New Playground for Evans Park

After reviewing proposals, Board makes selection

At their January Meeting, the Board was presented with 11 designs for a playground to replace the existing playground in Evans Park. The existing playground has deteriorated over the years from heavy use and impacts by sun and weather. Staff has made repairs to the structure over the last year, though it now needs to be replaced. The Board selected a design by Summit Recreation featuring 2 Kompan play structures, one for 2-5 year olds, and one for 6 and up. The project cost is \$60,000 and installation is expectred to be completed this Spring!

Playing a round of disc-golf at Evans Park is also a great way to venture through the park in the Winter.

One of my favorite current activities is to hike or snowshoe through the wooded area in Evans Park. The snow offers fun off-trail exploration opportunities to seek and view wildlife, identify animal tracks, and just breathe in the cold and still silence of the winter landscape. Regardless of how you play in the Winter, just remember to keep doing it, and don't fall into the trap of hiding indoors!
