


Friday, March 19, 2021 was the deadline for declaring candidacy for the 2021 Owen Brown Village Board of Directors election. Residents Robert Golibersuch, Mae Beale and Brad Butler all declared their candidacy for the three open seats on the Village Board. When there is an uncontested election (meaning: the number of qualified nominees is lesser than or equal to the number of Board vacancies to be filled), the Board of Directors is authorized to elect, on behalf of the members, the qualified nominees as Directors. Therefore, at the **Annual Meeting of Members** on **May 4**, 2021, the Village Board will appoint the above-named candidates to a two-year term. OBCA BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

from the desk of Board Chair, Michael Golibersuch

Owen Brown's Board of Directors held our monthly meeting on March 2nd. We had two invited guests. The first was Marty Oltmanns, the director of CA Aquatics, who provided an update on outdoor pools this summer. Of note, in order to mitigate health risks due to the pandemic, pool goers will need to reserve time in advance in order to access the pools. Unfortunately, only 15 of CA's 23 pools will open this summer with Dasher Green being one of the pools that will remain closed this year. Additionally, CA is below is recruiting targets for summer lifeguards – if any residents are interested in serving as a lifeguard please reach out to CA. The second invited guest was Samuel Hahn representing Oakland Mills United. OMU is a newly formed community organization supporting the Oakland Mills High School community supporting a variety of community activities. Please be on the lookout for more information on this organization in the future.

Also, during the monthly meeting, the Board approved our third quarter financial statement. The association is in solid financial health despite the pandemic. Finally, we reviewed several properties with unresolved architectural guideline violations and nominated these violations for potential legal action. We only take this step after several months of unsuccessfully engaging with the property owners to address the violations.

CA is actively looking to fill about 100 lifeguard positions. These team members are essential to opening our pools this summer. If you're interested in applying, visit

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CA APPROVES FY-22 BUDGET WHICH LOOKS TO RESTORING SOME COMMUNITY SERVICES

The CA Board did approve the proposed FY-2022 budget on February 25th. I voted to approve it. This is a budget which starts CA on the road to recovery by restoring some services while still recognizing the impact that the pandemic and recession has on CA and the community. The budget will allow CA to open 15 outdoor pools this summer and to close the Haven on the Lake wellness facility. Both decisions were difficult. Haven on the Lake has not met its benchmarks and staff did not believe that it would be possible to turn the situation around in the next five years. Keeping Haven open in FY-2022 would have cost CA around \$450,000 and the fiscal situation just made that difficult to do.

The CA Board did approve a resolution concerning opening additional outdoor pools if financial, COVID, and the lifeguard situation improves. CA still needs lifeguards. Some of you may have noticed the large banner on the Hopewell pool fence asking for lifeguards. If you're interested in applying for a summer position with CA, see the openings at

In terms of the Capital Budget for FY-2022, it will be \$8M and focused on repairs, maintenance, and safety situations. The Owen Brown Community Center is scheduled for a roof replacement, which is very much needed.
