced their new nonprofit which hopes to provide a local rental referral service that promotes racial integration. The Board also made several decisions at the meeting.

The Board made appointments/nominations to two committees. First, the Board voted to appoint three Owen Brown residents to this year's Election Committee which is responsible for providing independent oversight to the upcoming village elections. Second, we also nominated Ed Warner to CA's Watershed Committee where, pending CA's acceptance, he will represent our village's interests in matters related to streams, lakes, and other environmental issues.

The Board approved two letters advocating on behalf of Owen Brown's interests. The first letter, sent to the county and endorsed with the support of a local advocacy group, supported the design plans of the county's proposed East Columbia 50+ Center expansion. The second letter, sent to CA, provided recommendations to CA's budget for fiscal year 2022 (beginning this May). Our input to CA covered ten different items including our concerns regarding CA's proposal to not open Dasher Green pool this coming sum-

The Board also approved additional spending in two areas. We committed money to renovate our community center and make it a more welcoming place in anticipation of fully reopening after the pandemic. Finally, we decided to create several tree-planting projects around Owen Brown. These trees will make Owen Brown a more beautiful and environmentally friendly village. Please be on the look out for announcements on how to volunteer for upcoming tree planting.

CA LOOKS TOWARD OPENING OUTDOOR POOLS; SEEKS LIFEGUARD APPLICANTS

The CA Board should have voted on the proposed FY-2022 budget on February 25th which is after the due date for this article. I will report on the FY-2022 budget in my April article. You can also check the CA Board website

Regarding the Lake Elkhorn dredging project, the dredging portion has been completed. Restoring the pathway is underway and should be completed, depending on the weather, by March.

The search for a new President/CEO for CA continues. Milton Matthews, our current President/CEO, will be stepping down at the end of April. The CA Board hopes to name his successor by the beginning of April.

Restrictions due to the pandemic remain in place. Unless there is a change, these restrictions will be in effect for the upcoming outdoor pool season. The restrictions place limits on the number of people allowed, at any one time, in the pool area. For this reason, a reservation system will be implemented for outdoor pools. As the summer pool season approaches, CA will be posting information on its website. One additional difficulty is lifeguards. We need lifeguards to be able to open the pools. Applications for lifeguard positions are down this year. If you're interested in applying for a summer position with CA, see the openings at

VACCINE INFORMATION

To date, about 15% of Howard County residents have been vaccinated with the COVID-19 vaccine. Residents in all Phases of eligibility who are interested in receiving a vaccine through the Health Department are encouraged to complete a preregistration survey at: https://www.howardcountymd.gov/ Departments/Health/MMAlerts-and-Recalls/COVID -19-Vaccine.

Please note, when you preregister for a vaccine, you will not receive information to schedule an appointment until your Phase group is eligible and there is vaccine available. If you are a member of an eligible group, and you have an appointment, you WILL receive a vaccine. NO ONE who is a member of an eligible group and arrives with an appointment will be turned away. There is no need to arrive early, as this can cause long lines to form. If you are NOT a member of an eligible group at the moment, please DO NOT make an appointment. They can only honor appointments from members of eligible groups at each clinic.
