- Continued our support of the Aptus Charity Golf Classic 2024 through sponsoring a hole and active tournament participation.
- Supported the planning of the Annual General Meeting by inviting the keynote speaker, lan Brown, journalist, and author of The Boy in the Moon: A Father's Search for His Disabled Son. lan shared a heartfelt discussion about his journey with his son, Walker and remained afterwards to engage individually with both families and staff members.
- Actively participated in sessions to reimagine the Adult Day Programming (ADP) at
 Aptus with the provincial government's Journey to Belonging long-term vision for
 developmental services. FAC members provided valuable input and insights on
 priorities and challenges for families to help shape the future of ADP.
- Through active monitoring of the developmental services sector, highlighted community information and presentations of interest to all Aptus families.
- Provided input into the creation of the Aptus Family/Guardian Satisfaction Survey.
- All members of the Leadership Team helped support the 45th Anniversary Fundraiser.
- Offered informative updates and shared information through regularly scheduled FAC meetings.

The FAC remains deeply committed to representing the "Voice of Families"—continuing to work collaboratively with Aptus senior management to improve the present and shape the future.

Adult Day Services

Aptus is celebrated for its unwavering commitment to excellence, and our Adult Day Program is a prime example of this dedication. Consistently lauded by both participants and their families, our program not only meets but exceeds the best practices and vision outlined in the MCCSS's Journey to Belonging framework. The heart of our program is choice - each individual's preferences are at the forefront, guiding us as we support them in exploring new interests and pursuing meaningful community connections. We're continually evolving and evaluating progress to ensure that every participant is on a path to greater happiness and growth. Regular feedback from individuals, families, and staff is central to continuous quality improvement, refining our approach and enriching the lives of those we serve.



Supportive Living

At Aptus, we believe that everyone deserves a place to call home—a sanctuary where they can relax, pursue passions, and share joyful moments with their peers and loved ones. Our program offers just that across a range of living environments, including eight homes, a six-plex apartment building, and two condominium units, providing 59 adults with round-the-clock support. But our care doesn't stop at basic needs. We're dedicated to fostering independence, personal growth and a sense of belonging. Individuals engage in a variety of activities, including meal planning, grocery shopping, cooking and baking, enjoying nature walks, participating in gardening, volunteering, socializing with friends and outings in the community. This holistic, compassionate support helps individuals not only live but truly thrive.

Children's Day Progam

For over four decades, Aptus has been proud to partner with the Toronto District School Board as part of the Education and Community Partnership Program (ECPP), and since 2008, we've expanded our reach with a dedicated school in York Region in partnership with the York Region District School Board. Our mission remains the same: to empower and support children and young adults ages 5 to 21 to reach their fullest potential.

Our tailored program supports are designed with each individual in mind. We focus on enhancing communication, building self-confidence, fostering new skills, and encouraging socialization and friendships. Where possible, we aim to prepare students for smooth integration into mainstream classrooms, paving the way for a future full of possibilities.

Our team of dedicated professionals works closely with students, providing individualized care and support to ensure each one flourishes. During the summer months, students enjoy a camp-style experience that continues to nurture growth and development. At Aptus, we're committed to creating an environment where every student has the opportunity to thrive, learn, and build a foundation for success.

Making A Difference Is What We Do Best!

"I LOVE IT!": WM Finds Belonging at Aptus

When WM, a person supported, moved into her new Aptus home in the summer of 2022, she was searching for something many of us take for granted: a place where she could feel safe, accepted, and free to be herself.

In previous homes, WM struggled with isolation and conflict. "She was unhappy," says her sister, adding that when WM visited her sister's home, she was reluctant to return. She wanted more responsibility and more opportunities to be out in the community.

Everything began to change with the move to her new residence. WM now shares a warm, welcoming home with peers—people she now calls friends. "I love it!", she says. "I have my own washroom. I have my own space. There's a swing in the backyard where I sit with my friends. They all accepted me."

The transition was carefully and compassionately planned. "Aptus didn't rush the move," says Tina Kavarana Program Consultant with Aptus. "We trained the new team, brought familiar staff to support continuity, and made sure the environment matched WM's needs. She now lives in a place where she truly feels at home."

WM especially enjoys the balance of privacy and connection. "My friends and staff are my favourite part. I can join them in the living room or stay in my room and watch my favourite show. I can make my own choices without other people bothering me." Her relationships are flourishing—including a special friendship with one of her housemates, with whom she enjoys watching TV and sitting outside.

WM is also thriving in Aptus's Adult Day Program, where she participates in outings, activities, and music therapy. "We went bowling and had snacks—so much fun," she says. "I'm proud of myself for achieving my goals. I've been to the CN Tower, Apple Town, strawberry picking, and even fancy restaurants. I'm very proud too that soon I will try to enroll in a college to achieve my education goals."

With strong relationships at home and in the community, WM is growing more confident and independent every day. "Her risk behaviours have gone down," as reported by Tina her program consultant. "There are fewer incidents, and she's more emotionally regulated. During programming, such as music therapy or researching programs, she no longer needs constant clinical support—she trusts her peers and staff. While WM's risk behaviours have reduced we acknowledge that it will not always be perfect hence, our goal is to be consistent with our approach as it plays a role in continued success."

For her sister, the change is profound. "It's a great relief. She's no longer sullen or resistant—she's affectionate, cheerful, and settled. It was incredibly painful to put her into care, but now I can say with confidence: she's in the absolute best place for her to thrive." And WM feels that too. "I feel like a princess here," she says. "I feel like I belong. My peers are like family. I love my sister, my dad, and my brother-in-law—they are my strong support—but seeing my peers every day helps me feel important."

At Aptus, WM is not just surviving—she's blossoming. As her sister puts it: "The happier she is, the more she truly shines."

At Aptus, we draw on the strength of our interdisciplinary team, our many years of collective experience and our collaboration with the individual and their family to help individuals create the life that they want. We know that together we are on a journey of continuous improvement, learning and growth.


