Joglo Clubhouse School is located very close to Canggu/Pererenan in the quiet neighborhood of Seseh, providing a fun educational experience and amazing trips all over Bali. Since our beginnings in 2020, we have catered to a range of situations; if you are looking for a well-rounded education, or you are online, home or world schooling, or simply looking for a fun, short-term community for your child, your children are more than welcome.

We believe that it's most important for children to enjoy their school life, and that's why our approach is centered around positive relationships and dynamic fun, inspiring creative problem-solving and a passion for learning.

The key target outcome at Joglo Clubhouse is emotional and social well-being - we focus on the importance of mindfulness, respect and kindness. As kids grow with a positive approach to school, academic proficiency comes naturally in their later years - there is no need to put pressure on them at such a young age. Let's encourage our children to enjoy life and have gratitude for the little things.



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Our Program - A Fun, Balanced, Global Education

Classic subjects at Joglo Clubhouse include Art, English/Language and Math, with students always actively collaborating and challenged individually, resulting in optimal learning and engagement. The Arts are central to our philosophy of positive growth and harmony, and encouraged always.

Additionally, students learn about our beautiful home here in our "Indonesian Language & Culture" program, while also finding inspiration in group and/or individual project-based inquiry in the Arts, Social Studies, and Science, based around the Cambridge International Primary curriculum.

For children already enrolled in an online or homeschool program, we provide the space, materials and support to help them achieve the best that they can. Because much of our school-work is personalized already, we can easily fit your child's activities into our timetable.

The daily schedule runs from 8.30am - 2/3pm, Monday to Friday, classes are short (30 minutes) to keep the experience flowing nicely. We follow a weekly format - no terms or semesters, with "breaks" during major national or Balinese holidays.

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Curriculum

The Arts



Art is our favorite subject at Joglo Clubhouse School: it's a time for kids to relax and have fun, explore their creative capabilities, and calm the mind. Artistic passion plays a central role in emotional well-being, and if inspiration hits us, it can be weaved in with any other subject area. Should a student's passion be all about Art, let's feed that passion. If not, let's see if we can find it!

We are excited to provide opportunities for a wide range of creative activities including sketching and painting, music, dance, crafts, molding/sculpting/carving, performance, language/creative writing, and culinary skills. Our Art teachers are vastly talented and love guiding the students through a wonderful variety of projects, and our piano teacher is incredibly popular (she's a genius!).

Our Arts program also extends to the crucial digital skills of the modern world, such as coding, design, editing, video/film-making and photography. We absolutely appreciate the importance of digital literacy in modern education, and how crucial it is to warn against the dangers of the online world.



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English/Language

As literacy is central to students' overall well-being, it is central to our school program as a whole and the development of language skills is encouraged at all times. Within all our classes, we always look to encourage the growth of linguistic confidence through fun participation.



There is an English/Language session everyday at the Joglo Clubhouse in which students have access to fun classroom activities and an online program - both individualised to suit the students abilities and interests.

Math



Numerical literacy inevitably has a positive impact on overall well-being - see your child develop skills in Math and see them also grow in confidence generally. Math is fun! The trick is to make sure that students are engaged in activities that interest them and are pitched at exactly the right level.

Everyday there is a Math session at Joglo Clubhouse School, and just as with English/Language, kids have access to fun classroom exercises, games, and a personalized online platform.

Social Studies & Science

Through fun project-based inquiry, Joglo Clubhouse School endeavors to help students feel comfortable expressing themselves while exploring how things work, how we fit in the world, the vast dynamic of humanity and the natural world, and all the magnificent processes occurring all around us.



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We understand the importance of helping the students develop emotional and social well-being. There are always opportunities to explore their outlook on the world as a whole, and evaluate their feelings for these vast concepts. Through an innovative cross-discipline approach to our projects, we strive to inspire further creativity by bringing the Arts into our work whenever we can.



Indonesian Language and Culture

There is so much wonder in our home here - to be able to speak to the local people, learn the stories of this beautiful country, and understand this wonderful way of life is a privilege that we simply must tap into!



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FUN!



We simply can't leave out the fun that the kids have in our program! Everyday we are outside playing games, having fun in the classroom, and of course, going on amazing trips around Bali!

Just before lunch everyday, we go even further in our quest to provide more student-centered experiences by allowing the kids to engage in whatever activity they feel drawn to at the time, in our "Free Session". It can be more arts, piano, indoor games, reading, outdoor fun, or even some creative world-building in Minecraft Education Edition - it's up to them!

Friday Fun-Day!

Our Fridays alternate between "Beach-Days" and occasional "Outings" such as Waterparks, Mountain-biking, Bali Safari & Marine Park, Bali Zoo, Water Sports, Bali Bird Park, Reptile Park, Go-Karting, Ice-skating, Motocross and other sports such as Basketball, Football / Soccer, Racquet Sports.





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On Fridays we run a half-day of regular school scheduling, and the other half - off we go! Most Fridays we go to the local beach and let the kids run, play games, jump in the surf. Occasionally, if our outing requires it, we take the full day!

These outings are optional and are held at an additional cost. As we are experts in Bali's best kids attractions, we make it possible to have such incredible fun at a very low cost. The fee for the activities varies, ranging between 300-400k, there are also optional surf lessons at the beach (350k).



Overnight Trips



Wait, there's more???

Once per term we take the kids on an amazing trip overnight somewhere in Bali. These trips include camping and hiking up Mount Batur, SILAS fun-park and rafting, Medewi surf camp, snorkeling in Amed / Lembongan / Menjangan, and waterfalls hiking / platform jumping.

Again, like the Friday Fun-Days, these school trips are optional and require an additional fee, which varies depending on the destination, around Rph 700,000 - 1,000,000.



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Key Student Outcomes:

- Emotional well-being - accepting and processing our own thoughts and feelings.
- Mindfulness - having awareness for the thoughts and emotions of others.
- Respect - responding to others with positive intentions.
- Kindness - thinking about how we can help others.
- Gratitude - seeing the bigger picture and valuing our position in the world.
- Enjoyment - building enthusiasm for continued independent learning.
- Collaboration - working and playing positively with others.
- Confidence - believing in ourselves, within ourselves.

Electronic Device Policy

Electronic device use is limited to educational / productive purposes only - tablet PCs and laptops are acceptable, and if a student doesn't have a tablet or laptop, there may be a device available to borrow, on-premises. Accessing social media, streaming or video gaming is prohibited during school hours (8.30am - 3pm) unless specifically allowed by a teacher.

Mobile phones are prohibited during school hours (8.30am - 3pm). The digital device is a key learning tool and students don't always associate mobile phones with learning. Students may bring a mobile phone on to the premises but it must be turned off and kept in their bag. If a student needs to contact a parent/guardian, this can be done via the school WhatsApp account. If the parent gives explicit permission for their child to contact them using their own phone, this can be done under isolated supervision.

Student Ethos

Joglo Clubhouse is strictly a no-bully zone. Any behavior of an unkind, disrespectful or inappropriate nature, or generally in contradiction with our "Key Student Outcomes" or "Electronic Device Policy", is absolutely prohibited. Students who disrupt these values will be given a warning and invited for a guidance session. Should further disruptions occur, the parents will be informed. As described in the "Behavioural Expectations" (below) families (parents/guardians) have the responsibility of helping their



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child be ready to adhere to Joglo Clubhouse policies, and should the parents need to be contacted more than twice with regards to disruptive behavior, then the child may be expelled from the school without eligibility for a refund or exchange.

Attendance

The Joglo Clubhouse School/Holiday program runs from Monday to Friday, 8.30am - 3pm. If a student will be absent, dropped off late or picked up early, a parent/guardian should inform the school, for concern of the child's safety. If someone other than the parents/guardians are sent to pick up your child, please inform the school. In addition, students may not exit the premises between 8.30am - 2pm without permission from school or parents, communicated clearly with the school leaders/teachers, due to the potential safety risks of such an incident.

Location

The Joglo Clubhouse is situated in a quiet neighborhood on a beautiful property with plenty of space for playing and running, a big swimming pool, large classrooms, and a fun little elevated "tree-house".

The school calendar follows a weekly format - there are no terms / semesters.

- Breaks occur during major National/Balinese holidays.
- Every week is five days (Monday to Friday)
- No day off for National Holidays (on Sept 16, Apr 18, May 1, May 12, May 29).



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Fees

Weekly Fee - Rph 2,300,000

Part-time: five days (weekly fee) spread over two consecutive weeks.

- Snacks/lunches are included.
- Friday beach days are included, and other Friday outings are subsidized.
- Students may come for one free trial day at the school - if it occurs on a Monday and the student will continue for the rest of the week, the weekly rate will be applied with a 20% discount.
- Supervision begins at 8.30am and finishes at 3pm. Classes run from 9am - 2pm.
- There is a 15% sibling discount (applied to all siblings).
- Fees are paid up front.
- For the part-time option, the (5) chosen days of attendance (over the two weeks) must be confirmed to the school before attendance begins.
- Please note that the fee structure is subject to change - please confirm with our team on WhatsApp or email.

Long-Term Enrollment

Weekly fee of Rph 2,300,000 multiplied by the number of weeks, then the discount is applied.

Beyond 12 weeks - 30% discount applies.



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- The discounts above only apply to consecutive weeks. If there are school-administered breaks within the requested enrollment period, attendance will continue immediately after the breaks.
- The refund rate is 65% of the fee that was paid, and is subject to the following conditions:
 - There are no refunds or exchanges given for time/days missed due to illness, personal or behavioral issues during the current week in question (if the school is informed of, or determines, the absence from the Sunday beforehand onwards).
 - In case of a medical emergency, if the absence is accompanied by a doctor's certificate, full diagnosis and/or medical test results, then an exchange for a future enrollment date can be applied for, or a refund can be calculated depending on the number of days absent (not including the day the school is informed of the absence). A daily refund rate of 65% of the fee that was paid applies (cash or local bank transfer only).
 - For future absences (in subsequent weeks), if the school is informed by the Sunday beforehand, then a refund or exchange can be administered. A daily refund rate of 65% of the fee that was paid applies (cash or local bank transfer only).
 - For full-time students, an exchange can only be applied to the week immediately following the current enrollment period (indicated on the invoice/receipt). For part-time students, an exchange can only be applied either within, or in the week immediately following, the current enrollment period (indicated on the invoice/receipt).
 - In order to ensure availability, the school must be informed of the proposed dates of exchange by the Friday before the week in which they are applied for.
 - Exchanges are subject to availability and can only be applied to the same child.

Additional expenses

The weekly Friday outings and termly overnight trips are optional and not included in the fee, but they are subsidized in the fee (Rph 50,000). The



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budget for the weekly outings is approximately Rph 300,000 - 400,000 per student per week (on average it is Rph 300,000).

The cost of the overnight trips varies, at approximately Rph 700,000 - 1,000,000 per student per trip. During these outings / trips, basic snacks and/or lunches may be included in the price, while extra expenses, such as additional snacks or drinks, are not. It is advised that students have some pocket money for such expenses.

Snacks are served at 10am and 2pm - fruit and pancakes, and lunch is served at 12pm. Other snack foods are available for purchase at the school. Students may bring their own food if they wish (but will follow the same schedule for snack-time and lunch-time).

Educational materials - basic stationary (pens, pencils, paper, folders, etc) and Art or Science supplies of a reasonable amount are included in the fee. If a student is continuously using large quantities of items such as paints and canvases, then the student/family may have to cover the costs. The fee does not include a tablet PC or laptop, though it may be possible to borrow such an item while on the premises.

Examinations or any further curricular registrations are not included in the fee.

Meals / Snacks

If a student chooses not to eat the lunch and snack options available, then students must bring their own lunches and snacks. Students should eat a full and healthy low-sugar breakfast just before coming to school in the morning, and they must eat full and healthy low-sugar lunches and snacks, in order to maintain the required energy levels throughout the day. Any issues arising from diet are discussed with parents/guardians.

Facilities

Classrooms are fitted with standard classroom equipment and basic stationery and materials are provided. If any student wilfully damages any part of the premises or equipment, the parent/guardian will be required to reimburse the total value of the damage done, or original price of the item.



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Behavioral Expectations

There are specific behavioral expectations of the teachers, students and families. The teachers/staff are responsible for guiding the students through the “Key Student Outcomes”, while cultivating a setting that encourages positive growth and emotional well-being. The students are responsible for being positively and actively involved and productive in activities, respectful of and adherent to the “Student Ethos” and the “Electronic Device Policy”, and developing an independent approach to their studies and personal growth, during formal learning activities as well as break times. Families are responsible for helping their child(ren) be ready to fulfill these requirements.

Should there be any serious issues with a student’s behavior or approach to the school’s activities, then the student may be removed from the group dynamic and/or asked to be picked up/sent home for the day. The school always communicates clearly and discreetly with the families regarding any such issues, and if the issues persist then the student may be refused entry to the school in subsequent weeks, or in extreme cases refused continued entry immediately following the issues/incidents.

Any days/classes missed due to behavioral issues (including but not limited to the situations described above) observed and determined at and by the school, will not be eligible for refund or exchange.

Health & Safety

Parents must explain any current or previous medical or developmental conditions, or dietary requirements. Failure to do so may result in the student’s immediate removal from the school. Parents also release responsibility for any injury or illness that may be acquired while on the premises that occurs as a result of student negligence.

The premises are cleaned and sterilized daily. To safeguard the school against the spreading of illnesses, if a student shows symptoms of illness, they are strongly encouraged to go/stay home to recover. If a student develops symptoms during the day at school then he/she will be isolated and a guardian will be asked to pick him/her up. Such symptoms include persistent coughing, runny nose, sneezing, sore throat, headache,



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stomach-ache, nausea, muscle ache, diarrhea, shortness of breath and tiredness, or a temperature of 37.5C or more.

Any days/classes missed due to health conditions (including but not limited to the symptoms described above) observed and determined at and by the school, will not be eligible for refund or exchange.

Any current or previous diagnosis of illness contracted by a student must be described in full in order to protect the school as a whole. In the case of serious illness, a doctor's certificate and/or test results may be required to allow the student to subsequently re-enter the school.
