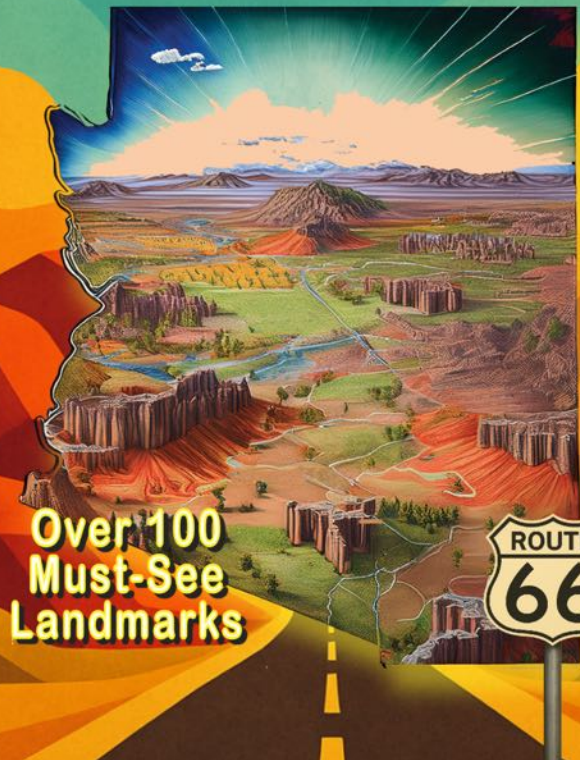

The "Caverns" is located in Southern Arizona about 1 hour from Tucson.

NORTHERN ARIZONA ATTRACTIONS

Monument Valley Tribal Park
Experience the most majestic - and most photographed - points on earth. This great valley boasts sandstone masterpieces that tower at heights of 400 to 1,000 feet, framed by scenic clouds casting shadows that graciously roam the desert floor. See the famous setting of John Ford's western movies.

Hubbell Trading Post National Historic Site
Enter the oldest, continuously operating trading post on the Navajo Nation. As your eyes adjust to the dim lighting of the "bullpen" you might catch the trader negotiating a deal with a Native American artist for their art. Sunset Crater & Wupatki National Monuments

Grand Canyon Caverns on Route 66
The Grand Canyon Caverns, located a few miles east of Peach Springs, Arizona, lie 210 feet below ground level. They are among the largest dry caverns in the United States. Dry caverns comprise only 3% of caverns in the world. Because of the lack of water, stalagmites and stalactites are rare in the caverns.

The Grand Canyon new IMAX® Theater now features IMAX® a next generation laser projection system and 12-channel sound system exclusive to IMAX® theaters. Grand Canyon National Park
Stretching 277 miles, the Grand Canyon's rocky walls descend more than a mile to the canyon's floor, where the wild Colorado River continues to carve away at the rugged landscape. Painted Desert & Petrified Forest National Park
Over 200 million years ago this was a humid forest with winding rivers and streams. As the trees died they were washed into the swamps and buried beneath volcanic ash where the woody tissue was replaced by minerals which added a kaleidoscope array of colors and preserved details of the wood.

Museum of Northern Arizona

Verde Canyon Railroad
This adventure takes passengers on a ride through Arizona's backcountry. Walnut Canyon National Monument

Explore and discover the past.

World Famous Meteor Crater
The Meteor Crater in Arizona is a really fascinating natural wonder! It was created around 50,000 years ago when a giant meteorite collided with the Earth's surface, leaving a huge impact crater that's almost a mile wide and about 550 feet deep. Canyon de Chelly National Monument

Inhabited by several Native American peoples for millennia, the area is dotted with prehistoric rock art.

When built in the 1830s, the London Bridge it spanned the River Thames in London, England. Tonto Natural Bridge State Park

Mission San Xavier del Bac
Mission San Xavier del Bac is also known as the White Dove of the Desert. The del Bac part of the name is Tohono O'odham, meaning place where water appears. The mission was in an area of natural springs and the Santa Cruz River. The date of 1797 found above the sacristy is believed to be the finish date of San Xavier.

Pima Air & Space Museum

Titan Missile Museum

OK Corral - Boothill Graveyard - Tombstone
