

BUTTONED UP



We had an unexpected mix-up with the church last month about our facilities-use payment amount. It took quite a few emails and phone conversations to get to the bottom of the story...it turns out that everyone involved had a piece of the story, but no one knew the whole story. The upshot is that we and the church now have the same understanding: the guild will pay \$67.50 per meeting until the church advises otherwise, and we have a document from the church for our permanent records that shows where the consistory voted on this amount. We will make two payments per guild year, one in December and the other in June. Last, we no longer have to let them know which part of the building we use. The treasurer's SOP has been updated to reflect the payment amount and new schedule.

In the interests of transparency, we want to share financial information about this year's workshops. As you may already know, the cost of guild workshops is expected to be covered by attendees. This year, we spent \$2,350.00, which includes the instructors' fees plus building rental. We took in \$2,328.00, which means we came up just a little bit short. While it is only \$22.00, this does underscore the importance of guild members supporting the workshops offered each year.

- 2. Hand in your bag of old clothes at the register and receive a thank-you coupon (via an app) to use toward your next purchase. Easy!

H & M website explains:
"Once you've dropped off your
previously loved fashion in one of
our garment collecting
boxes, our business partner takes
over. It empties the boxes and
sorts the contents into
three categories:
Rewear: Wearable clothes are

marketed as secondhand clothing.
Reuse: If the clothes or textiles are
not suitable for rewear, they're
turned into other
products, such as remake
collections or cleaning cloths.
Recycle: All other clothes and
textiles are shredded into textile
fibers and used to make,
for example, insulation materials."




