Pickleball and Artificial Turf Ballfield Project Update

The District recently received three proposals for the construction of the planned new 4-court pickleball complex and artificial turf ballfield project within Casey Jones Park. All bids were well above the anticipated project budget of \$1.6M, so the Board is assessing where costs may be reduced without lessening the project impact and value for the community. They have reached back out to the contractors that submitted bids and have requested their suggestions for how project costs may be reduced. The Board will meet again soon to decide how best to reduce costs and proceed with the project. They will then award the construction contract to the preferred contractor based on total project cost, schedule for completion, and other pertinent factors. Regardless of the contractor selected, construction is scheduled to begin in late February or early March and continue through the summer with a targeted opening in August.

District Looks to Collaborate with Elizabeth Schools to Manage After-School and Summer Day Camp Programs

As the Elizabeth School District faces challenges in staffing in some areas, they reached out to the Park and Recreation District to see if there may be interest in taking over the after-school program at Singing Hills Elementary. After some discussion between the two agencies, EPR District has completed and submitted an application for childcare licensure with the State of Colorado and is preparing to begin managing the program. Executive Director, Mike Barney expressed that the district taking over the after-school program really fits within his view of an effective community service model. He expressed that the school district and teachers do such a great job of educating and caring for our youth during school time, though Park and Recreation agencies should be committed to serving these youth during out-of-school times. He further shared that after-school programs and summer day camps provide park and recreation agencies the opportunity to serve community families with needed childcare options, so it is important that we step up to the table and provide a quality service for residents.

Although the licensing process can take up to two months or longer, both agencies are currently working to develop an interim plan to maintain the program until Elizabeth Park and Recreation District can obtain its license and officially take over. No big changes are planned in regards to the schedule, fee structure, and program logistics, though the EPR District does look forward to adding its own resources to accentuate the fun and continue providing high quality experiences for participants. The EPR District is also planning to manage the Kids Club summer program at Singing Hills and may assume management of the same programs at Running Creek Elementary should the need arise in the future.
