**1 Page Arizona** A4

Page sits atop Manson Mesa and overlooks the 186-mile long lake, the dramatic Glen Canyon Dam and the surrounding canyons, arches and historical Native ruins. A mild climate year-round makes Page the perfect place for visiting the Grand Circle sites, and neighboring Navajo Nation.

**4 London Bridge at Lake Havasu** A4

**5 Grand Canyon Caverns on Route 66** A4

The Grand Canyon Caverns, located a few miles east of Peach Springs, Arizona, lie 210 feet below ground level. They are among the largest dry caverns in the United States. Dry caverns comprise only 3% of caverns in the world. Because of the lack of water, stalagmites and stalactites are rare in the caverns.

**6 Grand Canyon West and Glass Skywalk** A4

Walk among the clouds at the Grand Canyon Skywalk. Experience the Grand Canyon like never before. This glass, horseshoe-shaped bridge enables visitors to walk beyond the canyon walls at Grand Canyon West, suspending them 4,000 feet above the riverbed. Take a helicopter ride into the canyon along the Colorado River and then visit the famous Guano Point.

**8 Monument Valley Tribal Park** A4

Experience of the most majestic - and most photographed - points on earth. This great valley boasts sandstone masterpieces that tower at heights of 400 to 1,000 feet, framed by scenic clouds casting shadows that graciously roam the desert floor. See the famous setting of John Ford's western movies.

**9 World Famous Meteor Crater** A4

The Meteor Crater in Arizona is a really fascinating natural wonder! It was created around 50,000 years ago when a giant meteorite collided with the Earth's surface, leaving a huge impact crater that's almost a mile wide and about 550 feet deep. Visitors from all over the world come to see the crater.

**16 Sunset Crater & Wupatki National Monuments** A4

The Sunset Crater landscape will capture your imagination with its wonderful and violent geologic history. Walk the trails, drive through the monument, or stop at the scenic overlooks. Wupatki National Monument preserves pueblos once inhabited by ancestors of the Hopi and Zuni people, amid red rocks and prairies.

**10 Hubbell Trading Post National Historic Site** A4

Enter the oldest, continuously operating trading post on the Navajo Nation. As your eyes adjust to the dim lighting of the "bulpen" you might catch the trader negotiating a deal with a Native American artist for their art. History happens every day at the historic authentic Indian trading post - the Hubbell Trading Post.

**17 Lowell Observatory** A4

Lowell Observatory is an amazing place for anyone who loves astronomy and the wonders of the universe. Founded in 1894 by Percival Lowell, it has a long fascinating history of discovery and innovation in astronomy. All are welcome. **11 Canyon de Chelly National Monument** A4

This vast park in northeastern Arizona, on Navajo tribal lands is a wonder to behold. Its prominent features include Spider Rock spire, about 800-feet tall, and towering sandstone cliffs surrounding a verdant canyon. Inhabited by several Native American peoples for millennia, the area is dotted with prehistoric rock art.

**18 Painted Desert & Petrified Forest National Park** A4

Over 200 million years ago this was a humid forest with winding rivers and streams. As the trees died they were washed into the swamps and buried beneath volcanic ash where the woody tissue was replaced by minerals which added a kaleidoscope array of colors and preserved details of the wood.

**12 Antelope "Slot" Canyon & Horseshoe Bend** A4

Antelope Canyon has become one of the most photographed slot canyons in the world. Known for their incredible rock formations, colors and lights. Horseshoe Bend is a horseshoe-shaped incised meander of the Colorado River located near the town of Page, Arizona. Visit both and stay overnight and dine in Page.

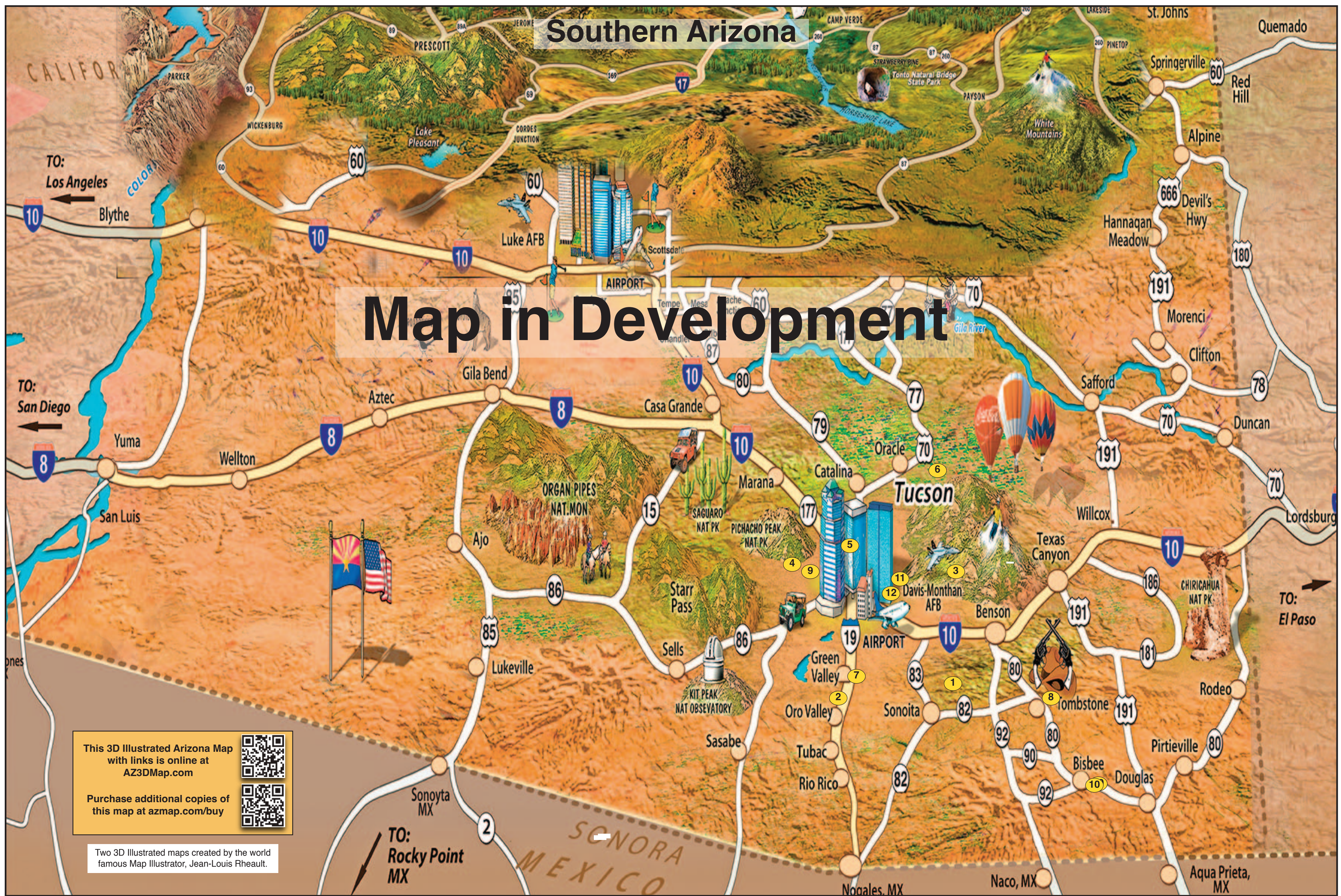

**1** Kartchner Caverns State Park **A4**

**2** Mission San Xavier del Bac **A4**

Mission San Xavier del Bac is also known as the White Dove of the Desert. The del Bac part of its name is Tohono O'odham, meaning place where water appears. The mission was in an area of natural springs and the Santa Cruz River. The date of 1797 found above the sacristy is believed to be the finish date of San Xavier.

**3** Pima Air & Space Museum **A4**

Pima Air & Space Museum, located in Tucson, Arizona, the world's largest non-government aerospace museums. The museum features a display of nearly 400 aircraft spread out over 80 acres on a campus occupying 127 acres. It has also been the home to the Arizona Aviation Hall of Fame since 1991.

**4** Old Tucson Studios **A4**
