#### **OBCA BOARD HIGHLIGHTS**

from the desk of Board Chair, Michael Golibersuch

Owen Brown's Board of Directors held our monthly meeting on April 6th. We had two invited guests. The first guest was Nina Basu, the president and CEO of Inner Arbor Trust who provided a briefing on the plans for Symphony Woods – the plans look like they will provide another great amenity for Columbia. The second invited guest was John McCoy from CA's Open Space team. John provided a briefing on the status of streams within the Lake Elkhorn watershed and CA's plans to address the erosion and silt problems. CA is entering into an agreement with a private company to execute a series of stream restoration projects (at no cost to CA lien payers) throughout the watershed. The restoration work will cause temporary disruption to the area, but will provide long-term cost savings and provide a healthier open space. The work is intended to start at the top of the Lake Elkhorn watershed near 108 in Long Reach and make its way downstream - there is no planned work within Owen Brown for at least a couple years.

At our meeting, the Board approved the budget for our next fiscal year which begins on May 1 and runs through next April. Due to financial impacts of the pandemic and reduced income share from CA, Owen Brown will continue to operate on a smaller budget next year compared to most other years. Our cuts are primarily to our newsletter, charitable donations, and events. Finally, we allocated the remainder of our donation budget for the current FY giving \$1,000 to both the Oakland Mills High School Athletic and Fine Arts Boosters.

On one last note, I want to thank Douglas Fox and Patrick Weed whose terms on the Owen Brown Board of Directors ended on April 30<sup>th</sup>. I hope they continue to provide input to our Board and serve as active members of the community. We also welcome Mae Beale as a new board member and look forward to working with her on behalf of our village.
