Transplanting the Pines

Interested in adding some Ponderosa Pine trees to your property? As the District plans for improvements within the recently expanded Casey Jones Park, we have identified areas where some trees will need to be removed to accommodate future park development plans. Our hope is to replant as many of these trees as possible either within the park or the community, so we are offering District residents an opportunity to purchase trees which we will have moved to and planted on your property. All trees are Ponderosa Pine and have a very high survival rate when regularly watered during the first year. Trees are available in a wide variety of sizes and heights and are being offered to District residents at significantly

reduced cost. Cost is determined by the circumference of the trunk with a trunk of 5½ inches or under costing \$450, and a trunk between 5½ - 12 inches costing \$600. Call the Park Office at 303.646.3599 to order your trees today.

Covid-19 District Response Plan Updates



The District continues to encourage the practice of social distancing within the parks and recommends that masks be worn when individuals cannot maintain 6 foot distance from others. Many sport activities continue on District fields, and at this time, all of these activities are private permitted events, not District programs. The District does plan to begin the fall youth sports season on Saturday, September 5th at this time, though an actual start will be dependent upon the conditions at that time as well as whether we have sufficient registrations. At this time, registrations are very low with one week remaining, which may indicate continued parental concerns with youth sport participation during such uncertainty. If the season is cancelled for any reason, full refunds will be given either as an account credit or as a refund for those that request it.

The Park Office remains physically closed to the public, though staff are available to serve you on the phone or by email 9-5, Monday through Friday. The Splashpad will continue to be operated on a reservation based system until further notice. This is due to our concerns with maintaining social distancing in an area where masks should not be worn. Our inability to control the number of people on the splashpad without reservations creates unique risks to park patrons that would utilize the splashpad.
