A Thought From Pastor Wayne

What if others caught what you had? We usually think of this in terms of sickness. If someone else 'caught' a cold from you, you would be said to be *contagious*. Most often, that is a bad thing.

But there is something that you have, that others might 'catch', and it would be a good thing. If you are a person of Christian faith, and that faith were *contagious* and passed on to others, we would be thankful. What a blessing it would be if someone came to know the life-giving grace of Jesus Christ through you! What if faith could be passed from one person to another as easily as a cold?

We have been taught to 'wash our hands' of faith. We have been taught that it is impolite and intolerant to share our faith with others. This lesson has been detrimental. It has inhibited the passing on of spiritual 'antibodies' that people and culture need to be strong and resilient. And it has weakened the church as well. May this no longer be true of us!

In the latter half of the summer, Road to Emmaus will be studying a resource called "Becoming a Contagious Christian." It reframes a word that often frightens us: Evangelism.

Here is a synopsis: "Evangelism doesn't have to be frustrating or intimidating. Authors Bill Hybels and Mark Mittelberg believe that effectively communicating our faith in Christ should be the most natural thing in the world. We just need encouragement and direction. In *Becoming a Contagious Christian*, Hybels and Mittelberg articulate the central principles that have helped the people become effective in their churches to known in their communities for outstanding outreach to unchurched people.

Based on the words of Jesus and flowing from the firsthand experiences of the authors, *Becoming a Contagious Christian* is a groundbreaking, personalized approach to relational evangelism. You will discover your own natural evangelism style, how to develop a contagious Christian character, to build spiritually strategic relationships, to direct conversations toward matters of faith, and to share biblical truths in everyday language. This landmark book presents a blueprint for starting a spiritual epidemic of hope and enthusiasm for spreading the Gospel."

Beginning on July 28 and into August, our worship services will be adapted so that there is less 'preaching' and more teaching around *Becoming a Contagious Christian*. For those Sundays, there will be breakfast served at 9:00am followed by music, liturgy and prayer, then teaching and discussion. Thanks for adapting to this new way of worship for these few Sunday mornings. I know it will be a blessing!

HYMN FACTS

"Great is thy faithfulness", page 276 in our hymnal, was written in 1923 by Thomas Obediah Chisholm (1866-1960). The melody was written by William M. Ryan (1870-1957).

Chisholm wrote this song to honor the daily faithfulness that God bestowed on him (and us). During his life, Chisholm wrote more than 1200 poems with many being published and the basis for additional hymns. This hymn became a favorite of the Moody Bible Institute but did not become widely known until George Beverly Shea used it as part of the Billy Graham Crusades in the 1950s.

His compassions fail not. They are new every morning: Great is Your faithfulness (Lamentations 3:22-23)
