Adult Kickball

Returning for its 2nd season, adult kickball is all the rage! Gather your team and join the fun this fall. Teams play on Friday evenings beginning August 2nd and ending on September 20th at Evans Park. Cost is \$250 per team. Teams must have a minimum of 3 female players for each game.

<u>Youth Tackle Football</u> This is an 8vs8 tackle football program for youth in $3^{rd}-6^{th}$ grade. Teams practice up to 3 times per week and play games on Saturdays, travelling to other communities for away games and playing home games in Elizabeth. Games begin in early September and continue through October. Cost is \$100.
