## Recreation Center Design Committee Update

The recreation center design committee has been meeting over the last couple months and is making great progress. A community survey was conducted to learn resident desires and preferences and over 950 responses were received. Over 94% expressed general interest in an Elizabeth Recreation Center, over 65% expressed a willingness to consider a temporary increase in their taxes to help fund construction, and over 80% indicated they would support a tax increase of up to \$250 annually to fund the construction. This valuable input is helping the citizen committee to develop a budget and vision for the facility and guide the architect in the design.

A draft design is expected later this summer and the committee looks forward to sharing it with the community and seeking further feedback. The District Board of Directors has expressed a desire to present voters with a funding initiative in May of 2022 to build the facility based on the survey which indicated such a high level of community support. Let's get this done Elizabeth!

## Visiting the Parks this Summer

As summer arrives and more people flock to the parks to picnic and play, it is important to remember to be a good park steward. Our parks are better when we all pitch in to care for them and we need your help. If you bring your dog, please use a leash at all times, unless in the dog park, and pick up your dog's waste. Nobody likes to step in a pile of it. Please be sure to deposit any and all trash in a garbage can and not on the ground. Teach children that breaking the limb of a tree is not good for the tree if you see it happening. If you are on a trail, stay to the right and always allow for a bike or runner to pass on your left. Despite the heat, do not swim, or allow children to swim in Dragonfly Pond. It's not safe for a number of reasons. For the sake of skaters, remember that the half-pipe is meant for riding, and is not a playground element for small children. If a skater / biker / scooter rider wants to ride it, they have priority. Know that no motorized vehicles are allowed in the parks or on the trails, other than roads and parking areas. E-bikes however are excepted. Lastly, please respect park property and other park users and always be sure to stop and smell, but not pick, the flowers. Thanks for your cooperation, and we really look forward to seeing you soon in the parks.
