This is a 3 Night/4 Day Itinerary:

Day 1: Arrive at Kings Mountain State Park in Blacksburg, SC. Information from the site states:

CAMPING

- **Camping Information:** Each site is packed gravel and includes individual water and electrical hookups. Several sites accommodate RVs up to 40 feet. The campground is convenient to restroom facilities with hot showers. While tent campers may use the main camping area, the park offers a designated tent site area which includes central water.
- **Camping Reservations:** To make a camping reservation or view current rates, call toll-free 1-866-345-PARK or visit our reservations page by clicking [here](#). Rates vary by season and demand and are subject to change.

Camping reservations must be made for a minimum of two nights.

Reservations requested less than one (1) day in advance of check-in must be made directly through the park.

For example: If today is Friday and you are making a reservation checking in on today, Friday, you must make the reservation by contacting the park directly.

Campers may stay a maximum of 14 nights at Kings Mountain. After the 14th night, they must vacate the park for 7 consecutive nights before returning.

- **Standard Sites with Elec. & Water:** 115 sites
- **Designated Tent Sites:** 10 tent sites with no water and electricity
- **Dump Station:** Yes
- **Primitive Group Area:** The primitive group camping area is ideal for organized groups up to 30 people. The area has central water and is located near privy toilets. Reservations are accepted.

To make a primitive group camping reservation, contact the park directly. Minimum rate is \$10 -12.50

which allows up to ten campers. The rate increases by \$5-6.50 increments for each additional five campers.

- **Tent Camping:** Yes
- **RV Camping:** Yes
- **Pets:** Pets are allowed in most outdoor areas provided they are kept under physical restraint or on a leash not longer than six feet. Owners will be asked to remove noisy or dangerous pets or pets that threaten or harass wildlife. Pets are not allowed in or around cabins, cabin areas or other lodging facilities.

We stayed on site #34, which we found to be in a nice wooded area BUT it was very difficult to get level. Wifi is available BUT it was almost impossible to get a signal from our site. We could get a signal if we were up at The Trading Post Store. If you are staying in the campgrounds you **DO NOT** have to pay an entrance fee.

*Sites include shore power and water. The dump station is near the Trading Post Store.

Tip: Get a site near The Trading Post if you "need" wifi. You will have a better chance at getting a signal.

We visited during the Covid 19 Pandemic so we were required to make a reservation for a table. Please see the website for details.

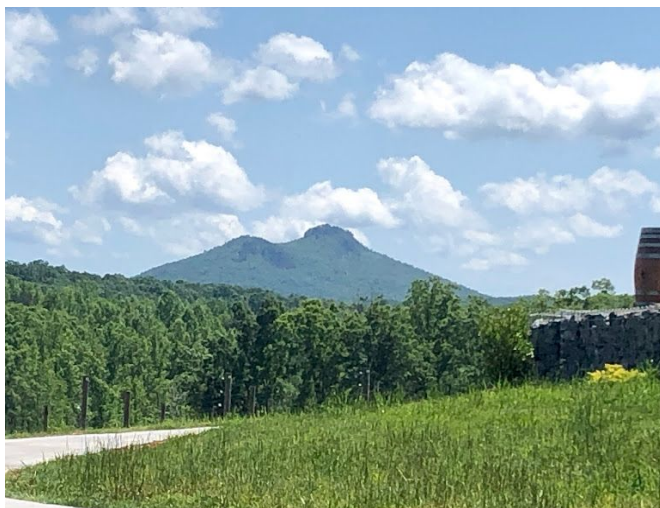
Due to the pandemic, we were unable to do a Tasting so we just bought bottles. We got two bottles of their Sauvignon Blanc (one for there and one for later) and it was quite tasty. We paid \$26.00 for each bottle. This type of wine is served chilled which worked out well on a very hot day. It has a crispy citrus, melon & lemongrass flavor.

| Vognier: full-body with jasmine, lychee and grapefruit on the finish. | \$24.00 |
| Orange Muscat: light and sweet with notes of apricot & pear blossom. | \$20.00 |
| Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon: silky, rich, bright red & black fruit. | \$36.00 |

The vineyard itself is stunning and has views of both Kings Mountain and Crowders Mountain.



Suggested Excursion:

If you aren't too "relaxed" from the winery, try one of these:

1. Hike the Ridgeline Trail to visit Kings Mountain National Military Park and Crowders Mountain State Park in North Carolina.
2. Visit Kings Mountain's 1800s-era Living History Farm.
3. Grab a rod and fish for bass, bream, crappie and catfish at one of the two lakes in the park.
4. Bring your horse and saddle up for over 30 miles of equestrian trails.
5. Enjoy the beautiful piedmont forest and camp at one of the park's 115 campsites.

We did a short hike down to the waterfall. It was beautiful!
