Evans Park Upgrades

As the local interest in Pickleball continues to grow, the District was lobbied to install permanent courts to support players who can't get enough of this game. We have now received the net systems and are looking forward to getting the two courts set up as weather allows. We will also be re-painting court lines in coming weeks. If you have not played yet and want to check it out, paddles and balls are available for use through the District office. Just give us a call and get in the game. The maintenance crew is in the process of installing new lighting at the skatepark to support evening use. The skatepark really proved to be an important hang-out for many local teens through the pandemic, providing an outdoor space to recreate, and we want to help expand those opportunities. The District is reviewing proposals to install a concrete walkway west of the lower soccer field. This will complete a loop extending from the new Town trail to the existing walkway in the park. It will also provide needed ADA access to the lower (West) multi-purpose field.

Casey Jones Park Master Planning and Recreation Center Design

The District has been busy the last two months planning and requesting proposals to begin the design and engineering phase of developing the recently expanded Casey Jones Park. A design firm will be selected on February 19 to begin work on the project. The goal is to develop a master plan for the property based on the recommendations of the planning committee and begin design on specific park elements. An expansion of the campground will be one of the first improvements pursued. This includes roadway improvements, the creation of a new campground loop to the northeast of the existing campground, the addition of 10 RV sites, the addition of 4 Yurts, and the addition of a formal tent camping area. The District has submitted a grant request with GOCO to support this project. The second component to be pursued this year is the schematic design of a community recreation center. Though funding for the construction of a recreation center has not yet been identified, it is indeed time to create the vision for the future facility. In order to better understand the community's vision for a recreation center, the District is creating a Recreation Center Design Committee. This committee, in combination with public surveying of residents, will identify the desired programming for the facility and assist in layout and design planning. It is expected that the committee will begin its efforts in early March and continue through early Summer. We are actively seeking a diverse group of individuals who are interested in serving on the committee and helping us design an incredible community resource. Specific groups we are seeking representation from include: seniors, adults, teens, parents, and the special needs community. Summer Soccer

This is a machine pitch league for players between the ages of 6-8. Practices begin week of April 19 with games on Saturdays on 5/1 through 6/26. All activity takes place in Elizabeth. Majors / Minors Baseball

This program serves youth ages 9-12. Youth are assigned division / team based on pre-season skill assessment.
