HELPING THE COMMUNITY

Fidget Quilts

1. The most current OUTREACH project has been to make 12 fiddle quilts for children with special needs at the Bermudian Springs School District. Wanda Shaffer's daughter works for their Special Education Department and has been our contact for delivery. As this project wrapped up, I extend a thank you to Wanda Shaffer and Terry Stibrany for helping me with the sewing of these special fiddle quilts. Each quilt has an educational soft book attached, along with many educational components for the children to explore. The soft books were sewn by volunteers at the August service day. Thank you all who helped with sewing the soft books.

At the November 3rd meeting we showed all 12 educational fiddle quilts during Show and Share with the help of 12 volunteers to hold these fiddle quilts. Thank you ALL.

After the Show & Share, the 12 fiddles were delivered to Bermudian Springs School District. This thank you note below from Wanda's daughter, Brooke Shaffer, explains their educational programs.

Dear Quilters,

I want to extend my heartfelt appreciation for taking the time to create these wonderful fidget quilts for the students in our Special Education classrooms. The quilts will not only provide comfort but also serve as tools for engagement and sensory exploration. The quilts will be used in the K-4 Autism Support room and in the K-4 Emotional Support room.

Our Autism Support classroom currently supports eight students, ages 5-8, who vary in ability levels and communication skills. The classroom is supported by a Speech/Language Therapist, an Occupational Therapist, three paraeducators and a BCBA. We are also extremely fortunate to have the PATTAN Autism Initiative providing consultation and support this year. It has been a very busy year, but we are seeing unbelievable academic and skill growth with our students.

We will also use quilts in our new K-4 Emotional Support classroom. We currently have eight students, ages 5-8, receiving academic and behavioral support. Students in the Emotional Support class may be identified with disabilities such as Autism, OHI (ADHD), and/or Emotional Disturbance. The Emotional Support classroom is also supported by a Speech/Language Therapist, an Occupational Therapist, two paraeducators, and a BCBA. Students often need access to sensory and calming tools to work through their feelings. The quilts will certainly be a valuable addition to the classroom toolbox!

COMFORT QUILTS

A big THANK YOU to those of you who have helped with the delivery of comfort quilts to some of our recipients. It has expedited the delivery of quilts so they get where they are most needed much more quickly than in the past. As we move forward, if you can help with delivery, contact either of us and we will have the quilts ready for you at our meeting, along with contact information for the delivery location most convenient to you.

We continue to have kits available at the meetings. Don't forget, we also have a number of pieced tops that need quilted. We have backing and batting for these, and they are a wonderful way to practice your machine quilting skills.
