An inspiring, fun and flexible school for upper-primary and lower-secondary students in Bali.



Joglo Clubhouse is located very close to Canggu/Pererenan in the quiet neighborhood of Munggu, providing a dynamic educational experience and amazing trips all over Bali. Since our beginnings in 2020, we have catered to a range of situations; if you are looking for a well-rounded education, or you are online, home or world schooling, or simply looking for a fun, short-term community for your child, we will accommodate you.

We believe that it's most important for children in upper-primary and lower-secondary to enjoy their school life, and that's why our approach is centered around positive relationships and dynamic fun, inspiring creative problem-solving and a passion for learning.

The key target outcome at Joglo Clubhouse is not just academic excellence, but also emotional and social well-being - we focus on the importance of mindfulness, respect and kindness. As kids grow with a positive approach to school, academic proficiency comes naturally in their later years - there is no need to put pressure on them at such a young age. Let's encourage our children to enjoy life and have gratitude for the little things.





Our Program

Classic subjects at Joglo Clubhouse include Art, English/Language and Math, with students challenged individually, resulting in optimal learning and engagement. Students are led through personalized programs while working together and enjoying a fun, collaborative environment. Art is central to our program and is encouraged whenever possible.

Additionally, students learn about our beautiful home here in our "Indonesian Language & Culture" program, while also finding inspiration in group and/or individual project-based inquiry in the Arts, Social Studies, and Science, based on the Cambridge International Primary and Lower Secondary curriculum.

For children already engaged with an online / homeschooling program, we provide the space, materials and support to help them achieve the best that they can. Because much of our school-work is personalized already, we can easily fit your child's activities into our scheduling.

The daily schedule runs from 8.30am - 2pm, Monday to Friday. We follow approximately the same calendar as most schools in Bali, with many of the same holidays and term breaks.

Curriculum

The Arts



Art is our favorite subject at the Joglo Clubhouse: it's a time to relax and have fun, explore our creative capabilities, and calm the mind. If inspiration hits us, it can be intertwined with any other subject area. Should a student's passion be all about Art, let's feed that passion!

We are excited to provide opportunities for a wide range of creative activities including sketching and painting, music, dance, crafts, molding/sculpting/carving, performance, language/creative writing, and culinary skills.





Our Arts program also extends to the crucial digital skills of the modern world, such as coding, design, editing, video/film-making and photography. Students also love to demonstrate their amazing creative skills in our Minecraft build challenges. We absolutely appreciate the importance of digital literacy in modern education, and how crucial it is to warn against the dangers of the online world.

English/Language

As literacy is central to students' overall well-being, it is central to our program as a whole and the development of language skills is encouraged at all times. Even within our Social Studies and Science project-based sessions, we look to encourage the growth of linguistic confidence.



There is an English/Language session everyday at the Joglo Clubhouse in which students have the choice of workbook exercises or an personalized online program to perfectly match the students abilities and interests.

Math



Numerical literacy has a positive impact on our overall emotional well-being - see your child develop skills in Math and see them also grow in confidence generally. Math is fun! The trick is to make sure that students are engaged in activities that interest them and are pitched at exactly the right level.

Everyday there is a Math session at the Joglo Clubhouse, and just as with English/Language, the students have a choice of fun workbook exercises, games, or an online platform.





Project-Based Inquiry

At the Joglo Clubhouse, we strive to help the students develop emotional and social well-being. There are always opportunities to explore their outlook on the world as a whole, and evaluate their feelings for these vast concepts. Through an innovative cross-discipline approach to our projects, we inspire further creativity by bringing the Arts into our work whenever we can.

Through Cambridge International Primary and Lower Secondary curriculum Science-based and Social Science-based projects, we endeavor to help students feel comfortable expressing themselves while exploring how things work, how we fit in the world, the vast dynamic of humanity and the natural world, and all the magnificent processes occurring all around us.



Indonesian Language and Culture

Kids of all ages benefit hugely from understanding their position in the world. Well, here we are in Bali, Indonesia, a truly amazing place! In our Indonesian Language and Culture lessons (ILC), we learn the basics of Bahasa Indonesia through fun games and speaking activities, while also learning the great stories of this wonderful country's history and common cultural norms.







FUN!



Let's not forget how important it is to simply have fun! There is nothing more important for children and we at the Joglo Clubhouse recognize the power of "play", whether it's quiet and structured or active and wild! We all learn best when we are enjoying ourselves and children are no exception - both the learning during fun activities, or overall contentment in life.

This is why we run super-fun outings on Fridays. Our students call it...

...Friday Fun-Day!

Our Fridays alternate between "Beach-Days" and occasional "Outings" such as Waterparks, Mountain-biking, Bali Safari & Marine Park, Bali Zoo, Water Sports, Bali Bird Park, Reptile Park. Go-Karting, Ice-skating, Motocross and other sports such as Basketball, Football / Soccer, Racquet Sports.





On Fridays we run a half-day of regular school scheduling, and the other half off we go! Most Fridays we go to the local beach and let the kids run, play games, jump in the surf. Occasionally, if our outing requires it, we take the full day.

And sometimes, if time permits, we treat the kids to a classic kids movie!





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The outings are optional and are held at an additional cost. As we are experts in Bali's best kids attractions, we make it possible to have such incredible fun at a very low cost. The fee for the activities varies, ranging between 300-400k, while the Beach-Day trips are just 50k - there are also optional surf lessons at the beach (300k).



Overnight Trips



Yes, there's more! Once per term we take our students on an <u>amazing</u> trip overnight. These trips include camping and hiking up Mount Batur, SILAS fun-park and rafting, Medewi surf camp, snorkeling in Amed / Lembongan / Menjangan, and waterfalls hiking / platform jumping.

Just like the Friday Fun-Days, these trips are optional and require an additional fee, which varies depending on the destination, around Rph 700,000 - 1,000,000.

Facilities / Technology

Classrooms are fitted with standard classroom equipment and basic stationery and materials are provided. Students should bring a pencil case and their laptop or tablet everyday, but mobile phones are prohibited - the digital device is a key learning tool and students don't always associate mobile phones with learning. Accessing social media, streaming or video gaming is prohibited during study hours (8.30am - 2pm) unless specifically allowed by the teachers. There is a laptop available to borrow, on-premises, and some other devices might be borrowed if available - there is always a workaround. Google (Classroom/Drive) is where materials are stored and used, therefore a Google account is required.





Key Student Outcomes:

Emotional health - accepting and processing our thoughts and feelings. Mindfulness - having awareness for the thoughts and emotions of others. Respect - responding to others with positive intentions. Kindness - thinking about how we can help others. Gratitude - seeing the bigger picture and valuing our position in the world. Enjoyment - building enthusiasm for continued independent learning. Collaboration - working and playing positively with others.

Student Ethos

<u>Electronic Device Policy</u>: Electronic device use is limited to educational / productive purposes only - iPads and laptops are acceptable, while Mobile Phones are prohibited between 8.30am - 2pm.

Joglo Clubhouse is strictly a no-bully zone. Any behavior of an unkind, disrespectful or inappropriate nature, or generally in contradiction with our "Key Student Outcomes" or Electronic Device Policy, is absolutely prohibited. Students who disrupt these values will be given a warning and invited for a guidance session. Should further disruptions occur, the parents will be informed. As described in the "Behavioural Expectations" families (parents/guardians) have the responsibility of helping their child be ready to adhere to Joglo Clubhouse policies, and should the parents need to be contacted more than twice with regards to disruptive behavior, then the child may be expelled from the school.

Attendance & Holidays

The Joglo Clubhouse program runs from Monday to Friday 8.30am - 2pm. If a student will be absent, dropped off late or picked up early, a guardian should inform the staff/teachers, for concern of the child's safety. If someone other than the parents/guardians are sent to pick up your child, please inform the staff/teachers. In addition, students may not exit the premises between 8.30am - 2pm without permission from teachers/staff or parents - communicated clearly with the school leaders/teachers - due to the potential safety risks of such an incident.

Location

The Joglo Clubhouse is situated in a quiet neighborhood on a beautiful property with plenty of space for playing and running, a big swimming pool, an amazing Bale, large classrooms, and a fun little elevated "tree-house".

Fees



For more flexibility, we offer weekly, termly and yearly rates.

Weekly:

Rph 2,000,000

- If there is a one-day holiday during the week, the rate is Rph 1,600,000.
 - The weekly rate applies to five consecutive days, from Monday to Friday. If a child misses any number of days for personal or medical reasons, the days missed cannot be exchanged or refunded.

Termly:

- Each term differs in length, so the fee varies:

Term 1 - Rph 15,000,000 Term 2 - Rph 15,000,000

- Term 3 Rph 16,000,000
- Term 4 Rph 16,000,000

Term 4 - Npr 10,000,000

Yearly:

Rph 58,000,000

There are no refunds given for time/days missed (due to illness or behavioral issues) unless the absence is more than half of a term, and is accompanied by a doctor's certificate, full diagnosis and/or medical test results, in which case 50% of the term fee may be returned.

Additional expenses

The weekly Friday outings and termly overnight trips are <u>optional</u> and not included in the fee. The budget for the weekly activities is approximately 300-400k per student per week (on average it is 300k) apart from the beach outings which are 50k per student per week. In addition, the cost of the overnight excursions varies, at approximately Rph 700k - 1,000,000 per student per trip. During these outings / trips, basic snacks and/or lunches will be provided, while extra expenses, such as additional snacks or drinks, are not. It is advised that students have some pocket money for such expenses.

Every day a lunch is available which is <u>not included</u> in the fee - a menu is available for pre-order and payment is made at least one week prior, in





addition to and/or alongside the weekly/termly/yearly enrollment fee. Snacks are also available for purchase at the school.

Educational materials - basic stationary (pens, pencils, paper, folders, etc) and Art or Science supplies of a reasonable amount are included in the fee. If a student is continuously using large quantities of items such as paints and canvases, then the student/family may have to cover the costs. The fee does not include a tablet PC or laptop, though it may be possible to borrow such an item while on the premises.

Examinations or any further curricular registrations are not included in the fee. After-school supervision is available from 2-3pm at 50k per day.

Meals / Snacks

If students/families choose not to buy the lunch options available, or the snacks available for purchase on-site, then students must bring their own lunches and snacks. Students should eat a full and healthy low-sugar breakfast just before coming to school in the morning, and they must eat full and healthy low-sugar lunches and snacks, in order to maintain the required energy levels throughout the day. Any issues arising from diet are discussed with parents/guardians

Behavioral Expectations

There are specific behavioral expectations of the teachers, students and families. The teachers/staff are responsible for guiding the students through the "Key Student Outcomes" as well as towards achieving academic success, while cultivating a setting that encourages positive growth and emotional well-being. The students are responsible for being positively and actively involved and productive in activities, respectful of and adherent to the "Student Ethos", and developing an independent approach to their studies and personal growth, during formal learning activities as well as break times. Families are responsible for helping their child(ren) be ready to fulfill these requirements.

Should there be any serious issues with a student's behavior or approach to the school's activities, then the student may be removed from the group dynamic and/or asked to be picked up/sent home for the day. The teachers will always communicate clearly and discreetly with the families regarding any such issues, and if the issues persist then the student may be refused entry to the school in subsequent academic terms, or in





extreme cases refused continued entry immediately following the issues/incidents.



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Health & Safety





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All students must have health insurance or coverage and parents / legal guardians must provide information regarding preferences for hospitals or other required conditions in the case of an emergency. Parents must explain any current or previous medical or developmental conditions, and release responsibility for any injury or illness that may be acquired while on the premises.

The premises are cleaned and sterilized daily. To safeguard the school against the spreading of illnesses, if a student shows symptoms of illness, they are strongly encouraged to go/stay home to recover. If a student develops symptoms during the day at school then he/she will be isolated and a guardian will be asked to pick him/her up. Such symptoms include persistent coughing, runny nose, sneezing, sore throat, headache, stomach-ache, nausea, muscle ache, diarrhea, shortness of breath and tiredness, or a temperature of 37.5C or more. Any current or previous diagnosis of illness contracted by a student must be described in full in order to protect the school as a whole. In the case of serious illness, a doctor's certificate and/or test results may be required to allow the student to subsequently re-enter the school.
