How to Make a Cancellation

If your child is not attending for the requested day, please notify the service via phone or email. To cancel a booking without incurring fees, the centre must be notified in writing 7 days prior to the requested day occurring or a medical certificate must be provided. Otherwise, the advised fee listed for that day will be charged.

You may be able to receive Child Care Subsidy (eligibility and percentages determined by Centrelink) to reduce your Child Care Fees. Please speak with the Coordinator if you would like further information. Casual fees apply to those families booking their children into Vacation Care after Friday, 13th September 2019. Fees will be processed through the Debitsuccess system. Parents may elect to be charged the whole amount upfront or fees will be calculated into your fortnightly payment.

Terms and Conditions

By enrolling your child/ren in Vacation Care, you are accepting and are willing to abide by the terms and conditions outlined below:

- All fees are paid either in Debitsuccess fortnightly cycles or for the entire booking upfront.
- All children and parents/guardians must abide by the service's policies and procedures.
- Children will be held responsible for their own belongings.
- Excursions must be booked before the permanent booking closing date. Late bookings will
 only be accepted if room allows. Bookings for excursions and incursions will cease once the
 number of children allowed reaches capacity.
- Money will not be taken on excursions, unless otherwise specified.
- All items requested for excursions must be provided or the child will not be able to attend.
- All forms, including excursion consent forms, must be completed in full. Otherwise, they will
 not be accepted and your child/ren will not be able to attend.
- Fees will only be cancelled according to our Cancellation Policy which is when a minimum of 7 days' notice is given.
- Bookings cannot be swapped inside the 7-day cancellation period and this will only be allowed outside the 7-day period on condition of availability.
- Your child will not be allowed to participate in any swimming activity unless a 'Swimming Ability Form is completed. No swimming occurs during Winter Vacation Care.

All concerns or queries should be directed to the Coordinator.

Electronic Devices

Electronic devices including old mobiles and watches may be allowed during vacation care. However, children are not allowed to make phone calls, text, take photos or recordings with these devices. All games etc. on electronic devices must be "G" rated. No movies are to be viewed on individual electronic devices whilst at the service. Mobile Phones are to be handed into the OSHC office on arrival. Children need permission to call or text on their phone. Contact with parents/guardians can be arranged through the OSHC office if needed to protect the privacy of the child concerned plus others at the service. Internet connection will not be made available. If a child misuses any device, it will need to be handed to the supervisor for the rest of the day until the child is going home. Electronic devices are only able to be used by the person who owns them and at assigned periods throughout the day. The service takes no responsibility for the safety and security of any devices. All items should be named/labelled.

Every Day - Please Bring;

What to bring – Every day, a child needs to bring morning tea, lunch, a drink bottle of water, a sun smart hat and closed in shoes. Only those wearing closed in shoes will be allowed to participate in outdoor play, incursions or excursions. Clothing also needs to be suitable, covering the shoulders and appropriate for activities being performed. Younger children need to have spare clothing packed in their bags in case they must change throughout the day. Sherwood State School, Outside School Hours Care takes no responsibility for any lost or damaged property belonging to a child or their family. Therefore, we discourage bringing toys or valuables from home as these are fully the child's responsibility.

On Excursions - Please Bring;

On excursions – Each child needs to bring a small backpack which is easily carried for the day, a packed morning tea and lunch, a drink bottle of water, a sun smart hat plus wear closed in shoes and a red shirt so they are easily recognised. Clothing must be suitable for the day's activities. Money is not to be brought on excursions except when specified for the "Senior Excursion". Please ensure clothing and all personal belongings are clearly labelled.

Food Considerations;

Sherwood State School OSHC is a nut free centre and any products containing nuts will not be able to be consumed whilst at the service. If a child brings these items, they will be put aside by the Responsible Person in Charge and returned to the family when the child is picked up. Please ensure your child has enough to eat during the course of the day, excluding nut products. Those choosing to consume egg products will need to sit in an assigned area while eating. This is because we have a substantial number of children attending Sherwood State School OSHC with severe allergies to nut and egg products. Breakfast and afternoon tea are provided by the service but all other meals are to be provided by the child's family. Dietary needs are accounted for but must be specified on the child's enrolment form. Families are encouraged to pack extra food for a child who is a fussy eater as this is not considered when shopping in bulk for those who attend the service. Please also be aware that children's food is not able to be heated in the microwave or have hot water added to it by educators.

The children will learn why OSHC has taken the steps to presenting a new logo, new uniform and a service mascot during this session. We are very proud of our OSHC centre at Sherwood State School and are looking forward to sharing our news with the children and their families.

Swimming

Thursday, 26th September 2019 and Wednesday, 2nd October 2019:

Swimming: One-hour swim session between 10:30am – 2:30pm

We will take two groups of children over to Sherwood State School pool at separate times for them to enjoy a swimming activity. A Swimming Ability Form will need to be completed for children to participate in swimming. The form outlines the supervision practices for each level of swimming ability. Children must wear swimmers and a swim shirt (rashie) while participating in the swimming activity plus bring a towel to the pool. Sunscreen will be provided. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office.

Important Days



Monday, 23rd September 2019 -

8:45am – Senior Excursion, QLD Police Service Academy and The Coffee Club:

Children need to arrive at the OSHC centre no later than 8:45am to attend this excursion. The senior excursion is for those children in year 5 or above. Senior children will travel by Maxi Taxi/Taxi to the QLD Police Service Academy, Oxley and return via Maxi Taxi/Taxi to The Coffee Club, Sherwood. They will then walk back to the service. The senior children will observe and experience real-life training at the QLD Police Service Academy. This will commence with a parade from the Police Mounted Unit where the children can interact with the police officers and their horses. They may even be able to pat them during this activity. There is also the possibility that the children may meet and greet the police puppies who are training to be police dogs. POLAIR (Police Helicopter) will be visiting on this day. The children will be given a rare opportunity to watch the landing of this police aircraft and may even be able to view it close-up. A police vehicle will be available to sit in and the children can test the sirens. The children will learn what a TASER does and view a demonstration on a mannequin. Police recruits will conduct an investigation on a traffic incident involving an RBT and the children can play with these devices to understand how they work. If time allows, the children may also see an armoured truck on display and view young recruits performing on the obstacle course. At the end of the course, the children can assist the recruits in arresting a mannequin with handcuffs and call in the situation. After a hard day defending crime, the senior students will enjoy a late lunch at The Coffee Club, Sherwood before heading back to the service. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office. Children will need to wear a red shirt or similar, sun smart hat and closed in shoes (no roller shoes) during this excursion.

Wednesday, 25th September 2019 -

8:15am - Excursion, United Cinemas-Eldorado 8:

Children need to arrive at the OSHC centre no later than 8:15am to attend this excursion. They will travel by Charter Bus to and from the United Cinemas, Eldorado 8 at Indooroopilly. There will be a choice of two movies for the session and we will notify parents/guardians what these are a few days before our visit. An additional permission slip will then need to be completed by parents/guardians stating what movie their child is allowed to attend. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office. *Children will need to wear a red shirt or similar, sun smart hat and closed in shoes (no roller shoes) during this excursion.*

Friday, 27th September 2019 -

8:15am – Excursion, Poppy's Chocolate Shop and Hammel Park:

Children need to arrive at the OSHC centre no later than 8:15am to attend this excursion. They will travel by Charter Bus to Poppy's Chocolate Shop, Beenleigh and Hammel Park, Beenleigh before returning on the bus to the service. The children will be able to observe a true Chocolatier at work in the factory and then try their hand at creating real chocolate crackles themselves before taking off to Hammel Park. At the park, the children will enjoy lunch and then take part in games of rugby league, baseball and/or netball. Our educators from the OSHC service who specialise in sport will lead these games. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office. *Children will need to wear a red shirt or similar, sun smart hat and closed in shoes (no roller shoes) during this excursion.*

Thursday, 3rd October 2019 -

8:15am – Excursion, "Naughty Little Kids" Goat Farm and RAAF Amberley Aviation Heritage Centre:

Children need to arrive at the OSHC centre no later than 8:15am to attend this excursion. They will travel by Charter Bus to "Naughty Little Kids" Goat Farm, Peak Crossing and RAAF Amberley Aviation Heritage Centre, Amberley before returning on the bus to the service. The children will take part in milking goats, feeding the goats and then eating gelato made from goat's milk. After their farm experience, the children will have the pleasure of visiting the AAHC at the RAAF Base which displays a variety of aircrafts crucial to Australia's Air Force History. The Royal Australian Air Force is the second oldest independent air force in the world and this exhibition will enrich the children's knowledge of what has been achieved by this branch of the Defence Force. A risk assessment is available for viewing at the OSHC Office. *Children will need to wear a red shirt or similar, sun smart hat and closed in shoes (no roller shoes) during this excursion.*

Time TBA – Incursion, Smashhdown TV Show:

Has your child ever wanted to be on TV? Here is their big opportunity. The "Smashhdown" team is visiting Sherwood. This is a children's sports quiz show that displays segments of games during its broadcast. The crew would like to film the children of Sherwood State School OSHC playing a few different sports on the oval and handball courts. These segments will then feature on the new season of the show. Is your child camera shy? That's okay as there will also be roles for the children in behind the scenes production i.e. camera crew, production design, directing and setting up. There are many different parts to putting a TV Show together and this is a rare opportunity for the children of Sherwood OSHC that will become a life-time memory. If your child is attending on this day, you will need to sign an extra permission slip compiled by Channel 9 and the "Smashhdown" crew for them to take part in this special event and appear on television. Sherwood OSHC – Swimming Ability Form

It is a requirement that this form is completed if you have any children attending the Sherwood State School Pool during Spring Vacation Care 2019. The service will be using the school pool on particular days which are marked on the Vacation Care Program. The shallow end of the pool is 0.85m in depth and the deepest end of the pool is 1.5m deep. The children with limited ability will be restricted to swimming in the shallow end of the pool with an educator accompanying them inside their section and another supervising the area. Markers will be used to display the restricted areas to children.

The middle section of the pool will also have markers placed so the capable swimmers are aware of their area to swim in. However, they may also use the limited swimmers' section if they wish to swim with their friends. An educator will supervise the capable swimmers. The confident swimmers are the only children allowed in the deep end of the pool and again they may use all sections if they would like to swim with their friends. An educator will supervise the confident swimmers. An OSHC Supervisor will also be at pool side in case of emergencies. The educator to child ratio is 1:5 for swimming or water activities.

Both capable and confident swimmers may not interfere with the freedom of those who are swimming in other sections of the pool or they will be asked to leave. All swimmers will wear coloured zinc on their cheeks to differentiate between children's abilities so educators can easily determine what sections of the pool they are allowed to swim in. Please indicate if your child is allergic to zinc or if you prefer they do not wear it. As per sun policy, all children must have sunscreen applied whilst outdoors or swimming in the pool. The appropriate number of educators will attend this swimming activity.

We have 4 classified levels of swimming ability for our vacation care pool use.

- Non-Swimmer: Your child will not be allowed to participate in swimming if they are unable
 to keep themselves afloat without assistance or they become anxious about swimming or
 water.
