How to Make a Cancellation

If your child is not attending for the requested day, please notify the service via phone or email. To cancel a booking without incurring fees, the centre must be notified in writing 7 days prior to the requested day occurring or a medical certificate must be provided. Otherwise, the advised fee listed for that day will be charged.

You may be able to receive Child Care Subsidy (eligibility and percentages determined by Centrelink) to reduce your Child Care Fees. Please speak with the Coordinator if you would like further information. Casual fees apply to those families booking their children into Vacation Care after Friday, 22nd June 2018. Fees will be processed through the Debitsuccess system. Parents may elect to be charged the whole amount upfront or fees will be calculated into your fortnightly payment.

Terms and Conditions

By enrolling your child/ren in Vacation Care, you are accepting and are willing to abide by the terms and conditions outlined below:

- All fees are paid either by Debitsuccess fortnightly cycles or for the entire booking upfront.
- All children and parents/guardians must abide by the service's policies and procedures.
- Children will be held responsible for their own belongings.
- Excursions must be booked before the permanent booking closing date. Late bookings will only be accepted if room allows. Bookings for excursions and incursions will cease once the number of children allowed reaches capacity.
- Money will not be taken on excursions, unless otherwise specified.
- All items requested for excursions must be provided or the child will not be able to attend.
- All forms, including excursion consent forms, must be completed in full. Otherwise, they will not be accepted and your child/ren will not be able to attend.
- Fees will only be cancelled according to our Cancellation Policy which is when a minimum of 7 days' notice is given.
- Bookings cannot be swapped inside the 7-day cancellation period and this will only be allowed outside the 7-day period on condition of availability.
- Your child will not be allowed to participate in any swimming activity unless a 'Swimming Ability Form' is completed. No swimming occurs during Winter Vacation Care.

All concerns or queries should be directed to the Coordinator.

Electronic Devices

Electronic devices may be allowed during vacation care. However, children are not allowed to take photos or recordings with these devices. All games etc. on electronic devices must be “G” rated. No movies are to be viewed on individual electronic devices whilst at the service. If a child misuses an electronic device, it will need to be handed into the OSHC office for the rest of the day until the child is going home. Electronic devices are only able to be used by the person who owns them and at assigned periods throughout the day. The service takes no responsibility for the safety and security of these devices. All items should be named/labelled. Mobile phones are to be handed into the OSHC office on arrival and collected on departure.

Food Considerations;

Sherwood State School OSHC is a nut free centre and any products containing nuts will not be able to be consumed whilst at the service. If a child brings these items, they will be put aside by the Responsible Person in Charge and returned to the family when the child is picked up. Replacement food will be provided for your child. Please ensure your child has enough to eat during the course of the day, excluding nut products. Those choosing to consume egg products will need to sit in an assigned area while eating. This is because we have a substantial number of children attending Sherwood State School OSHC with severe allergies to nut and egg products. Breakfast and afternoon tea are provided by the service but all other meals are provided by the child’s family. Dietary needs are accounted for but must be specified on the child’s enrolment form. Families are encouraged to pack extra food for a child who is a fussy eater as this is not considered when shopping in bulk for those who attend the service. Please also be aware that children’s food is not able to be heated in the microwave or have hot water added to it by educators.

Every Day - Please Bring;

What to bring – Every day, a child needs to bring morning tea, lunch, a drink bottle of water, a sun smart hat and closed in shoes. Only those wearing closed in shoes will be allowed to participate in outdoor play, incursions or excursions. Clothing also needs to be suitable, covering the shoulders and appropriate for activities being performed. Younger children need to have spare clothing packed in their bags in case they must change throughout the day. Sherwood State School, Outside School Hours Care takes no responsibility for any lost or damaged property belonging to a child or their family. Therefore, we discourage bringing toys or valuables from home as these are fully the child’s responsibility.

On Excursions - Please Bring;

On excursions – Each child needs to bring a small backpack which is easily carried for the day, a packed morning tea and lunch, a drink bottle of water, a sun smart hat plus wear closed in shoes and a red shirt so they are easily recognised. Clothing must be suitable for the day’s activities. Money is not to be brought on excursions except for the “Seniors Only” one detailed below. Please ensure clothing and all personal belongings are clearly labelled.

Important Days

1st Week

Tuesday 3rd July 2018 –

10:00am – Incursion, BOUCE 4 KIDS:

Bounce 4 Kids are coming to visit fully loaded with gymnastics equipment to provide a workshop consisting of floor work, handstands, cartwheels, rolls, trampoline and bar work, all with qualified and experienced instructors! Children will develop confidence while learning correct skills in a safe environment.

Thursday 5th July 2018 –

8:15am – Excursion, Fort Lytton Historical Military Site and Lota Park:

Children need to arrive at the OSHC centre no later than 8:15am to attend this excursion. To commemorate the ending of World War I, the children will visit the grassy outpost of Fort Lytton, the heritage listed remains of Australia's only surviving moated 19th century fortress, the so-called birthplace of Queensland's military history and one of several forts that were built in the 19th century to protect the country's coastline. The children will join the corporal and sergeant at camp to become recruits for the day. Together with the OSHC staff, they will practice their drills and semaphore exercises before demonstrating them to the General when he comes to inspect the troops. The children will break for morning tea at Fort Lytton and travel to Lota Park for lunch afterwards. Following lunch, they will be able to enjoy the playground at the park and the peaceful surrounds of Moreton Bay. The children will travel by Charter Bus to and from Fort Lytton Historical Military Site and Lota Park. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office. **It is a requirement of Fort Lytton that children wear a broad-brimmed hat and closed in shoes during this excursion. They will also need a drink bottle of water and OSHC requests that they wear a red shirt or similar.**

Wednesday 11th July 2018 –

8:30am – Excursion, United Cinemas-Eldorado 8:

Children need to arrive at the OSHC centre no later than 8:30am to attend this excursion. They will travel by Charter Bus to and from the United Cinemas, Eldorado 8 at Indooroopilly. There will be a choice of two movies for the session and we will notify parents what these are before the holidays begin. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office. ***Children will need to wear a red shirt or similar, sun smart hat and closed in shoes during this excursion.***

Thursday 12th July 2018 –

10:00am – EG Incursions, Interact with Aboriginal Culture:

Australia's Indigenous culture is one of the oldest surviving cultures in the world. In this Virtual Reality experience, local Indigenous Pamagirri guides encourage the children to observe them and learn about the fascinating dances they perform in Tropical North Queensland. The Pamagirri Aboriginal group's presentations that the children will witness are in a full 360 view, held in the Far North Queensland Rainforest, allowing the children to experience this adventure as if they were really there. With interactive exercises and respectful educational discussions about the Aboriginal life pre 1788, the children will be yearning to learn more about Australia's traditional land owners.

Friday 13th July 2018 –

9:15am – Senior Excursion, NAIDOC Family Fun Day:

Children need to arrive at the OSHC centre no later than 9:15am to attend this excursion. This excursion is for **seniors only (those in Year 5 and above. If room permits, those in Year 4 may possibly be invited)**. Activities offered on the day include traditional and contemporary dance, singing and music on 3 performance stages. The children may also visit Indigenous Village or the Community Elders Tent where they can hear dreamtime stories. There are also arts and crafts stalls, activity stalls and face painting stalls to visit. There are sideshow rides at the park plus a playground that children may use. A selection of food is also on offer. This is a fun, interactive way for children to learn about the heritage of Australia through its original people and traditional owners of the land. The senior children will travel by taxi or Maxi Taxi to the NAIDOC Family Fun Day Festival at Musgrave Park, Russell Street, South Brisbane. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office. ***Children will need to wear a red shirt or similar, sun smart hat and closed in shoes during this excursion.***

10:00am – Junior Incursion, Ginger Sport Soccer:

The young children will learn soccer skills and drills taught by professionally trained coaches at the service. This event will motivate the Juniors in preparation for the Soccer World Cup Finals to be played in Russia on the following weekend.
