

Affirmative Sentences (Present Simple - 'To Have')

- I have a new backpack.
- You have a great idea.
- He has a big house.
- She has a beautiful garden.
- It has a strong engine.
- We have tickets for the concert.
- You have a busy schedule.
- They have a lovely dog.

Negative Sentences (Present Simple - 'To Have')

- I don't have a car.
- You don't have enough time.
- He doesn't have a computer.
- She doesn't have a smartphone.
- It doesn't have a tail.
- We don't have any plans tonight.
- You don't have enough money.
- They don't have a solution.

Interrogative (Affirmative Sense - 'Does he have...?')

- Do I have the correct answer? Don't I have the correct answer?
- Do you have any questions? Don't you have any questions?
- Does he have a bike? Doesn't he have a bike?
- Does she have a piano? Doesn't she have a piano?
- Does it have a name? Doesn't it have a name?
- Do we have enough food? Don't we have enough food?
- Do you have any questions? Don't you have any questions?
- Do they have a place to stay? Don't they have a place to stay?
